

April 19<sup>th</sup> 1861

Dear cousin

I beat my self to  
drop you a few lines to let you know  
that I have not forgotten you yet but  
I reckon you think I have as I have not  
written to you well Billy I have not much news  
to write these lines leaves me and all of the fam-  
ily well at this time present and I hope when  
these lines reach you they may find you all well  
and hearty Billy I am almost ashame to write  
to you as I write such a bad letter and a nother  
thing it has ben so long since I received your kind  
and affectionate letter but howsomever I will  
endeavour to do the best I can under all circum-  
stances well I understand that their is some  
good news at last I have been inform that  
old Virginia has seceded at last which  
if she had done this three months ago I  
recon we would have all ben better off for  
she has held on so long that she made old  
Abbe Lincoln think that she was going  
to submit to his rules but I trust that  
will never be as long as time shall last  
I herd some of my neighbours say that he  
had ordered out severly thousand men to  
come against the confederate states it makes  
me think about war every time I go to Greensbo

I most say that if I have to fight I'd rather  
be in Va if I was it woud be some consolation  
to think that I was protecting the old Native state  
in which I was bred and born in an in which those  
I love next to my self lives Not only parents but that  
pretty little ~~girl~~ girl I love so well one of the prettiest  
I ever saw their is a company of artillery in Greensboro  
consisting of eighty men which is now ready to go to  
war at a moments notice I am done planting of cotton and  
partly worked over my corn I shall get over next week  
if nothing happens all except six or eight acres of late  
corn that I planted after I finished planting cotton

I must close as it is getting late excuse bad  
writing and mistakes an give my love to all  
my engineering friends and relatives and receive  
A portion your self & covering Manda and Henrietta  
to write to me and I will return and answer the  
best I can I have ben thinking about writing  
to them some time but I did not know but what  
they might serve me like some of my others cousin  
not think enough of my letter to answer it  
give my love to Ma and all of the rest of the family

I remain yours as ever until death
