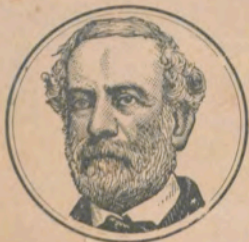

This is
to certify that W. H. C. Morecock, Esq. was ordered
in detached service in the December of 1864 with
Major John Branton, by General R. S.owell, then
in command of Richmond & its vicinity, and remained
on this duty until the close of the war. While
on this service, he was requested by the James City
Artillery to become their 1st Lieutenant. This position
not being filled at the time, & an application was
forwarded & recommended by Gen. Sowell, to the War Department
& it would certainly have been favorably acted on, had
not the war terminated soon after it was received
by the War Department.
