VOTING BY BALLOT

The general election bill, recently passed by the Legislature, contains substantially the provisions which have been proposed by the commissioners of election in each precinct. It shall be the duty of these commissioners, in the presence of the voters, to write upon the back of each ballot before it is deposited, a number which shall correspond to the name on the poll book of the person who offers to vote. The commissioners shall be sworn to secrecy, and shall permit no one other than the voters, to inspect any ballot. The ballots are to be counted as soon as the polls are closed, in the presence of one friend of each candidate voted for, and then sealed in a package and deposited with the county clerk, to be used only in case of a contested election. If there be no contested election within twelve months, then the ballots are to be destroyed. -Rich. Whig.
