My Dear Commodore

My father gives me the agreeable task of answering  
your letter dated November the 15<sup>th</sup> he thanks  
you for having called on me and for who writes  
me and a letter stating that the committee  
for the Washington monument was not yet quite  
ready for the laying of the corner stone.  
My father has not yet answered to Mr. Sargent  
and indeed will not answer to him till after  
the meeting of Congress that will be in when I will  
be able to know more about his proceedings  
if you see Mr. Sargent will you be good as to let  
him know my father's opinion for not answering to him  
immediately.

That we are all together Sir will ever be  
reminded by me with the greatest satisfaction and  
regret of its having been so short.  
permit me Sir to hope that the expression  
of Levasseur's and my best regards will be  
acceptable to you.
