

Sherrwood Forest

Nov 24. 1848

My Dear Sir,

I enclose you Fenton's letter and account. The latter, so far as it goes, seems quite reasonable. A necessary trip to Richmond enabled me to have fully executed the power to Pierson to adjust the boundary line which I have been prevented from doing heretofore as well from my state of health as the necessity which existed for preparing formal surveying on the farm. I hunted up a Commissioner for Kentucky who visited me at my room in the evening of Tuesday after I had betaken myself to my bed from a killing head-ache. By this mail I send the power directly to Pierson with a request to the P. M. at Careysville to give it despatch. It will, altho' delayed, be all in good time. Longfellow and Brown have both written and enclose me back the bill and copies. They express themselves highly pleased with the arrangement and suggest a mere verbal alteration. They ask its return by the middle of February and suggest sending the original papers by private hand if an opportunity occurs. If any such should fall under your obser-
