My dear Bowell.

I thought I had

the 60 dollars sent by you
to me in payment of 50
dollars & that my letter
would have been received.

sum was paid over

my acct.

negotiation will be proposed by
the Convention at Richmond
for peace, but the State
Delegates (a majority of them)
to Cincinnati will on all
probabilities be for peace.
It is possible the candidate
may be taken from Virginia.

Black Republicans in this

Pittsburg Platform take issue
distinctly with Him & his
Administration & regard
everything else as but a
consequence of his Policy.
That he inaugurated a Policy
in regard to Slavery since
only administration & Govt.

William (the H. H. Man) is also
a kind of issue with him
(He was an actor from 41. to 45. &
a success of Clay's. Thus the
opposition makes in both
branches an issue between
John Tyler & their views.

Now if He cannot fight
the battle it seems to me
best to - the Man for it.
