

Edenton N. C Oct. 28<sup>nd</sup> 1852

My dear Sir

How often you have thought it strange  
that I have not answered your letter of September last  
but I hope you will excuse me, when I tell you my  
reasons for not having written before this. In the  
first place, I was absent from home, when your  
letter got to this place, and on my return home  
I found one of my children extremely ill, and before  
he got but little better, another and another contracted  
the disease, (which was scar at fever), and then I became  
a violent sufferer with the same complaint, thus  
my dear Sir, you see that I did not mean to treat  
you with indifference, for how could I be quiet of  
any such thing, particularly towards one, whom I have  
ever entertained the highest esteem.

I have no desire to sell my place in Virginia, and  
could not be induced to do so at a much higher price  
than the place is worth - I have of late received  
several offers for this place, and have already done  
perhaps very wrong, in not accepting of an offer of  
\$50,000 made me by a Gentleman in New York, for  
some of his New Jersey friends -

I should be highly pleased to see you in this  
section of our State, and I know that others like me  
from the good old Mother State, would much Gladly  
have you visit us - We have a fine Country here,  
for Agriculture, and the country prod, and at this time

several fine Farms could be purchased - I mention  
this, thinking that perhaps your friend in New York  
might be willing to try North Carolina - I am  
sure we will be to come here and see one of the farms  
which will soon be sold, that he would not fail  
to purchase it -

This Farm is well situated on the Albemarle Sound  
about Four miles from Edenton, contains about 1400  
acres of the best land in a state of high cultivation  
with a pottery on the place - The dwelling a modern  
building of the first class, and every other building in keeping  
with the dwelling, and the place. I have never seen a  
Farm presenting the advantages as does this one, and  
with judicious management, I am sure it will support  
a family in Fine style & pay for itself in 6 years, at  
further - I will with pleasure show your friend this  
place and all others round about here should he think  
fit to visit this part of the Country & my house must  
be his home when he comes

Your old acquaintance D<sup>r</sup> W<sup>t</sup> Warren often  
speaks of you, both of us entertaining our early admiration  
of you, so you see that even in this out of the way  
place you have warm friends. Again let me say  
that we would be glad to see you, should you ever find time  
to leave home - the trip here is a short one, only two days  
from your home & then two all by Steam boats & rail road
