James fra forbes Ho of Sortauplince "That in our sincere Wish the aiding in procuring some little supplies for those unhap "people here, the meant to run no Risk ourselves nor that or any others should in any shape do to, of offending against Law which unknown to us, might be made, or of drawing "Resentment of the Ruling Powers; that though Hermany was deeply imprinted in our nature, (and we had never met "greater occasion to exercise it / yet it was not to be expected at "flerils to ourselves or friends".
