On the Death of President Harrison.

President Tyler to Mrs. Harrison.

Dear Madam -

devoted patriot and public benefactor.

and character, and their sincere
condolance on the late afflictive dispensation
of Providence, permit me to mingle
my feelings with theirs and to tender
you my sincere wishes for your
health, happiness and long life.
