the view is somewhat enlarged, You will  
remember the case alluded to of prisoners  
captured in Canada - While this doctrine of  
perpetual allegiance exists the naturalized  
citizen goes into the service with fear and  
trembling and I have thought that it would  
be well to extend the argument so as to include  
the case stated - You will do with it as you please

Your paper is plain in its propositions and  
conclusive in its reasoning. It is a question on  
which this govt can hold no other language
