William and Mary Graduates Work to Discover a Cure for Dreaded Disease

Cancer is one of life's most frightening diseases, but four alumni and a faculty member are trying to banish the word "hopeless" from the cancer patient's vocabulary with research in progress in the four corners of the nation.

Their work is as varied as the sites of their research labs and offices. They are:

Dr. John Charles Marsh '55, professor of medicine at Yale University, who is trying to find a way to predict which drugs are useful in treating different kinds of cancer;

Dr. Stewart D. Sell '56, professor and research pathologist at the University of California at San Diego, who is studying the effects of carcinogens on the liver, and liver cancer itself;

Dr. Vincent T. DeVita '57, director of the Division of Cancer Treatment and Clinical Director of the National Cancer Institute at the National Institute of Health in Maryland, who combines activities as a researcher, physician and administrator;

Dr. Lawrence L. Wiseman, a biology professor at William and Mary, who is studying the relationship between the body's immunity system and cancer cells, which the immunity system *should* attack, but doesn't;

Dr. Lawrence L. LeShan '42, a psychologist and research specialist in New York City who has found startling evidence that the mind and the emotions may help make the body receptive to cancer.

Although the College does not have a program in medical education, it produced a trio of alumni in the 1950's who as doctors are on the cutting edge of cancer research. Dr. Marsh is now professor of medicine at Yale University as well as a medical oncologist. Oncology is a relatively new sub-specialty of internal medicine, and centers on the study of tumors. Marsh's research at Yale involves the need to develop better chemicals and drugs to treat the many kinds of known cancer.

"Our research is based on the idea that there should be ways to predict which drugs are useful in which cancer," says Marsh. Marsh and his associates are growing specimens from patients' tumors in the laboratory with an eye toward using them as predictive tests as to which drugs are useful to which patients. They are also testing the toxic effect of these drugs on normal white blood cells, because if enough white cells are destroyed in treatment, then the patient may not die of cancer but from infection. Marsh adds, "It's a tall order, and many people in the United States are working in this area."

At the University of California at San Diego, Dr. Sell works mainly on liver cancer, which at present is not very prevalent in the U.S. But Sell says that the incidents of liver cancer, before more common in Japan and Africa, are now rising in this country, which suggests that

carcinogens affecting the liver may be on the rise as well.

Sell and his colleagues study cancer in mice and rats, although the work they do has some human applications. "It takes a long time to translate the results of laboratory experimentation involving animals to experimentation with human beings," he says.

However, Sell pointed out that a protein known as Alpha-Fetoprotein is an example of the link between the lab and cancer in humans. AFP, as it is called, has been found in the chemically induced liver tumors of rats. When tumors develop, they also make this protein in humans, so it would be possible to use the presence of AFP in the blood to detect cancer. "We're using much

more sophisticated ideas to find a way to understand what the cancer cell is," Sell says, "because to be honest, no one knows." He adds, "How long it takes to mean anything in human terms, we don't know."

Dr. DeVita '57 wears two hats in the cancer research field, as Director of the Division of Cancer Treatment and the Clinical Director of the National Cancer Institute at the National Institute of Health. Located in Bethesda, Maryland, the NIH complex directs almost all American biomedical research. DeVita administers a staggering budget of \$240 million, which supports most cancer treatment research here and abroad. Because he deals with "a mountain of bureaucratic detail," DeVita places special emphasis on the traditional doctor's rounds. "What everyone with my kind of training likes to do is see patients, maintain contact with them, and also do research in the lab," DeVita says. "Serving in both capacities gives me a chance to come back down and find out what is really going on."

DeVita adds that according to a RAND Corporation study, the American people fear cancer more than any other disease. He says, "What isn't so well known is that 41% of those who get cancer are now cured."

Dr. LeShan's findings about cancer are chronicled in his recent book, You Can Fight For Your Life. The book's central theme can be summed up in one of the author's statements: "The search for one's own being, the discovery of the life one needs to live, can be one of the strongest weapons against disease."

He arrived at this conclusion after preliminary personality tests, almost 8,000 hours of individual therapy, and more than 500 hours spent in intensive interviews. Over a period of years, LeShan worked toward a new method of psychotherapy that would incorporate what he had learned.

LeShan found that the loss of the patient's will to live -- in many cases, the loss of a crucial relationship -- pre-dated the first noted symptoms of cancer. Also, inability

on the individual's part to express anger and resentment, instead keeping a "facade of benign goodness," figured significantly in the emotional life histories of between 75% and 80% of the patients he interviewed.

Still an Army psychologist at the time, LeShan recalls that it was a "shock and a surprise" when he first suspected these patterns while examining mortality statistics for cancer victims. He received a small research grant and came to New York City to test his findings in the early 1950's.

Although the experimental psychologist had "enough credentials for doctors to know I could get around a hospital without bumping into bedpans," LeShan's first efforts were discouraging. 15 hospitals in a row turned down his requests to interview and test cancer patients with the patients' consent.

"One doctor said, 'Even if in 15 years you prove it, I still won't believe it'." LeShan adds, "15 years later, this doctor came out in *The New York Times* saying that 'he'd discovered' that certain personality characteristics were shared by his cancer patients -- and that was very nice, because he finally had."

Accepted by the Institute of Applied Biology in New York City, LeShan began years of interviewing and testing cancer patients and some close relatives. Once he felt that he had sufficient insight into the problems cancer patients face, LeShan began the more sensitive and complex task of initiating psychotherapy with individual patients.


Surprisingly, 50% of the "medically hopeless" patients that LeShan treated 8 to 12 years ago are leading normal lives today. According to him, it's "because they brought their own best resources to the aid of their doctors' care."

Since that time, LeShan has begun training other psychotherapists in this method of "potentializing individuality" that, although specifically designed for the cancer patient, works for others as well. He feels that such training can only be done with "experienced therapists who have worked and touched life themselves -- they cannot have led sheltered lives and hidden in institutions."

In addition to the intensive "nitty-gritty" training in therapy that his students receive, LeShan also

requires them to learn both sides in studying cases. "I make them play out the role -- 'If a doctor told you that you had cancer of the pancreas and you knew that in three months there would be a bad ending, how would you feel'?"

Not all cancer researchers place the same emphasis on therapy involving the mind and emotions, however. Professor Wiseman, who conducts research in addition to teaching biology at the College, offers a different viewpoint. "I think that these things are helpful, in the sense that if you believe it, it helps you -- if not, it doesn't. It's like religion."

He adds, "The bad part is that some people will do anything that seems easy, like taking crushed apricot pits (laetrile) instead of radiation therapy or chemotherapy." According to Wiseman, chemotherapy is particularly painful because the chemicals used are poisonous. Since the main trait of cancer cells is that they don't stop dividing, these chemicals will kill any cells that divide, whether they are cancerous or not. For example, because their hair has dividing cells, chemotherapy patients frequently lose their hair.

Wiseman, who is a developmental biologist, went on sabbatical from William and Mary to the Ontario Cancer Institute in 1974, where he studied the difference between normal cells and cancerous cells to be found in the bone marrow of leukemia patients.

Wiseman also spent time in Ontario lecturing both students and physicians, and he has continued to lecture on different levels since his return. For several semesters Wiseman taught a course in adult education at the College called "Cancer for the Layman," in which he explained various facets of cancer in layman's terms and what scientists are doing about it.

Having successfully bridged the communications gap between scientists and non-scientists, Wiseman says, "I don't think that the general public understands anything about 'doing' science -- it's not that they're stupid, it's just not part of their lives." On the other hand, he says that anyone who fixes a car is "doing" science, developing a hypothesis on what went wrong and how to fix it. He adds, "It's the same thing we do in the laboratory."

As an example, he points to the way researchers go about collecting evidence of carcinogenic, or cancercausing, chemicals. "Since many things will kill in a high enough

dose, researchers try to see if they cause tumors," he explains. One method, Wiseman says, is to take a type of bacteria and put the suspected chemical in a plate of these bacteria, and then look for mutations, which are a strong clue. "Then if you give the suspected chemical to a mouse and it gets cancer, then you continue to build up statistical evidence," Wiseman says. More statistical evidence is added if researchers can find a pocket of people who have been in contact with the suspected chemical, like workers in a factory, and have developed tumors as a result.

Because of such painstaking research, a number of advances have been made in the last decade, particularly in the area of immunotherapy. "It's a fairly new concept," Wiseman says. "With immunology, doctors try to get the patient's immunity system to work." One method is to actually scarify part of the patient's arm, and then put bacteria there. "It's supposed to make the patient's immunity system 'go crazy' and fight the cancer within the body," he explains.

Finding a way to immunize people against cancer may become the latest weapon in the doctor's arsenal, which includes surgery, radiation therapy, chemotherapy, and combinations of the three to treat different types of cancer.

For Wiseman, learning more about cancer means asking questions and looking for yes or no answers. "You can't go into a laboratory and say, 'Today I'm going to find out something about cancer,' and stop there," he says.

Drs. Wiseman, LeShan, Sell, DeVita and Marsh are five men who obviously don't.

Salaries Sink Still Further

Faculty Pay Falls to Sixth Place, Two More Notches Closer to the Bottom

Faculty compensation at William and Mary last year sank further downward by comparison with other Virginia colleges and universities, a new published report shows.

The report, published in August, details faculty compensation for 1978-79 at 2,200 colleges and universities in the United States. It is based on data reported by the institutions to the American Association of University Professors.

William and Mary full professors, with compensation averaging \$27,300 last year, ranked sixth among the 15 senior public colleges and universities in Virginia. A year ago, the same report ranked William and Mary full professors in fourth place. The five institutions which compensated full professors more than William and Mary were the University of Virginia (non-medical) at \$37,500; VPI at \$33,300; Old Dominion University at \$28,400; Virginia Commonwealth University (non-medical) at \$28,200 and George Mason University at \$27,600

Associate professors at William and Mary, averaging \$21,600, also ranked sixth among Virginia's public four-year institutions, while a year ago they ranked fifth. Assistant professors, earning an average of \$17,600, ranked ninth of the 15 public four-year institutions in Virginia; last year, they ranked seventh. William and Mary instructors, with an average of \$14,600, ranked ninth among the Virginia public institutions; no ranking was published for instructors a year ago.

Nationally, at each of the four ranks William and Mary dropped further into the bottom fifth of comparable institutions, according to the report. The William and Mary faculty compensation settled into the bottom fifth a year ago, but formerly had been ranked a notch higher.

To achieve even the middle range of compensation at comparable universities across the nation, the report shows, full professors at William and Mary should have earned approximately \$7,000 a year more on an average. To have achieved the very top ranking for comparable universities, the College would have had to pay full professors \$13,000 more a

year in 1978-79. Corresponding increases would have been needed in the other ranks to achieve those levels of competitive ability.

The highest salaries in the United States continued to be paid by the Ivy League universities. Full professors at Harvard earned \$44,300--or about \$17,000 more than their peers at William and Mary. Average compensation at a number of public

systems of higher education, including Pennsylvania, Maryland and North Carolina, also exceeded William and Mary's levels. Full professors at community colleges in Maryland earned \$3,000 more than senior faculty at William and Mary, while state colleges in Pennsylvania paid full professors an average of \$6,000 more than those at William and Mary.

Einstein Article Wins Award

von Baeyer Collects \$1,500 Prize from Institute

Professor Hans C. von Baeyer's article on Albert Einstein, published last winter in the premier edition of the Alumni Gazette magazine, has been selected as the 1979 recipient of the prestigious Science Writing Award of the American Physics Institute and U.S. Steel Foundation.

The Award, which carries a \$1,500 prize, is given annually to the scientist who is author of a work which the sponsors believe "best stimulates public understanding of physics and astronomy." It is the

first time the Institute and Foundation have conferred the award on a single magazine article; the previous ten awards have gone to authors of books or other lengthier works.

Professor von Baeyer returns to the College's Physics Department this fall after spending a year's leave at Simon Fraser University in British Columbia, Canada. In addition to continuing his teaching and research, he has become Director of the College's Virginia Associated Research Campus in Newport News, a part-time administrative post.

The Alumni Gazette magazine is published each winter and summer. Îts circulation is limited to alumni, parents and friends of the College who have contributed to the various programs which provide private financial support to William and

Gordon C. Vliet, Executive Vice President of the Society of the Alumni, publisher of the Alumni Gazette, said the award "is an outstanding form of recognition to one of William and Mary's outstanding teachers and researchers. Dr. von Baeyer has voluntarily committed a large amount of time and talent to reach youngsters and laymen in order to increase their interest in physics, outside of his responsibilities to the College. His initiative in preparing the article for the Alumni Gazette was an outgrowth of his concern that the public understand and appreciate the beauty and importance of physics.

"There has never been, so far as I am aware, an alumni publication launched on such an award-winning level, and the Society is indeed proud to have participated in Dr. von Baeyer's work. We believe the William and Mary faculty includes dozens of individuals who have similarly outstanding abilities, and we plan to encourage them in succeeding issues of the new magazine," Vliet added.

The award will be presented in October at the annual meeting of the American Physics Institute's rate Advisory Council in Schenectady, N.Y. The author will also receive a certificate and a moebious strip inscribed with his name.

Judges for the award included three journalists and four scientists: Philip Boffey, of the Executive Board of the New York Times; Peter Gwynne, science editor of Newsweek Magazine; Warren Leary, science writer for the Associated Press; Nicholas Samios, of the Brookhaven National Laboratory; Clifford Swartz, editor of The Physics Teacher; Brian Schwartz, Dean of Science at Brooklyn College and Arthur Herschman, program director for the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

Ewell Visits Venezuela

Judith Ewell, associate professor of history, will spend the next year in Caracas, Venezuela, as a senior Fulbright Lecturer in American History at the Catholic University of Andres Bello.

She will teach two courses at the graduate level, one in United States history since World War I and the other in historiography and methodology for history teachers. Both will be taught in Spanish.

A Latin American specialist, Dr. Ewell is currently making final revisions on the manuscript of a book about the extradition and trial of dictator Marcos Perez Jimenez for the Texas A&M University Press. She also has a tentative agreement with a British publisher for a history of Venezuela with emphasis on the 20th century.

Dr. Ewell has for several years concentrated her research on the administration of deposed dictator Perez Jimenez whose ouster in the late 1950s, amid charges of misappropriation of funds, caused a Venezuelan Watergate. During her stay in Venezuela this year, Dr. Ewell says she plans to expand her work on Perez Jimenez as a political phenomenon. His remarkable career includes his election just 10 years after he was indicted for fraud. The election was nullified on a technicality. It was ruled that Perez Jimenez had not fulfilled registration requirements and was therefore not qualified to stand for office.


College Receives Over \$200,000

Grants totalling over \$200,000 have been awarded for scientific research at the College.

Grants from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration include \$40,137 to the department of mathematics and computer science for "Investigation of Portability Techniques for a Large Flight-Oriented Programing Language," with Stefan Feycock, associate professor, as principal investigator. In the same department, Robert Noonan, associate professor, and Michael Donegan, assistant professor, have received \$82,952 for continuation of work on the development of a multi-target compiler writing system, also from NASA.

Other NASA grants include 528,419 to the department of mathematics and computer science for work on methodologies for optimizing maintenance models for advanced avionics control system, a project directed by Margaret Schaefer, assistant professor of economics. NASA has awarded 538,000 to supplement a current grant for work on turbulence in plasmas being undertaken by David

Montgomery, professor of physics.
The National Science Foundation
has awarded \$12,000 for the
purchase of preparative liquid
chromatography equipment in the
department of chemistry.

Elizabeth Eades, '23, sent in a collection of bulletins, Charter Day programs, and other materials for use in the Paschall Library.





Summer Camps Mean Lower Student Rents

More Than Ever Before, the Beautiful William and Mary Campus Attracts Outside Groups of All Kids

Summer on campus is becoming big business for William and Mary.

This summer about \$150,000 was generated by camps, conferences and summer school according to David G. Healy, director of auxiliary enterprises.

"We are able, through money generated in the summer by conferences and camps as well as summer school, to offset the cost of operation and help reduce rental costs to students during the regular sessions," said Healy.

At present semester room rates range between \$380 and \$480 per month. Without the summer income, Healy estimates, room costs would rise about 2 per cent, or \$10 per student.

One of the largest revenue producers for the College this summer was the soccer camp run by Coach Al Albert '69, which averaged 200 7 to 12 year old boys and girls in five week-long training sessions.

There were also approximately 70

high school students in Coach Jim Root's football camp and 330 girls attended a cheerleading camp. About 125 were enrolled in the drill team camp and a swimming camp has attracted about 150 for its three sessions.

By the close of the summer, the College had hosted on campus a variety of groups, including a real estate seminar; a yearbook workshop; attendants at a world seminar on intercranial pressure; administrative assistants from the House of Representatives; a police training session; a forestry training program; and a seminar arranged through VARC. In addition, 25 high school juniors and seniors were on campus for STEP, a new program held for the first time this year through the offices of student affairs and minority student affairs. An early childhood education conference was also on campus.

Titus Productions, which was on campus to film the movie "The Henderson Monster," donated \$4,000 to the College and hired many members of the college community as extras for the made-for-TV production. About 20 actors and crew members from the Virginia Shakespeare Festival were housed on campus this summer.

The College took in between \$10,000 and \$15,000 from intersession housing, which is offered to regular students who wish to remain in Williamsburg and work during the summer.

"We still turn away more groups than we accept," said Healy. He explained that most groups that are accepted have some tie with the College.

By agreement with the Chamber of Commerce, there is no attempt to compete with the local tourist industry, said Healy. Some colleges have special summer rates and invite the public to come and enjoy an inexpensive vacation on campus.

The College has no intention of getting into that market. "Because of our unique location we would be swamped," said Healy.

With the completion of the Randolph Residences, which are now under construction across from the Commons dining hall, 246 more residence spaces will be open for the summer trade two years hence. This complex will be especially attractive to seminar and conference groups, said Healy, because it offers a variety of housing arrangements, including apartments, suites and individual rooms, all designed around a central meeting area.

Although conference visitors are offered the best residence halls on

campus, they cannot expect airconditioning. The one airconditioned residence hall in service this summer houses summer school students.

"We tell conference planners over and over again that the halls are not air-conditioned and that Williamsburg summers can sometimes be hot and sticky," said Healy. In many cases participants are far removed from college life so Healy suggests they come down and tour the facilities before they sign up. For the most part, there are few complaints from visitors. This year, with an increase in staffing for the program, almost all the visiting groups say they plan to return.

Gov. Beverley Randolph, Where Are You?


Does anyone know the whereabouts of Beverley Randolph of Chatsworth, Henrico, student from 1770 to 1772?

Actually this alumnus is not so much unlocated as unpictured in the Governor's Gallery recently unveiled in the Chandler Room of the Alumni House. An uninhabited frame recognizes the particulars of Beverley Randolph's life (1754-1797), student years (1770-1772), and years as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia (1788-1791). But there appears to be no known portrait to perpetuate the memory of this man who conducted his term in office with great honor and popularity among the people.

The collection is a gift from the Class of 1929, presented at the 50th Reunion banquet this past May. The presentation on behalf of the Class was made by William Warren '29, a member of the 50th Reunion Committee, to Society President Denys Grant '58.

The gift of the collection represents the culmination of an extensive search by Frankie Martens, archivist and researcher for the Society of the Alumni. Until this time there had not been a complete list available of alumni who had attained the highest office in the Commonwealth. The list includes names taken from the pages of history, such as Jefferson, Harrison, Randolph, Monroe, Page, and Tyler.

An even lengthier search was required for the location and acquisition of the prints and photographs. The search included the wealth of potential sources in and around Williamsburg and Richmond, extending to the Library of Congress, Smithsonian Institution, Philadelphia, and finally Boston. The ultimate sources, as it developed, were the Virginia State Library, the Governor's Office in Richmond, and Maury A. Bromsen Associates, dealers in fine arts, of Boston.

To date a total of twenty-one governors have been identified as having been educated at the College of William and Mary, far outnumbering the graduates from any other college, academy, or military school. Of the seven governors who served under the Articles of Confederation,

three called the College their alma mater. During the next fifty years under the United States Constitution fifteen alumni served as governor out of twenty-three. In more recent years Mills E. Godwin, Jr., '36 served an unprecedented two terms from 1966-1970 and from 1974-1978

and was succeeded by the present governor, John N. Dalton '53.

The Gallery shares the room with another former Governor, John Garland Pollard, who had distinguished himself as a member of

the Faculty, Dean of the Marshall-Wythe Law School, and later as one of the Visitors of the College.

The research has also influenced the naming of the residence complex presently under construction on New Campus Drive. Four of the alumni who went on to distinguish themselves as Governor of Virginia were Randolph, hence the name Randolph Residences. Six units of the complex will bear the names of others: Harrison, Page, Cabell, Pleasants, Giles, and Tazewell.

Editor's Notebook

There was a time, not that long ago, when admissions to William and Mary--and to most of the best American colleges and universities--was a rather informal process. Recommendations from well-respected individuals, personal interviews with College staff, and a creditable secondary school record were all important parts of the process used to determine who would fill each freshman class. Admissions examinations were also devised, and now they are standardized throughout the nation and their scores are weighed by almost all admissions offices in the selection process.

Much of the informality of the procedure went out the window in the 1960s when hundreds of thousands of applicants began seeking admission to the nation's colleges and universities—a surge which led to expansion of capacity at most campuses, and to greater reliance on standard test scores and academic records in making final decisions.

At William and Mary, the personal interview was replaced by group interviews, or orientation sessions, to cope with the hundreds of families who visited the campus every week to begin the application process. At one point, in 1965, there were more than 10 serious applicants for each opening in the College's freshman class; as many as 16,000 visited the campus and the admissions office in one year. The press run for the catalogue jumped to more than 35,000 and the quantity failed to last a full 12 months.

Forecasters say the boom in applicants to colleges and universities is off, and the increases are over for at least the 1980s. Admissions staff members at many institutions have developed sophisticated marketing programs to attract applicants, in order to fill their entering classes and help keep their colleges' budgets balanced. Some institutions have closed their doors in the face of enrollment declines.

So far, at least, the "boom" story at William and Mary has not changed. The quantity of applications has risen by about 205 since 1975, and it is still necessary for the admissions office to rely on group interviews to serve the hundreds who visit each week.

But the staff, led by Dean Robert P. Hunt, is working on techniques to look behind test scores and academic records to determine if applicants have other qualities desired by the College. It is a process determined in part by the policy of the Board of Visitors and, in part, by members of the faculty who participate in admissions review.

In 1974, the Board adopted a policy which gave special consideration in the admissions selection process to three groups--children of alumni, scholarship athletes, and minority children. Governor Dalton, responding to directives from the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, last year required additional special consideration be given to black applicants from Virginia. The new requirements of Title IX have led to the increased acceptance of women athletic participants under the 1974 Board policy.

Consequently, of the approximately 1,081 freshmen who came to William and Mary this August, almost 300 were in the groups covered by the 1974 Board policy--102 men and women athletes, 89 minority children, and 92 alumni children.

All of the students accepted under the special consideration plan are young men and women who, their records show, appear cabable of strong academic performance at the College. Many would have been admitted anyway, with no special consideration, but as many as 80% of the athletic recruits--men and women--might not have been accepted, even though they were promising students.

The faculty-staff effort has been focused especially in looking at special skills which the applicant have. Gifted writers, artists, musicians, scientists, etc., are encouraged to send samples of their work, along with their routine forms, so a special evaluation can be made by faculty in the respective departments. Though this has led to a deluge of created materials, it has offered the College the opportunity to seek out students with special promise in a particular field, with special weight being given to that kind of talent.

The consideration being given to athletes, alumni children and minorities is always controversial, because it can mean that more highly qualified applicants are bumped in the process. But a faculty committee works diligently to assure that no student is accepted who would find it impossible to meet the high competitive standards of the College.

In a way, the increasing personalized review of each application is a return to the older times when test scores and class rank were not the only factors leading to acceptance.

Students to the Rescue

Marshall-Wythe Would Be Ancient History If Not For The Efforts Of Some Rebellious Students

(The Marshall-Wythe School of Law is in the midst of celebrating its 200th anniversary this year, but if it had not been for some determined students in 1939, there might not have been any celebration. One of those students, the Honorable R. William Arthur '38, BCL '40, judge of the 27th Judicial Circuit in Virginia, tells in this article how those students were instrumental in defeating a Board of Visitors attempt to close down the law school. Judge Arthur wrote this article shortly after he graduated from law school, and it recently came to the attention of the Alumni Gazette.)

On May 28, 1939, the Richmond *Times Dispatch* and other newspapers announced that the William and Mary Law School would be abolished.

We law students were in the middle of our exams and, needless to say, this announcement was quite a shock to us. That same afternoon (Sunday the 28th) we had a call meeting of the entire student body in front of historic old Wren Building to see what could be done about saving the oldest law school in America the second oldest in English speaking nations. I and several other students made talks to the students to sound out opinion on the matter. We were convinced that the overwhelming majority favored the retention of the school.

That night *Tim Hanson*, '39 B.A., '40 B.C.L., *Harold Gouldman*, '37 B.A., '40 B.C.L., *Bob Simpson*, '38 B.A., '40 B.C.L., *Ralph Baker*, '39 J.D., *Jimmy Watkins*, '38 B.A., '40 B.C.L., *Jack Garrett*, '40 B.A., and I went to Richmond to air our views to the *Times-Dispatch*. Next morning the following article appeared:

Richmond, Virginia: Monday, May 29, 1939--"Plan to Drop Law School Protested; Mass Meeting Held at W&M."

Shocked by the decision of the board of visitors of the College of William and Mary to discontinue the law school there after June, 1940, approximately 500 students in an impromptu mass meeting at the college yesterday called for a reconsideration by the board.

Campus leaders, in and out of the law school, took the position that abandonment of the Marshall-Wythe School of Jurisprudence, the first of its kind to be established in the country, would be a serious blow to the college and its ancient traditions.

"The whole action was arbitrary," spokesmen for a committee representing the mass meeting said here last night. "Neither the faculty of the academic school nor of the law school was consulted. So far, the explanations given of the board's action have been just words. We want to know the real reason and who is responsible for it. As the situation is now, we hardly know to whom to appeal."

The committeemen said, however, that the petition adopted yesterday would be presented to President John Stewart Bryan today, with the request that the board be called in special session to reconsider its decision and give the students an opportunity to be heard publicly. . .

Charles Beale of The Hague, president of the student body, who was unable to make the trip, issued this formal statement:

"It is my personal and sincere belief that the disbanding of the law school at William and Mary will prove a great loss to our school. My belief, based on current student feeling, is that the school of jurisprudence is an integral part of this institution and should be continued."

Mr. Arthur emphasized the point that the mass meeting was in no sense a rebellious uprising, but a serious gathering of sober-minded students--they were called out by the tolling of the old college bell--to discuss a situation which he said they deplored with the utmost sincerity.

Other members of the volunteer committee took issue with the statement of college authorities that the law school was being discontinued to avoid duplication of the work of the law school at the University of Virginia, which, like William and Mary, is a State-supported school.

"If the duplication argument is valid," they said, "then the college might as well abandon its School of Education. Other State schools also specialize in the field of education."

The law school, they pointed out, is the only graduate school at William and Mary and consequently the only one which attracts mature students. There are 63 in the school now, five of whom are scheduled to receive their degrees this year. They said the school was recognized by the American Bar Association and became a member of the American Association of Law Schools in 1933.

Eleven of the law students will be up for graduation next year, but Mr. Arthur said they had no relish for the idea

of graduating from a defunct school. This year's freshmen, he added, had no hope at all, so far as William and Mary is concerned, unless the board rescinds its action.

The announcement of the discontinuance of the law school was made following a meeting of the board of visitors Saturday.

Mr. Bryan, who was at his home here last night, had no comment on the student petition.

Under the board's decision, instruction in the more technical fields of law will be discontinued and the School of Jurisprudence merged with the Marshall-Wythe School of Government and Citizenship.

Discussing the plan Saturday, Mr. Bryan said it was an "enlargement and not a narrowing of William and Mary's field of service. More young men will be influenced and I look confidently to a quickening of interest in statesmanship and public service, which is the avocation of great citizens."

This was only the beginning. We drew up a petition, obtaining the signatures of nearly every person in school. We sent letters to each member of the Board of Visitors. We went to see Pres. Bryan, Charles Duke, Channing Hall, and received some encouragement. Ralph Baker '39 J.D., and Lettie Armistead '40, went to Newport News to see Homer L. Ferguson and Supreme Justice Spratley. Tim Hanson saw Miss Gabriella Page in Richmond, and Harold Gouldman saw Miss Lulu Metz in Front Royal.

All the while the state newspapers fought it out. Editorials flew thick and fast.

The *Times-Dispatch*, for instance, contended:

There is much to be said for the decision of the college board of visitors to remove this duplication from the State educational system. There is far too much overlapping among Virginia's entirely too numerous State institutions, and if it is impossible to reduce the number of such institutions, it ought to be possible at least to eliminate some of the duplication.

And so the fight went on. There were days of hope, days of despair. And all the while our exams progressed unabated. Several times we went into classrooms at 8 a.m. to take an exam after having hardly been to bed the night before. I recall one night I stayed at a professor's home till nearly 3 a.m. mapping our plans. I had an exam under that same professor the next morning at 8. I hadn't opened a book to study for a single minute. I barely managed to get by. All my schoolmates were having similar experiences.

Finally we managed to get another board meeting called for Friday, June 2nd at 11 a.m. I had been in the infirmary the day before but I was determined to address the board. One of the nights of our annual June ball was to be that night. It would either be a scene of rejoicing or of sad dejection. Time would tell. This article appeared in the *Times-Dispatch* of that historic morning:

Richmond, Virginia: June 6, 1939--"More Alumni of W&M Protest Cut"

A Richmond delegation of William and Mary alumni will join with alumni from Norfolk and Newport News today in requesting the board of visitors to rescind its recent decision to abolish the school of jurisprudence at the ancient institution at Williamsburg.


The board is scheduled to meet at the college this morning at 11 o'clock.

Oscar L. Shewmake, local attorney, former member of the college board and former law teacher there, will act as spokesman for the Richmond group, which will include H. Lester Hooker, member of the State Corporation Commission; Dr. C. C. Coleman, nationally known brain specialist; J.D. Carneal Jr., Harry D. Wilkins, Jr., president of the William and Mary Alumni Club of Richmond; Robert C. Harper, former president of the club, and Dr. George Preston Green.

The Norfolk group, which will ask that the college law school be expanded rather than abolished, will include Robert M. Hughes, Jr., Gordon E. Campbell, Miss Virginia Mistr, the first woman to receive a law degree from the college since the school of jurisprudence was revived a few years ago; William G. Thompson and Joseph E. Healy, president of the Virginia Education Association.

Opposition to the decision of the board of visitors, which was taken last Saturday, has been particularly strong in Norfolk. Norfolk was one of the few cities of its size in the country without a college until William and Mary established a junior college there.

Editorially the *Ledger-Dispatch* has been outspoken against the plan to abolish the law school in Williamsburg,

while the Norfolk Virginian-Pilot, which at first thought the plan might possibly be a good one, said editorially yesterday that it was at least "debatable". . .

Meanwhile the Norfolk alumni club adopted a resolution, to be filed with the board today, which says, in part:

"Whereas the chair of law at the College of William and Mary is the second oldest in the English-speaking world and the oldest in the United States of America; and,

"Whereas, little emphasis has been placed on this department of the college in proportion to the amount of money expended within the last few years of its renaissance, and we feel that instead of abolishing it, it should be emphasized and developed to a standard worthy of its founder, Thomas Jefferson; its first professor, George Wythe, the masters of law the college has produced, among whom are Chief Justice John Marshall, and associate justices John Blair, Philip Barbour and Bushrod Washington, and Presidents James Monroe and John Tyler; and,

"Whereas, many men who could have afforded to take law at the College of William and Mary would be financially unable to attend some other law school; . . .

"Now therefore, be it resolved that we disapprove the action of the board of visitors in abolishing the school of jurisprudence and urge the board of visitors to rescind such action and restore the school of jurisprudence at the College of William and Mary."

Under the board's decision, no more law degrees would be given at William and Mary after next June. The plan has aroused much opposition among current students as well as among alumni

The board of managers of the General Alumni Association of the college will meet there tonight. Tomorrow will be observed as "Alumni Day" at the institution.

The meeting started at 11 a.m. Ralph Baker and I spoke about 1 o'clock, and the board adjourned at 1:30 for lunch. We came back about 2:30 and waited outside closed doors until 5:45, when Mr. Walter Mapp made the formal statement for the board. It was, "Gentlemen, the board has reached its action of last week, and has decided not only to retain the law school, but to strengthen it in every way."

And so the fight was over. We had won. The following article appeared in the next morning's paper:

Richmond, Virginia: June 3, 1939--"Law School at W&M. To Be Kept, Developed; Visitors Board Reverses Itself Under Pressure"

WILLIAMSBURG, (AP)--The board of visitors of William and Mary, rescinding a previous vote to discontinue the law school, voted yesterday to continue and develop the school in keeping with "the traditions and prestige" of the college.

The decision--approved with one dissenting vote--was reached at a special session called after a number of alumni chapters and individual graduates and students had protested the discontinuance of the school. The dissenting vote was cast by J. Gordon Bohannon of Petersburg.

The board, after deciding May 27 to

The board, after deciding May 27 to stop awarding degrees in law after the 1939-40 session, announced plans to merge the school of jurisprudence with the Marshall-Wythe school of government and citizenship.

The board said then that it proposed to continue the teaching of the broad fundamentals of jurisprudence and constitutional law, but would discontinue awarding law degrees in view of the duplication of effort between the law schools of the University of Virginia and William and Mary. Both schools are State-supported.

There are five candidates for law degrees at the approaching commencement of the college, the first American institution to establish a chair of law.

The resolution adopted yesterday by a vote of 7 to 1 instructed the college president, Dr. John Stewart Bryan, "to take such steps in the securing of financial support and personnel as in his judgment are necessary to strengthen and develop the law school in keeping with past traditions and prestige."

Voting for the resolution were G.
Walter Mapp of Accomac, vice-rector,
who presided at the meeting; Miss
Gabriella Page, Richmond; Channing
M. Hall, Williamsburg; Homer L.
Ferguson, Newport News; John Archer
Wilson, Roanoke; A. H. Foreman,
Norfolk, and A. Obici, Suffolk. Dr.
Sidney B. Hall, State superintendent of
public instruction, also was present, but
as an ex-officio member of the board he
votes only in case of a tie.

Resolution Adopted
The resolution adopted follows:

"Upon a hearing of committees from the alumni and the student body, and after extended reports by professors of the law department, it was resolved by the board of visitors of the College of William and Mary in Virginia that in view of the deep interest shown by those appearing in person and by memorial and upon the promise of active aid from the alumni that the law department be continued:

"And to this end the board instructed the president to take such steps in the securing of financial support and personnel as in his judgment are necessary to strengthen and develop the law school in keeping with past traditions and prestige."

Delegations were present at the meeting from Norfolk, Newport News, Richmond and Williamsburg, as well as interested individuals from other points.

Oscar Lane Shewmake of Richmond, the first alumnus to be heard, said he expressed the sentiment of Richmond alumni in asking that the law school be retained. He said if the school were abolished because of duplication with other institutions in the State, the boards of the various State schools would not know where to stop since duplication could be found throughout the higher education system of Virginia.

Were the school closed for economy's sake, not being self-supporting, then the college itself would close, he asserted, since it receives annually about a quarter of a million dollars for support from the State. Results of the school's work, he added, cannot be measured in money, since the services of any one graduate of a number he named were worth more than it cost the State.

Mr. Shewmake predicted the college would lose in prestige if it lost the law school.

H. Lester Hooker, member of the State Corporation Commission, said law graduates of William and Mary were making names for themselves and the college. Mr. Hooker urged not only the retention of the law school, but its further development.

Lee Ford of Newport News said it was "unthinkable" to abolish the school due to economy and duplication. He said freshmen were in college now who wanted to take law. The college, he added, served Eastern Virginia's 350,000 people and the law school here meant many could study law who could not otherwise afford to go to distant points.

T. H. Geddy of Newport News told the board he was willing to leave the matter in the hands of the board, and that if they decided the law school was best for the college he wanted it, but if not, he thought it should be dropped.

William Arthur, of Wytheville, Ralph Baker of Newport News and Robert Simpson of Arlington, who said they were speaking for the students, all urged retention of the school. Alvin Gentry of Staunton and Robert M.

Hughes of Norfolk also urged retention of the school.

Needless to say there was much rejoicing and celebrating at the dance that Friday night. We enjoyed Gene Krupa's music all the more. The same was true of Hal Kemp's band the next afternoon and night.

There was still one more little item of business outstanding, however. That was a little matter of the bar exam. Suffice it to say that after three weeks' studying under Mr. Woodbridge in Williamsburg, 12 of us went to Roanoke and took the exam. A month later we learned that of the 12, 10 had passed! An excellent record.

Thus endeth the tale of the most eventful month in my life -- May 28, 1939 -- June 28, 1939.

"To live well . . . and to die well"

(This eloquent testimony to the impact of the William and Mary experience on the lives of the Class of 1929 was delivered by Boyd G. Carter '29, Duffield, Va., at the Memorial Service of his class at Wren Chapel on May 13 during Commencement Weekend. It was entitled "The Class of 1929: Peak of a 'Golden Age' in a Glorious Tradition.")

In a recent letter, Billy Bickers mentioned Francois Rabelais in connection with research he did some years ago on the history of medicine in France, at the University of Toulouse, one of my alma maters, and at Montpelier where Rabelais studied medicine.

Rabelais' works, in which the main characters are giants, reflect the avidity to know of men of the Renaissance, their insatiable intellectual curiosity, their confidence in man's capacity to improve himself, his environment and his way of life. The problem that faced one of the giants when his wife died in childbirth was this: should he rejoice because he was the father of a son or weep because he was a widower?

A similar spirit of emotional polarity faces us today as we gather for this memorial service: the joy of being together, tempered by the nostalgic and affectionate recollection of those of our classmates who lived out their time and departed.

In a letter to me written in a firm hand, with its content proceeding from an alert mind still incisive, vigorous and retentive, at age 93 as I recall, Dr. E. G. Swem characterized our period in the College as the "Golden Age" of William and Mary. Since he did not elaborate on the designation and I did not hear from him again, we can only speculate on what Dr. Swem meant by "Golden Age." Did he mean that students attending the College between 1925 and 1929 had academic and postgraduate records of unusual achievement and distinction? That we were blessed with the privilege of studying with learned and dedicated teachers of the category of John Leslie Hall, Havilah Babcock, J.D. Carter, G. Glenwood Clark, D.W. Davis, E.M. Gwathmey, W.A.R. Goodwin, J.R. Geiger, W.G. Guy, Althea Hunt, Grace W. Landrum, W.A. Montgomery, R.L. Morton, John Garland Pollard, A.G. Ryland, E.G. Swem, A.G. Taylor, P.A. Warren, A.G. Williams, W.W.

Woodbridge, R.C. Young and many others? Did he mean that the College in its recently initiated epoch of coeducation had a new orientation then that gave an excitingly creative and productive impetus to the academic environment? That the national optimism of the Twenties generated an atmosphere of confidence that was reflected in ambitious efforts to achieve and to excel, whether in sports, in academics or in general college activities? That the administration of Dr. Julian A.C. Chandler was superbly effective? I conjecture that Dr. Swem had in mind these dimensions of our William and Mary Experience, as well as other qualities symbolized in the requirements of the College for admission and graduation and tenure in residence.

For me our time in The College of William and Mary was a "Golden Age" of diversity in continuity, of cultural security and assurance within a tested tradition of accepted values, of faith in our country, in our future and in ourselves. It was also a "Golden Age" of honesty, integrity and dignity in conduct in and out of the classroom, of respect for teachers and confidence in their wisdom and

counsel.

We felt that the College knew what it stood for, where it was going, how to get there and what to do to give us the basic learning needed to earn a living and a philosophy of life that would give us moral direction and see us through. I cannot imagine that a single one of us came to William and Mary just to become a me, but rather we came to become a succession of me's in selfdevelopment and attainments.

The College has been and exists as the bond that brings us together on this occasion to remember, to assess and to be grateful for the greatest formative experience in our lives. It unites us in the remembrance of our classmates today as a catalyzer of the enduring values we had in common as students, in a College that has defined its purposes over the centuries and has stood firm as a symbol of quality in permanence and of quality in change.

In an admirable and total sense the College of William and Mary has helped us attain the goals of education as Montaigne conceived of them: to learn how to live well (bien vivre) and to die well (bien mourir). What more could we ask?



Bernard L. Carnevale, Director of Athletics since 1972, has been named president of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics for 1979-80.


Carnevale will head the 1,000member professional association until next summer. The NACDA has its headquarters in Cleveland and was established in 1893.

Grid Season Remains Question Mark

Drewer, Czerkawski, Garrity Battle to Take the Place of Rozantz at QB

The news stands are filled with college football magazines this time of year with "in depth" outlooks and forecasts for the 1979 season.

The "experts" can't seem to agree on William and Mary's prospects, as evidenced by predictions ranging from a 2-9 won-loss record to 6-5.

The diverse outlooks for the Indians are nothing new, though. In 1976 the Tribe posted a 7-4 mark but one of the most highly regarded tabloids had called for an 0-11 season.

Without question, the most frequently used word by coaches in pre-season is "if," when asked to analyze their team's outlook. And "if" is a very big word in the William and Mary football vocabulary for the 1979 prospectus.

Let's take a look at the squad.

Let's take a look at the squad.
Gone is record setting quarterback
Tom Rozantz who directed the
Indian attack for four years. No heir
apparent emerged from the three
returning upperclassmen during the
spring session, and none has varsity
experience.

Junior Alan Drewer has a strong passing arm and a sound knowledge of the game but his speed and quickness are suspect.

Fellow junior Joe Czerkawski has been injury-plagued, and while he appears to have the ability it is difficult to assess his potential because of his limited playing time.

Sophomore Chris Garrity, who lettered as the varsity's punter in '78, seemed last fall to have the inside track, but he did not establish himself as the clear choice in spring practice.

However, there are several positive factors encompassing the Tribe's veer-option attack which make the outlook more promising.

A solid offensive front, with several talented linemen, offers reason for optimism. The major concern among the staff is lack of depth. But, almost every football program nationwide expresses the need for "more big people."

Running back positions are strong with tailbacks Clarence Gaines (returning starter) and Keith Best and fullbacks Alvis Lang (returning starter), Mike Brown and Cornell Cary (all lettermen) accounting for experienced depth.

The receiving corps offers "good news and bad news." The wide receivers and slot back positions feature the return of veterans Al Tafro, Mike Burgess, Ed Schiefelbein and Mike Zupan. All have been starters.

At tight end, Ken Cloud and Rob Muscalus, both four year fixtures, have graduated. Any one of several untested candidates will be in contention, including at least two freshmen.

Defensively, at least on paper, the Tribe is in big trouble in the secondary because every starter graduated. But each position will be filled by lettermen who, in fact, played as much or more than the starters.

The depth factor is somewhat lacking but a couple of highly touted freshmen could contribute to the overall defensive outlook.

The line may well be one of the best in a long time. Size, speed, experience and depth tell the story. Fred Wallach, Louis Wright, Steve

Frisina and Dan Burnick (tackles); Bo Short, Bill Swertfager and John Cannon (middle guards) and Richard Goode, Scott Riddle, Mike Kneidinger and Dave Haas (ends) add up to a talented group of returnees.

The linebacking positions should be another strong point. All American candidate Steve Shull heads up an experienced foursome of John Kelly, Owen Costello and Steve Dowdy.

Here is a synopsis of the schedule: VMI. The Keydets have 35 returning lettermen (lost 21) and their apparent strengths are in the defensive front, at running back, and the kicking game. Coming off a 3-8 season, Coach Bob Thalman says "we can win 'em all." VMI too will be breaking in a new QB. W&M vs. VMI is always a battle regardless of who is tabbed the favorite.

Colgate. The Red Raiders have 19 lettermen returning (17 lost) from a 3-8 team which is considered "much stronger" for 1979. Excellent passing game and offense returns almost

intact. Defense hard hit by graduation. Finished the season with East's biggest upset, a 14-9 decision over Rutgers

Virginia Tech. It's back to Blacksburg again, site of the 1978 "Great Lane Robbery," and Coach Dooley feels he has a much better team this year. 27 returning lettermen (27 lost), excellent running backs and a solid defensive front are the strong points. Lack of depth and the offensive line are question marks. Hokies' were 4-7 in '78.

Ga. Tech. The 7-4, Peach Bowl participant Yellow Jackets have a veteran squad (41 returning lettermen) but they have lost All American running back Eddie Lee Ivory. Coach Pepper Rogers faces one of the toughest schedules in the country (W&M game sandwiched between Alabama, Florida, Notre Dame and Tennessee).

James Madison. The Dukes were one of the best College Division teams in the nation. This year they step up to Division I status, with full

scholarship aid, and they understandably will be stronger in 1979! A more ambitious schedule makes matching last year's 8-2 mark doubtful. 42 lettermen return (21 lost) with several frosh expected to contribute.

Navy. Another bowl team (Holiday Bowl), a top 20 ranking in '78 (9-3 overall) and one wonders if the Middies can do it again. Coach George Welsh says "Yes, if. . ." 33 returning lettermen (15 lost) with no glaring weaknesses. No doubt Navy will again be one of the powers in the East.

Rutgers. Another Bowl team (Garden State Bowl), a top 20 ranking in '78 (9-2) and they feel 1979 has more of the same in store. 30 lettermen return (20 lost) with both lines cited as strengths. W&M's homecoming will feature one of the best in the East.

Delaware. The Blue Hens were one of the best College Division teams in the nation. Lost the national title 10-9 to Eastern Illinois in championship bowl game. Finished 10-4 overall and Coach Harold Raymond is going after it all in '79. 41 lettermen return (20 lost) and loss of QB only apparent weakness.

Appalachian State. The Mountaineers are coming off a 7-4 season. An explosive offense returns while defense continues to be suspect. 32 returning lettermen (16 lost), speed, speed, speed. If the offense can get some help from the defense, a great year could be in the making.

Richmond. The Spiders were 3-8 last year but records don't mean a thing in the W&M - UR rivalry. Coach Jim Tait has a veteran squad returning (37 lettermen) and optimism abounds from Richmond. The only real question mark is the defensive line.

East Carolina. ECU, as usual, is loaded. As strong as the Pirates were in '78 (9-3), including a victory in the Independence Bowl, Coach Pat Dye says "we'll be as good or stronger" this year. The defensive front lost some key players. 45 lettermen return.

New Trainer in "Ecstasy"

Adair's New Training Room Gives Rawlings Room to "Do Her Thing"

Deborah Rawlings '73, the head women's athletic trainer, had her hands full. Surrounded by water buckets, rolls of tape and supplies, she was busily filling seven rows of drawers and cabinets that lined Adair Gym's new training facility at William and Mary.

It may have looked like a hot sweaty job in the midst of the August heat, but Rawlings, 28, was in "ecstasy." While she is beginning her second year as the first full-time trainer for women's sports, it is the first year that she will be operating in a modern training room.

With brown-eyes sparkling Rawlings cracked a wry smile and said, "They'll be no more ice cups defrosting on the middle of my desk." Last year, when she operated out of an equipment room in the basement of Adair, athletes lined up in the hall to be taped and treated and frequently when Rawlings sunk behind her desk there was an ice bag or cup there to greet her.

The completion of the training room and Deborah's presence as trainer are more indications of the continuing growth of William and Mary's women's intercollegiate athletic program which has mushroomed from seven sports in 1972-73 to 13 intercollegiate teams and two interest groups today.

Accompanying the growth has been an increase in the operating budget from \$19,000 in 1972 to \$250,000 for 1979-80. While in 1972-73 the staff consisted of nine, today it includes 18 people with the latest addition a full-time women's Sports Information Director, Karen Smith, hired in August.

According to women's Athletic Director Millie West, much of the growth can be attributed to an involved administration in the college. Alumni have shown their support in recent years through gifts to the Athletic Educational Foundation and West is hopeful this support will increase.

Renovations in Adair Gym, which houses the program, were recently completed providing a new main office area and a new athletic training facility.

Although Rawlings started the women's training program from scratch, she knew what to expect. As an undergraduate at William and Mary she competed on the women's lacrosse team for three years, was named co-captain her senior year, and graduated with a B.A. in Education. It was during an adapted physical education course here when she was required to observe in the training room that the urge to become a trainer struck her.

After a two-year stint at the University of Tennessee-Knoxville where she received an M.S. in Physical Education, Rawlings returned to William and Mary, putting in 1800 hours of clinical work in order to receive her training certification. As an apprentice, Rawlings worked under Ed Christman, William and Mary's men's trainer, spending most of her time covering the football team.

When the position opened up for a women's trainer, Rawlings rolled up her sleeves and jumped in. "I chose William and Mary because I got the best of both worlds," she explained. "I was able to set up my own

program and be on my own, but it I needed a second opinion I could go to the men's trainer."

At the start Rawlings equipment included a freezer to make ice, a hydrocollator, which stores heating pads in hot water, and one taping table. If athletes required more treatment she gave them a referral card to go over to the men's training room.

This year her equipment includes two training tables, an icemaker, a whirlpool, an ultra-sound machine, and, most noticeably, the new facility. The four-room training center is part of the renovations in Adair paid for by a \$50,000 grant from the McGregor Fund of Detroit.

At one end is a 16 by 20 foot room which will be in the main taping and treatment center. In the middle there is an examination room and Rawling's new office which has windows on both sides. The biggest window looks into the weight room which is lined with yellow, green and blue stripes.

If caring for 350 women athletes in 13 intercollegiate sports phases Rawlings she hides it well. During the year she is on the field or in her office during practice time and when forced to define priorities she covers the sport which holds the most

potential for injury. Her job takes her on the road with teams as often as it leaves her in Williamsburg.

In addition, she teaches two courses in the women's physical education department: Adapted Sports for those with old injuries or operations, and Weight Traning for Women.

Very few women have been exposed to weight training before reaching college, according to Rawlings. With the addition of the multi-station universal weight machine, women students and athletes will have an opportunity to train in their own center for the first time.

Weight training is especially important to athletes for three reasons, said Rawlings. "The number one reason is skill, because all sports require a certain amount of strength. The second reason is to be well-conditioned and be able to maintain longer in a game, and thirdly, a stronger athlete is less likely to sustain an injury, or if they do they will recuperate faster."

When injuries do happen, a trainer treats an athlete's emotions as well as their muscles. "The hardest part of my job is to keep injured players out," said Rawlings. "They resist it for all they're worth. If they've been playing at least four years they are very competitive and don't want to lose conditioning."

The logic of reinjuring themselves and causing damage that will last a lifetime isn't the best strategy in such a situation. "When you're 18 or 19 you're not worried about what it's going to be like when you're 45," said Rawlings. "But not being able to give 100 per cent and really aid the team is what an athlete can understand."

When asked why she enjoys her job, Rawlings had to stop a minute and think. "Basically I enjoy athletics," she said. "I like helping people. It gives you a good feeling when you can help someone get back in condition to play."

Her efforts have not gone unnoticed. "She has done an absolutely divine job," professed Millie West. "We didn't know how badly we needed her until we got her."

And what do the athletes think? A photograph in Rawling's office displays a group of legs and feet in a semi-circle behind two crossed crutches. The inscription says, "To Debby with all our love, Women's Varsity Track 1979."





Alumni Called Upon to "Make the Eighties Our Best Years Yet"

Smiths To Chair New W&M Fund

Two of the College's most active and creative alumni have taken on the formidable task of "Making the Eighties Our Best Years Yet" by raising private support through the new 1979-80 William and Mary Fund.

Bill '44 and Jane '48 Spencer Smith of Detroit will serve as chairmen of this year's fund drive, which kicks off in early September and closes at the end of next June.

"To say we're enthusiastic about serving as chairmen of this year's William and Mary Fund would be an understatement," says Bill Smith. "It's as if we've been asked to serve as captains of a championship team--a team consisting of some 30,000 alumni all across the country and the world."

Bill and Jane, who were instrumental in forming the Michigan-Northern Ohio alumni chapter and came up with the idea for the annual Homecoming tennis tourney, created a slogan for this year's drive which reflects the confidence and strength of the College as it enters a new decade. During the year ahead, "Making the Eighties Our Best Years Yet" will be emblazoned across T-shirts, buttons, key rings and stationery. "We hope this will become a battle cry for all people associated with the College, not just those who work for the William and Mary Fund," says Jane, who currently serves on the Board of Directors of the Society of the Alumni.

The Smiths bring with them not only a solid record of experience in College alumni activities but a readymade support staff of family members. Their oldest daughter Laurie, who graduated from the College in 1974, now works for the Ted Bates Advertising Agency in New York City. Number-two daughter Susan married a professor currently at Milliken University in Illinois, and Sandy, the oldest son who graduated from William and Mary in 1978, works for the Justice Department in Washington, D.C. Doug, a member of the class of 1981, serves as his parents' "eyes and ears" in Williams-

Bill has spent more than 30 years promoting for fun and profit everything from the 1947 Varsity Show on campus during his senior year to "Mr. Tennis," the retail-mail order business he and Jane started in downtown Detroit. He attended the College from 1940-43, then served in the military during World War II before going back to William and Mary to receive his degree. While at the College, he

Campaign Closes with Over \$21 million

The three-year Campaign for the College ended with gifts and pledges of more than two million dollars over its goal, according to a final accounting released in July.

The College's first major fund raising campaign netted a total of \$21,405,026 as of its completion on June 30, 1979, well over the goal of \$19 million which was set in 1976 for the effort.

Of the total, \$4,034,933 was con-

tributed in the form of expendable gifts; \$8,320,793 was pledged or given in capital gifts, primarily to endowment; and \$9,049,300 was recorded in testamentary commitments

Over \$3 million in capital donations to the Campaign will be used to support faculty development, while nearly \$2 million will provide ongoing student assistance. Almost \$400,000 was given to endowment to enrich the educational program and over \$1

million was donated to support other projects at the College. Another \$1.8 million in unrestricted endowment will be used to meet year-to-year financial priorities of the College.

According to the final report, gifts from individuals--mostly William and Mary alumni--made up about 78% or \$16,812,842 of the total. Corporations contributed about 10% or \$2,008,543; and foundations accounted for 12% or \$2,583,641.

admits he was at times "a wild and crazy guy" who liked to organize things. He served as president of the Backdrop Club, president of Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternity, and as a member of the Choir.

In 1949, after what he admits seemed like an endless job-search during the post-war unemployment period, Bill landed a job at a New York ad agency. His contact there was a tall, slender girl who also graduated from the College--Jane Spencer. Soon after, the Smiths became a team and moved to Detroit where Bill started his own advertising firm of Smith, Paklaian, Bell Inc.

Both Bill and Jane have been leaders in Detroit civic organizations. Bill has received the Spirit of Detroit Award and the March of Dimes Award, and has served on the board of the Michigan Kidney Foundation, as director of the Detroit Torch Drive, and as a leader in the Citizens for Education Organization. When she is not serving as store manager of "Mr. Tennis," Jane works for the United Fund, the Women's Auxiliary and the PTA. She was named Volunteer of the Year in 1974 for the Detroit Rehabilitation Institute and was later named the organization's top female worker of the decade. She is also the former president of Michigan's Kappa Kappa Gamma alumni group.

While at William and Mary, Jane

served as news editor of the Flat Hat and was a member of the Chorus, Student Assembly, Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority, the Varsity tennis team and the women's athletic association.

"What we have here are two individuals who are made-to-order as far as fund chairmen are concerned," says Jim Rees '74, director of annual giving in the office of development. "The Smiths were very active at the College, they have remained close to

William and Mary through the Alumni Society and their children, and they have a great deal of experience in promotion and fund raising. And most of all, they don't mind telling people that they love the College and believe in what it stands for."

The Smiths will receive a great deal of help from a group of enthusiastic reunion year chairmen who will contact members of the 1934, 1939, 1944, 1949, 1954, 1959, 1964, 1969, and 1974 graduating classes. Other

fund agents will organize phonathons in Williamsburg and several other cities across the country and will work on special solicitations for gift clubs and matching gifts. Alumni who have already joined the "championship team" the Smiths are forming to lead the Fund are Robert H. Land '34, Marilyn '44 and John '44 Entwisle, Dennis '49 and Jean '49 Cogle, Bill '54 and Barbara '54 Brink, James Brinkley '59, Jackie Crebbs Peter '64, John Keiter '69 and Craig Cornwell '74

Denys Grant '58, president of the Society of the Alumni, has also asked a small group of interested alumni to join a new advisory committee for the William and Mary Fund, which will meet periodically to offer feedback and recommendations to the chairmen and development staff.

"The challenge we face this year is a tremendous one," admits Bill Smith, who says the 1979-80 William and Mary Fund will be looking to break the record \$354,000 raised during last year's drive. "People keep reminding me that we're in a recession, and that extra dollars are hard to come by. But Janie and I can't help but think that the alumni of William and Mary are the most loyal and faithful around, and that through thick and thin they will stand by the William and Mary Fund. Together, I think we really can make the eighties our best years yet."

Big Increase in W&M Fund Helps Private Support to Top \$3 Million

Paced by the largest dollar increase ever in the William and Mary Fund, private voluntary support of the College in 1978-79 exceeded \$3 million for the third consecutive year.

Gifts and grants from individuals, corporations, foundations, and other organizations during the 12-month period ending June 30, 1979, totalled \$3,182,168.

Total cash given to the William and Mary Fund by alumni was \$355,138, compared to \$301,062 during the previous 12 months. This represented a 17.6 per cent increase in cash gifts, which was not only the highest cash increase in the history of the fund but the highest percentage increase in 10 years. Moreover, the total number of gifts to the Fund increased by approximately one third -- from 5,981 in 1977-78 to 8,104 in 1978-79.

The impressive showing in the William and Mary Fund came during the third and final year of the Campaign for the College which exceeded its three-year goal of \$19 million by more than \$2 million. Dubbed "The Year of the Alumni," the last year of the Campaign placed special emphasis on increasing support for faculty at the College.

The \$3.1 million-plus total for 1978-79 consists of cash or properties in hand and includes no pledges, testamentary commitments, or government grants.

By categories, the College received \$615,159 from corporations and business concerns; \$1,004,624 from alumni, an increase of more than \$125,000 over 1977-78; \$61,208 from parents; \$931,813 from other individuals; \$558,363 from foundations, and \$11,001 from non-alumni, non-church groups.

Official Report Includes Cash and Property

The figures summarized in the box grants in the article on that subject

headed "Private Voluntary Support for the Year Ending June 30, 1979" are compiled and reported by the Office of Development in accordance with a format established by the Council for Financial Aid to Education (CFAE) for the compilation of such data nationwide.

The totals include gifts of cash and property received in hand from private sources during the fiscal year; they do not include outstanding pledges and government grants.

Gifts made payable to affiliate organizations in support of the College's activities are encompassed in the CFAE summary. Organizations associated with William and Mary which routinely receive direct contributions are the Athletic Educational Foundation and the Endowment Association of the College of William and Mary.

contributions designated for support of professional schools but otherwise unrestricted are reported in the "Unrestricted or General Purposes" category.

Names of contributing organizations and individuals, including the William and Mary Fund, are found elsewhere in this report. A supplementary report will be issued in January giving the results of the funds conducted on a calendar year basis. These include the Marshall-Wythe School of Law Fund, the School of Education Fund, the MBA Fund, and the Parents' Fund, all of which close Dec. 31.

The totals cited for governmental

grants in the article on that subject are based upon the value of new authorizations and continuations which became effective during the year ending June 30. In some cases these authorizations involved projects with terms of performance which will run two or more years.

"We were particularly gratified by the increased support of alumni during the final year of the Campaign," said Stanley E. Brown, acting vice president for development. Brown attributed the success of the William and Mary Fund to "the hard work and enthusiasm" that Harriet Nachman Storm '64, former president of the Society of the Alumni, contributed as chairman.

Approximately \$500,000 of the \$3.1 million total is unrestricted, which means it may be used at the discretion of the College, while more than a half-million dollars is designated for faculty and staff compensation, either for current operations or capital purposes. The unrestricted gifts have been termed as particularly helpful because they allow the College to allocate funds to those areas of most critical need.

In June, the Athletic Educational Foundation made its annual gift to the College of \$284,049 -- the highest amount given yet by the Foundation. This brings to more than \$1.25 million the amount of money donated to the College by the Foundation over the past four years.

Gilbert L. Granger '57, Williamsburg, the president of the AEF, expressed his pleasure that the Foundation continues to make such a meaningful contribution to the education of so many "fine student athletes at William and Mary." Nearly 500 students have benefited from the scholarship funds provided by the AEF over the past five years, according to Barry G. Fratkin '64, executive director of the AEF.

Several of the annual funds will not complete their campaigns until Dec. 31 when their totals and the names of donors will be given in a special supplementary development report. They are the Parents' Fund, the MBA Fund, the Law Fund and the School

of Education Fund.

The President's Council, which operates on a calendar year basis, will be announced during January. All contributors who have made personal gifts of more than \$1,000 to any one of several College funds between Jan. 1, 1979, and Dec. 31, 1979, will be invited to join the Council for 1980.

Students at William and Mary gave or pledged more than \$26,000 to the

College. This included \$21,172 from 363 seniors in five-year pledges, which is the highest amount ever raised by a senior class. The senior class drive was organized by Andy Lark '79 and Margaret Nelson '79, class president. In addition, \$3603 was collected from 29 law students and \$1815 from 20 MBA students in three-year pledges.

Breakdown of Funds to Support the College

A number of annual giving programs are conducted each year with the voluntary assistance of various constitutent organizations. All help William and Mary, though each fund has its own objectives.

Alumni and other friends and certain organizations which are involved with the College in several ways probably will receive several appeals in the course of the year. As an example, an alumnus with both undergraduate and law degrees from the College who has supported

the athletic program and who has a son attending William and Mary will routinely receive literature on the William and Mary Fund, the Marshall-Wythe School of Law Fund, the Athletic Educational Foundation Fund, and the Parents Fund.

The following summary is provided to help those individuals receiving more than one appeal to better understand how they fit into the total annual giving program and decide to what degree each merits his or her support.

ENDOWMENT GIFTS SURPASS \$1.6 MILLION

Alumni and friends of the College contributed more than \$1.6 million in gifts for endowment. Many of these gifts were made through the deposition of estates and through major gifts of assets during the lifetime of the donor.

"Gifts made through the estate plans of our donors," noted Mike Schoenenberger, director of estate planning, "have become an important source of endowment for the College."

A recent survey of funds raised from private sources ranked William and Mary first among its peers during 1976-77 in the income received from bequests and other estate gifts.

New endowments were established with gifts received from the estates of several donors:

• A special endowment in memory of Dr. Harold Lees Fowler was created with an unrestricted bequest from his estate. The Harold Lees Fowler Fund will serve as a memorial to his distinguished forty-year career as Professor of History and later Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Sciences.


