## THE SUNSET CEREMONY

Memorial Service Honoring Dead Alumni Goes Back as Far as 1900

At Homecoming again this year, the names of departed alumni will be read at the Sunset Ceremony, an event that has been going on under one guise or another for some 80 years at William and Mary.

Although the modern version of the Sunset Ceremony dates back to 1961, a memorial service honoring dead alumni shows up in College records as far back as 1900.

From 1930 until 1959, a version of the Sunset Ceremony was held under the sponsorship of Phi Beta Kappa at the Ewell Cemetery on campus. The occasion was part of Commencement Weekend during which alumni classes would hold reunions on campus.

The Society of the Alumni inaugurated the Sunset Parade at Homecoming in 1961 while James S. Kelly '51, who had attended many of the memorial observances at the Ewell Cemetery, was Secretary of the Society of the Alumni.

Kelly said the Queen's Guard had been established that year in conjunction with the inauguration of Dr. Davis Y. Paschall '32 as president of William and Mary. Subsequently the Society began the modern version of the Sunset Ceremony with the Queen's Guard

as the center of attention marching in the Sunken Garden. Later the event grew with the addition of the Colonial Militia of Colonial Williamsburg joining the Queen's Guard in the Sunken Garden to the sound of cannon salutes. The first Sunset Parade was held on Oct. 13, 1961.

Bowing to financial pressures, Colonial Williamsburg had to withdraw the participation of the Colonial Militia after the 1975 Sunset Parade. The ceremony, scaled down somewhat, was moved to the portico at the back of the Wren Building where it has continued to flourish since 1976. The memorial service is now an All-College event, and the Queen's Guard remains an essential part of the ceremony. A 1976 addition was the College choir under the direction of Dr. Frank Lendrim. The choir sings an appropriate musical selection and leads the singing of the Alma Mater at the conclusion.

Following a brief traditional eulogy by the Society president and a prayer, the names of all alumni who have died during the year past are read. Three volleys by the Queen's Guard are followed by taps and the tolling of the Wren bell.

## Long, Hot, Dry Summer

New Sod on Cary Field Survives, Despite Water Shortage Caused by Drought

This was no year to start a new lawn anywhere in Williamsburg, much less install a new playing field in Cary Field Stadium and expect it

to remain green for the football

As part of the renovation of the Stadium, the playing field was

rebuilt to conform to a new drainage system and meet specifications for its use as a soccer field as well as a football gridiron. New sod, installed

early in the summer, took root easily with the aid of a new underground water sprinkling system installed beneath the turf during the renova-

But a dry spell which hit the area late in June continued to affect Williamsburg's water supply until August 15, when the city ordered all users to cease using public water to maintain lawns and landscaping. By mid-September, the city began planning additional restrictions as the drought continued with no letup

After August 15, the College's buildings and grounds department began trucking water from Matoaka Lake to Cary Field and the women's playing fields, as well as to the new law school and other newly-planted areas. More than 100,000 gallons were trucked to Cary Field alone in the first month of do-it-yourselfsprinklering.

The playing field, which was among Williamsburg's greenest lawns in mid-August, gradually browned under the hot sun even though it was being watered as regularly as staff and equipment allowed. Without the underground sprinkler system, not enough water could reach the grass to allow it to retain its lush, green appearance.

Elsewhere on campus and throughout the Williamsburg area, lawns and trees, azaleas and flowers, drooped and began showing the effects of the lack of water. Turf experts, however, advised that the sod in Cary Field Stadium--though brown this fall--is healthy and will green up again once weather allows and the sprinkler system can be supplied with clean water.

## Board Extends Society Activities

Garrett Leads Directors in Busy Weekend Schedule Before Festivities of Burgesses Day

The Alumni Board of Directors took at its semi-annual meeting Sept. 12-13 several actions in support of its commitment to extend involvement in programs affecting alumni and undergraduates.

Under the direction of Jack Garrett '40, president, intensive meetings were held during the day and a half meeting by the fifteen member board. Various college administrative officials met with alumni committees.

A reception was held on Friday evening for selected alumni children undergraduates and student government leaders.

The Scholarship Committee, chaired by Stanley Hudgins '43 recommended the scholarships provided by the Alumni Scholarship Endowment Fund be awarded to upperclassmen on the basis of merit, rather than need, to underscore the

interest of the Society in all around academic and extracurricular excellence.

The Board endorsed establishment of a cooperative program with the College to extend the placement and career counseling programs. The Board also authorized the development of a program with the Admissions Office to train alumni in admissions interview techniques.

The Board named a long range planning committee to codify and prioritize long range objectives and goals of the Society under the chairmanship of Dr. Henry Wilde '53. The major committees of the Board, College Relations and Alumni Service were asked to determine major objectives and areas of interest, and members of the Board were assigned responsibility for specific areas within committee assignments.

The Board authorized a series of feasibility and land use studies for expansion of the Alumni House. The Alumni House committee chaired by Dr. Marvin West '52 has projected space needs to accommodate a Faculty Club dining facility which would be available evenings and

weekends for receptions, departmental and group dinners, and alumni activities. Badly needed Society office space would be included in space requirements that may house offices for placement interviews and career counseling, as well as furnish space for satellite alumni organizations.

Formal organization of the Olde Guarde was discussed and encouraged. This group is composed of persons who have graduated more than 50 years ago.

The Board endorsed the appointment of Mrs. Jane Hardin Hanson '42, as alumni vice president of the Friends of the President's House. Mrs. Hanson has been a member of the Committee to Refurnish the Presidents House and has been instrumental in the establishment of the Friends organization. She is a former member of the Alumni Board.

The Board indicated its interest in admission of alumni children, feeling that many alumni children who would graduate are being denied admission. The development of a positive admissions program will encourage alumni support of the College in many areas.

The annual meeting and dinner are traditionally the start of the fiscal year drive which ends in May when the Foundation makes its annual contribution to the College in support of the intercollegiate athletic program.

## Editor's Notebook

For more than a half-dozen years, the *Alumni Gazette* has published data which compared faculty salaries and compensation at William and Mary and similar colleges and universities in Virginia and throughout the nation.

Improvement of faculty compensation became a major goal of the successful Campaign for the College, as alumni and friends contributed numerous major gifts to increase unrestricted endowments and establish professorships which are eligible for State "Eminent Scholars" salary funds.

The Board of Visitors declared in 1978 that improvement of faculty salaries was the College's top priority, and this commitment attracted the attention of key members of the General Assembly and Governor Dalton. In 1979, William and Mary was moved up to a new salary authorization level by the Governor, and the General Assembly early in 1980 increased funding to help support the Governor's move.

The effects on faculty salaries of the infusion of new endowed private funds helped increase morale, and so did the 1979-80 actions by the State. Actual dollar differences for this academic session have not been calculated, but undoubtedly there is a need to find new endowments to make William and Mary salaries more competitive in Virginia and across the nation. The strides taken so far, though important and positive, are not so big as to overcome the lage of many years' standing.

Comparative measurements of salaries are tricky and can be misleading. Newly published figures for 1979-80 (the last academic session) are an example. Though William and Mary is *authorized* by the Commonwealth to pay its faculty the fourth highest average of all institutions (behind Virginia, VPI and Virginia Commonwealth), its *actual* average ranks sixth (behind Old Dominion and George Mason) for associate and assistant professors, and fifth (ahead of George Mason) for full professors.

Compensation at William and Mary is compared nationally by the American Association of University Professors. Compensation includes salaries and fringe benefits which have monetary value. Among public and private universities which are recognized by the AAUP as comparable to William and Mary, the College ranks in the bottom fifth at all ranks-a position it has held for years, and continues to hold despite the first infusion of privately endowed salary funds.

But, the AAUP reported this year, William and Mary ranks in the third (or middle) quintile when its overall average salaries (without fringes) are compared with data from similar universities. The College drops to the fourth quintile when total average compensation including fringes is compared with similar universities.

The new AAUP report is encouraging to those whose job it is to help recruit new faculty from throughout the nation, for a mid-range salary average is better than being at the bottom of the comparative well. William and Mary becomes more attractive in the academic marketplace, as a result

William and Mary has never been an "average" college or university, and simply occupying the middle range in faculty salary comparisons is nothing to crow about.



## A New Man In Charge of Equipment

Frank Cody Retires After 28 Years as Equipment Manager

For 28 years William and Mary's equipment manager was Frank Cody. The man from just up the road in Toano became a legend in his own time.

He outfitted two generations of William and Mary football players as sons of the fathers he had greeted arrived to play for the Tribe.

After nearly three decades Frank has retired. (Hundreds of former athletes will be honoring Frank on Friday, Oct. 3, 3:30 p.m. at a gathering at Cary Stadium.)

His successor? Countless applications for the opening came in and Dave O'Neil was selected.

The 34 year old native of Kutztown, Pa., joined the William and Mary staff in July.

O'Neil was the sports equipment manager at Kutztown State College for three years prior to his arrival in Williamsburg.

"I've always been involved in athletics and several years ago I had the opportunity to go into this profession and jumped at it. I've never regretted a minute of it," stated O'Neil.

The diminutive but powerfully built O'Neil heard about the William and Mary job through a friend of his at Lafayette College.

"I didn't know much about William and Mary except it was an excellent academic college with very competitive football and basketball programs," said O'Neil.

He submitted an application and shortly thereafter he was invited for an interview.

"I was impressed with a lot of things; the campus, the town, the renovation at the stadium. After seeing everything and meeting Coach Jimmye Laycock there was no doubt in my mind I wanted the job."


O'Neil got it. He was "the most qualified and had outstanding references," according to Laycock.

An avid outdoorsman who loves archery, O'Neil hopes to some day land an equipment manager's job in professional football.

"It's a hope I've had for a long time. No longer do I consider it a dream. It's my goal and one which I will work very hard to attain."

And work he does. From sunrise til after sunset he is handling all the equipment and locker room needs.

Helmets, shoulder pads, laundry,

daily inventories, anything and everything used by or for a player is checked by O'Neil.

"It's a jack-of-all trades type job. One of the most important factors is being organized. There is so much to account for," relates O'Neil.

"He can account for every cleat, every pad," says one player. "Dave is unbelieveably organized. He has a place for everything and you better not mess 'em up."

The locker room is immaculate. O'Neil the "enforcer" sees it stays that way. He is often seen picking up the smallest fragment of ankle tape from the floor and placing it into the trash or telling a player to clean up the area by his locker.

"This place is new. It's clean. It's something to take pride in and I am going to be darn certain it stays that way," warns the "enforcer."

O'Neil travels with the team. His responsibilities continue. Make sure helmets and pads fit. Equipment repair, etc.

Serious injuries can result if a player is not properly out-fitted. His equipment is crucial to his well-

"The single most important aspect of the job is making certain the players are in the right gear," emphasizes O'Neil.

"You just don't throw out a helmet and shoulder pads and say play ball. The players must be, what amounts to, custom fitted," says the Tribe manager who adds, "You can't be too careful when it comes to being sure the players have the best protection."

His responsibilities are vast. His work goes relatively un-noticed by many. But in the words of head coach Jimmye Laycock, "Dave O'Neil is as important a member of our staff as anyone."

## Top Officials Attend Burgesses Day

## Society Entertains 700 In Day That Honors Lawmakers

The Society of the Alumni entertained more than 700 guests, including Governor John N. Dalton '53, the lieutenant governor of the state, and two former governors, at Burgesses Day at William and Mary on September 14.

Many of Virginia's top lawmakers, including more than three dozen legislators, came to Williamsburg for a reception and luncheon at William and Mary Hall followed by the football game between William and Mary and Virginia Military Institute. Among other invited guests were numerous appointed state officials and many of the judges of the Federal and state benches.

Guests at the head table included Dalton, former Governors Mills E. Godwin Jr. '35 and Albertis S. Harrison, Lt. Gov. Charles S. Robb, Chief Justice Lawrence I'Anson, '28, Federal District Court Judge Ted Dalton '24, '26 B.L., and 1st District Congressman Paul Trible.

Sponsored by the Society,
Burgesses Day commemorates the
historic bonds between the Commonwealth and the College. In that
spirit, President Graves presented
Governor and Mrs. Dalton with a
William and Mary blanket for the
Governor's excellent "track record"
over the years in finding space on
his calendar for the College's
important activities. The William and
Mary blanket is normally reserved
for outstanding Tribe athletes.

John H. Garrett Jr. '40, president of the Society of the Alumni, gave the Daltons on behalf of the Society a rare print of alumnus John Marshall, fourth chief justice of the United States, made from a 1903 woodblock engraving by Gustav Kruell. The Society purchased the original blocks in 1978. Extensive search has failed to reveal any copies of the prints in museum or private collections. Garrett made similar presentations to Robb, Godwin, and

Harrison. All of the guests received green glass paper weights and colorful green and gold shakers for the game.

Remarks at the luncheon were closely tied to the new Marshall-Wythe School of Law Building which was dedicated later in the afternoon.

Garrett called the law building "yet another example of the

College's continuing growing service to the nation." Governor Dalton added that "we need to remember (the building) was funded by a popular bond referendum and is a gift from the people of Virginia."

Burgesses Day commemorates the two times when the state's governing bodies, the House of Burgesses and the Colonial Council (the upper house of the General Assembly), met in the Sir Christopher Wren Building on the campus.

The Burgesses met in the Wren Building from 1699 until 1704 while the capitol building was under construction. The Council convened there again from 1747 to 1754 when the capitol, damaged by fire, was rebuilt.

## Revitalized Marshall-Wythe Dedicated at Ceremony

Three Former Governors, Hundreds of Alumni, Take Tour of New Facility

William and Mary dedicated its new law school building at the end of Burgesses Day on Sept. 13 in the presence of three former governors of Virginia and many of the state's leading jurists.

The College announced the establishment of two new professorships of law - one in honor of former president John Stewart Bryan and the other in honor of former governor Mills E. Godwin Jr. '35 who shared the podium with two other former governors, Albertis S. Harrison and J. Lindsay Almond.


In his remarks to a crowd of more than 500 in 90-degree heat in front of the new Marshall-Wythe School of Law building located about a half mile from the main campus next to the National Center for State Courts, Dean William B. Spong Jr. called the building "a gift from the people of Virginia."

Accepting a gold key to the building, Spong said: "Today is a beginning. A higher plateau of excellence and service is reachable."

Governor Godwin occupied center stage during the ceremony as Spong announced the establishment of the Mills E. Godwin Jr. Professorship of Law endowed by a gift from Richmond financier Lawrence Lewis Jr., the Noland Co. Foundation of Newport News, and R. R. Smith, chairman of the board of Smith's Transfer Corp. of Verona, Va.

Spong paid tribute to the former two-time governor under whose administration the College received both site preparation money and support for a \$125 million bond referendum which passed easily in November 1977. The \$5.4 million for construction of the 88,000-square foot building, one of the most modern in the nation, was included in the bond issue.

In announcing the Godwin Professorship, College officials noted it was created "to memorialize the sterling leadership which he gave the Commonwealth of Virginia in his two terms as governor; to recognize his stance of honest, fiscally responsible and efficient government; and, in general, to salute the faithful, valuable service that he, throughout his long and distinguished public career, rendered the Commonwealth and all of its citizens."



Approximately 500 guests attended the dedication ceremonies which were held in front of the new law school building on South Henry Street adjacent to the National Center for State Courts.

Dean Spong accepted a gold key to the \$5.4 million law school building which he described as one of the most modern in he nation.

The John Stewart Bryan Professorship of Jurisprudence, in honor of William and Mary's president from 1934 to 1942, was established by an endowment from members of the Bryan family, including D. Tennant Bryan, Richmond, chairman of Media General; Amanda Bryan Kane of Charlottesville, and Elizabeth G. Henry of New York City. Bryan's period at William and Mary was

known as an "era of good feeling" and he was credited with increasing the size and quality of the College faculty, in addition to his many other accomplishments.

In his remarks, Spong said that "the eyes of our faculty and students are understandably to the future."

"How this building is used will determine if we are worthy of our rich heritage, worthy of the long struggle for survival and worthy of the faith of the people of the Commonwealth."

Governor John N. Dalton '53 had attended Burgesses Day festivities earlier in the day but had to leave campus for another engagement before the dedication began at 4:30 p.m. After the official ceremony, guests toured the building and attended a reception on the grounds.

## Choir to Visit Europe Again

Students Seek to Raise Own Money for Summer Tour

The College choir is going to Europe again, for the second time in four years

The 55-member choir will leave on a 26-day trip from Dulles airport on May 19 to Paris, Geneva, Frankfurt, London, Canterbury and other places in England. The choir made a similar concert tour in 1978, but only one member of the choir remains from that tour of Europe. jaunt for choir members. All expenses will be covered either by donations or by the students themselves since there are no funds in the university's budget for the trip.

The choir members have already raised approximately \$1500 by giving concerts to convention groups in the Williamsburg area. But their big money-raiser -- at it was in 1978 --



will be an effort to sell approximately 100,000 Christmas and note cards (see adjacent ad).

Frank Lendrim, choir director, said he expects the trip to cost approximately \$1500 per person.

The choir and the Botetourt Singers, an ensemble group of approximately 15 members, will give concerts at the Notre Dame in Paris, at American churches in Geneva and Frankfurt, at Westminster Abbey in London, and at the Canterbury Cathedral in Canterbury, England. The choir performed in each of those cities, with the exception of Canterbury, in 1978, and Lendrim said he has received numerous invitations to return with his group. This past summer, while teaching in a William and Mary program at Cambridge, he began arrangements for the return

The choir will fly directly to Paris on May 19. After a travel break, the choir will give its first concert at Notre Dame; its second in Geneva at Emmanuel Church; and the third concert of the trip in Frankfurt at Christ and King Anglican Church. The members will then take a respite with a Rhine River cruise and an evening in Cologne.

On May 31, the choir will sing at Westminster Abbey and on June 1 will give another concert in London in the Church of St. Martin's in the Fields. It will perform Canterbury

and other as yet undetermined sites in England before returning home June 13.

Lendrim describes the trip as "a good mix of work and play that will make the occasion a rich educational experience in European travel."

Plans are for students to stay in private homes where possible, which will prove less expensive than hotel

accommodations and will also provide students with more intimate contact with the people of the various countries.

## Nancy Porter: Coach of Champions

Quiet Approach Works for Field Hockey Coach

In six years as William and Mary's varsity field hockey coach, Nancy Porter's teams have won three regional championships and placed fourth, eight and fifth at the Division I Nationals to establish a 71-17-11 overall record.

With those figures in mind, one might expect to find a coach who travels extensively to scout prospective athletes, whips players into shape during grueling workouts and accepts no excuses for missing practice

Any of those visions would be the antithesis of Nancy Porter. She inspires a quiet discipline in the team, believes that academics are the foremost priority, and knows how to enjoy a good laugh.

"I don't initiate contact with any of the students because I think they should want to come here," says Porter. "The reputation of William and Mary and the field hockey program causes students to contact me."

By students choosing to attend William and Mary Porter feels she avoids some of the problems of schools who "coerce" students to attend. "I like the attitude of the field hockey and lacrosse program that everyone has the right to participate," she says. "We have a national contender and yet with three coaches and four teams everyone has the opportunity to play."

Porter actively advocates the College policy that academics should be the top priority for her team, an unusual group of athletes with no physical education majors and numerous fine arts and science

"The students are a very diversified group both academically and athletically," says Porter. "I don't mind giving way sometimes to aeademics because it makes both aspects (studies and sports) a healthy experience."

Senior and captain Betsy Frick says that Porter's philosophy has kept the field hockey team in a healthy perspective. "The program has grown much more competitive since my freshman year but the players have maintained a good attitude because of N.P. (Porter). We still have a lot of fun and hockey is important but it's not the *most* important thing."

However, don't get the idea that the team treats practice like a play day. "I've never known anyone who in a quiet way inspires personal responsibility like N.P. does," says senior Bevin Engman. "I feel like I want to play my hardest."

Engman says that much of the team's success comes from Porter's emphasis on the whole team. "She's never encouraged the singular stardom of one player and we are very much an entire company on the field." Frick adds that, "Nancy is eager to get our feedback and encourages our comments."

After growing up in Westmont, N.J., Porter attended Ursinus College (PA) where she received a B.S. in physical education. While an undergraduate her varsity hockey team only lost one game in four years and she played basketball and lacrosse as well receiving the outstanding athlete award.

She then earned an M.A. in guidance and counseling from Villanova University at night school while serving as the head lacrosse, basketball and field hockey coach at Lansdowne-Aldan High School near Philadelphia.

An avid golfer from the age of 12, Porter won the Philadelphia Amateur in 1978 and has played golf in the U.S. Open six times, finishing 30th of 150 players in 1976. Still, she prefers coaching a team sport.

"The most fulfilling thing in sports to me is to be a teacher of a team sport and kind of work on golf on my own time," she says. "I like the idea of the unit rather than the individual."

Porter joined the women's physical education staff in 1974 and the following year her team placed fourth in the first AIAW National Championship. Although the team is stronger now than it was then, that first national championship was a highlight experience.

"We always had a few really first class players but not a lot of depth," says Porter. "This year we have a few U.S. level players and many only a notch below. We have great potential but are a young team and need experience." Porter has many reasons to be optimistic despite the loss of Collegiate All-American Pixie Hamilton, former captain Claire Campbell, sweeper Peel Hawthorne and forward Sharra Kelly.

Frick will lead the team on defense at center halfback whole Engman will anchor left halfback. Seasoned senior Susan Shoaf will take over the sweeper position to help protect the goal area.

Sophomore Basia Deren returns at left inner from which she scored an awesome 26 goals and was named to the second team All-American at nationals last year. But, the biggest part of Porter's enthusiasm rests in a freshman class with "knowledge of field hockey far advanced for their years."

Karen Thorne of Medford, N.J., will join the attack at right wing. At 17 years of age, Thorne was one of the youngest players to be named to the U.S. Squad this past summer. Julie Duff, Meg Donahue, Chris Paradis, Jenny Lewis and Lisa Fuccella are also promising freshman.

While in 1979 the Indians were 18-4, outscoring their opponents 62-17, Porter says this year's edition will be faster and more threatening offensively. "We have people with both good speed and stickwork on the forward line," she says. "Our least experienced position will be the goalkeeping area, but we should have a very sound defense."



Of coming to William and Mary Porter says that, "This has been a great experience for me. As the team gets better and better it's a real challenge for me to keep the sport on the same philosophical level. I like coaching because I relate well to people and I love sports."

## Three Named To Receive Medallion

Duncan Cocke '32, John Morton '58, Richard Velz '36 Honored By Society

The Society of the Alumni will confer its coveted Alumni Medallion at Homecoming on Duncan M. Cocke '32, Williamsburg; John F. Morton Jr. '58, New Orleans, and Richard A. Velz '36, Richmond.

All three have distinguished themselves in their respective fields, and have extensive records of service to the College and to the Society.

The Alumni Medallion is given annually by the Society in recognition of service to the College and to community and nation. Only 162 Medallions have been conferred since the first Medallion was struck in 1933.

A 1937 graduate of the University of Virginia School of Law, Cocke retired as senior vice president of the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation in 1977 after a 39-year career with the organization including 30 years as vice president. Cocke served as secretary and trustee of the Williamsburg Community Hospital, as a trustee of the Williamsburg Area Memorial Center, as fund chairman for the Williamsburg James City County Community Fund, and as president of the Williamsburg Chamber of Commerce.

Cocke served on the Board of Directors of the Society from December 1955 to December 1958. He was vice president of the Society from December 1956 to December 1958. In 1960 he was co-chairman of the Williamsburg phase of the drive for funds to build a new College library. Cocke also served on the William and Mary School of Business Administration Advisory Board.

Cocke is married to Minnie Cole Savage Cocke '33. They formerly lived in the Bright House, which is now the Alumni House.

A New Orleans architect directing his own firm, Morton served on the Board of Directors of the Society from 1971 to 1977 and as vice president 1975-76. He authored the proposal for the Alumni House and served as the architect for its renovation and decoration. He

organized and served three terms as president of the New Orleans Alumni Chapter, and has also been a class agent for the William and Mary Fund.

A fine arts major at William and Mary, Morton also earned a degree in architecture from Tulane University, where he was the Henry Adams Fund Scholar and the recipient of the Alpha Rho Chi Medal. He is a member of numerous historic and preservation associations and an elder in his church. Morton is married to Betty Roney Chesson Morton '59.

Velz is a former journalist, business executive and management consultant who is the executive director and treasurer of the Medical College of Virginia Foundation. He retired in 1976 as vice president and director of public affairs of the A.H. Robins Company which he had joined in 1958.

Velz is a former correspondent for both Associated Press and United Press International and a former member of the editorial staff of the Richmond News Leader. He also served as production and program director for a Richmond radio station and as director of public relations at William and Mary.

Velz is a member of more than 30 business, professional and civic organizations. He has been honored with many awards including five Freedom Foundation Awards.



Quick now, how many of you have had a building named after you? This was the experience of Harold W. Ramsey on June 28, when the Franklin County School Board formally designated the original East Wing of Franklin County High School at Rocky Mount as "Ramsey Hall."

A considerable assemblage of family, friends and associates was present on the school lawn when Superintendent Cy Dillon made the dedication to Dr. Ramsey, who retired July 1, 1968, after over 40 years as superintendent.

A fellow Alumnus, Dr. Woodrow Wilkerson, retired superintendent of public instruction who served with Harold on the William and Mary Board of Visitors, made the principal address, paying tribute to the honoree for his half century of service to the schools of his native county.

Harold has been teacher and principal when he became superintendent to discover an incredible system of 149 schools, most of them one and two-room buildings scattered through the mountainous county.

With quiet, persuasive determination he set out to create a modern system of strategically located schools, capped by a central consolidated high school, dedicated in 1952 by then Gov. John Battle. I was present when an oil portrait of Harold was unveiled in the new building.

In 1958, following his eight years on the Board of Visitors, Harold was named by then Gov. J. Lindsay Almond, Jr., to serve on a state commission to study the entire educational system. Later he was chosen for two terms on the State Board of Education and in 1971 helped design the first set of Standards of Quality, which received General Assembly approval.

Harold has always been frank to say that William and Mary provided his inspiration in student days to press for accomplishment of the goals he ultimately achieved in the field of education. Plaques both inside and outside the high school will pay him tribute.

Today Harold lives in retirement at his old home, 325 Main Street, S.W., in Rocky Mount, watching the world go by but never allowing his interest in education to flag.

For those of you who refuse to read the obituary column, I must sadly note the passing of three well-known men of the class--Herbert Lawrence Ganter in Williamsburg August 20, William Bernard (Billy) Doyle in McKenney, Va., March 17 and Lloyd Quinby Hines, Sr. in Suffolk April 23. Herbert, or simply "Herb" to his friends,

Herbert, or simply "Herb" to his friends, was one of the true "brains" of the class, who went on to get his law degree from Marshall-Wythe in 1930, but never practiced law, instead devoting his life to historical research and the care and preservation of old books.

He had been secretary to a judge in his native Galveston, Tex., after schooling in Roman Catholic institutions. Of southwest German stock, he was a very private person in his years after college. For a number of years in the 1930's and 40's he was on the research staff of the Library of Congress in Washington and also served in the armed forces in World War II.

It was in 1948 that our beloved Dr. Earl G. Swem persuaded Herb to return to his alma mater as archivist in the Library. There he seemed content among his ancient books and documents, being considered a leading authority on William and Mary history as well as Colonial and 18th Century Virginia history. He was a steady contributor to the famed William and Mary Quarterly and was certainly a rare book authority.

Quite often it was Ganter who drew the assignment of playing host to important visitors from many countries seeking historical data. His courtesy will be well remembered by many. He is survived only by several cousins, among them Bishop B. J. Ganter of Beaumont, Tex. His immediate family had passed on during his college days.

Many of us can recall Herb as a reserved yet popular man on campus, invariably dressed in sweater and plus fours, a stack of newspapers or books under arm, but with ready smile, a keen sense of humor and a true scholar. He made Phi Beta Kappa in a breeze as well as ODK, Sigma Upsilon, the Flat Hat Society and Kappa Alpha. He preceded Frank Hopkins, one of his best friends, as editor of the Literary Magazine in 1925-26.

For some reason Herb never attended a class reunion or Homecoming activities, on such occasions just disappearing. Frank managed to find him occasionally but I saw him only once or twice although he served at the Library from 1948 until retirement in 1974. A stroke, following an operation, took him away.

I got the feeling that Herb resented William and Mary's tremendous physical growth and feared that somewhere along the line it was losing some of the values he cherished from student days in a small college he loved.

The high regard in which he was held is reflected in the award of the Alumni Medallion for service and loyalty to the College in 1968. The College community held a memorial service in Wren Chapel on August 27. Burial was in his native Galveston.

I have no details about **Billy Doyle's** passing but the news stirred my memories of a handsome little freshman who was loved by the whole campus. We missed him when he had to drop out.

Quinby Hines, on the other hand, became something of an institution within College. He played guard for four years on the football team, was business manager of *The Flat Hat* and of the Monogram Minstrels and held numerous other campus jobs.

He also found time to court and win a pretty coed from Roanoke, Elizabeth Jennings '29. They had three children, all of whom attended William and Mary--Sue, Anne and Quinby Jr., the latter nicknamed "Hadacol" for his uncanny ability to kick the football to set records in field goals and PATs.

A prime mover in the Educational Foundation, "Hoss," as he was known to teammates and other friends, sent many athletes to his alma mater and created a notable record as coach at Suffolk High during the 1930's. He was a charter member and board member of the Order of the White lacket.

Quinby retired in 1928 as president and general manager of the Ferguson Manufacturing Co. He was past president of the Rotary Club, "father" of the Peanut Bowl, an avid member of the Athletic Educational Foundation and regular attender of College athletic events until ill health overtook him. He bore his physical infirmities with great courage.

Besides his wife and children, Quinby leaves nine grandchildren, which is a class record, so far as I can ascertain.

The Suffolk News-Herald paid him high editorial tribute when it said: "Perhaps the most significant contribution to others was his direct contact with several hundred Suffolk High School athletes during a coaching career that spanned most of the years of the 1930's. And although there was a depression going on during many of those years, there was nothing depressing about his direct and continuing influence on the

young men and women who came his way-he gave of himself and of his abilities to improve the city by improving the minds, spirit and bodies of young people--Suffolk will miss him. He was loved by many and respected by all. . .a devoted husband, father and grandfather-he will be missed by a host of friends in many places whose lives have been enriched by knowing him."

I regret having to conclude this letter on such sad notes and will welcome communication of interesting personal news from all those of you out there who are shirking your duty to your classmates. By the time you read this Homecoming 1980 will be history. I'll try to "catch you up" on that in my next letter

#### **ENROLLMENT AT COLLEGE GROWS BY 100 STUDENTS**

Preliminary enrollment figures show that 6,484 students, including 4,607 undergraduates, are enrolled at William and Mary this year, an increase of about 100 students over last year. Registrar Charles Toomajian said the figures are "about what we expected." Of the graduate and professional students, 478 are in the law school, which moved into its new building this year. That is an increase of 31 over last year.

HERBERT LAWRENCE GANTER, '27 A.B., died August 20, 1980, in Williamsburg, following a brief illness. A member of PBK, ODK, the FHC Society, and Kappa Alpha, he was also editor of the Literary Magazine. He received his B.C.L. from W&M in 1930, and did graduate work at the New School of. ocial Research in New York City Georgetown University. During the 1930's and 1940's, he did much historical research for the College, providing many major contributions to the second series of the W&M Quarterly, while serving on the research staff of the Library of Congress. He handled many personal research assignments for Earl Gregg Swem, and at Swem's request, returned to the College as Archivist in 1948, holding that position until retirement in 1974. He was a recognized authority on rare books, Virginia genealogy, William and Mary history, 18th Century Virginia, and Colonial American history. He was actively involved in assisting overseas students to appreciate the historical and cultural heritage of his country, and in helping all members of the College community who enjoyed good music. In 1968, he was named a recipient of the Alumni Medallion.

LYDIA LEE DICKS (MULLOWNEY), '32 B.S., died in her sleep on August 21, 1980, at her home in Pasadena, California. A member of Kappa Alpha Theta, she earned her undergraduate degree in chemistry and then completed a course at Catherine-Gibbs School, in New York City. She worked for many years in the private New York offices of John D. Rockefeller, Sr. and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Lydia is survived by her former husband, Richard D. Mullowney, '31, two children, and five sisters.

MELVIN DOUGLAS BLUMEHTNAL, '33 A.B., died July 28, 1980, at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland, after a long illness. A Pi Lambda Phi at William and Mary, he graduated from Harvard Law School in 1936. He maintained a private law practice in his home town of Hartford, Connecticut until 1942, when he moved to Baltimore and began working for the Social Security Administration. An Assistant General Counsel to the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, he was instrumental in organizing Medicare, and in 1970 became associated with the Bureau of Health Insurance, which administered that program. In 1977, he retired as Acting Director of Program Policy. Active in religious and civic affairs, Melvin was a former member of the board and former president of the Brotherhood of the Baltimore Hebrew Congregation. He is survived by his widow, Evelyn, one son, and two daughters.

GEORGE LOUIS CARNER, '34 B.S., died June 20, 1980, in Virginia Beach, Virginia, of lung cancer. Louis was president of Theta Delta Chi, the Flight Club, 7 Society, and the 13 Club. He was manager of the baseball team, secretary and treasurer of the freshman class, and a member of the FHC Society, IFC, football team, freshman track team, YMCA, Cotillion Club, Alpha Psi, Athletic Council, International Relations Club, and the Monogram Club. He was also on the business staff for the Indian Handbook and the Literary Magazine. After a career in the construction business, Louis was a manufacturer's representative for architectural building products at the time of his death. In 1976, he gave to the College a collection of memorabilia of the W&M Flight Club circa 1930. Louis is survived by his widow, Elizabeth, and three children.

**SEYMOUR SIMERMAN**, '41 B.S., of Livermore, California, died of a heart attack on November 19, 1979. He received his M.D.

in 1944, from the Long Island College of Medicine, and spent his entire medical career within the Veterans Administration Hospital system. He was a member of the American College of Physicians, the American College of Chest Physicians, and the American Heart Association. He is survived by his wife, Roberta; a brother, Albert, '42; and two daughters.

THOMAS G. PAYNTER, '42 B.A., died August 21, 1980, in Weston, Connecticut, of a massive heart attack. A member of Phi Kappa Tau at William and Mary, Tom became the head buyer for Walden Books. A generous supporter of the College, Tom's most significant contribution was the Williamson Collection of Paleo-Indian artifacts, which is one of the three most outstanding such collections in the world, donated to the Anthropology Department. The Thomas G. Paynter Memorial Fund has been set up at William and Mary, and all gifts to the fund will be used to augment the Williamson Collection. Tom is survived by his widow and a daughter, Janice, '74.

THOMAS JOHN KEFALAS, '57, of Astoria, New York, died suddenly on July 20, 1980. He left William and Mary in 1955 to enlist in the Air Force. Later, he became a writer, working with Columbia Pictures, Cinerama, MGM, and other studios. He is survived by his mother, Mrs. Katherine Kefalas, of Astoria



## Alumni Giving Merits Coveted CASE Award

William and Mary's alumni, excited about the challenge offered by the final year of the Campaign for the College, increased their giving enough during 1978-79 to win a coveted national award for outstanding performance.

The U.S. Steel Corporation and the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) recently named William and Mary the second Grand Award winner in the improvement category for alumni giving among all competing colleges and universities in the nation. CASE officials credited the College's success to the combined efforts of alumni volunteers, development staff and the general alumni body

of the College. The College accepted the second highest award, as well as a \$2000 grant, at the CASE Annual Assembly held this summer in Detroit. The grant, although unrestricted, has been assigned by President Thomas A. Graves, Jr., for faculty salaries, the current highest priority for new gifts. The College's impressive giving record outdistanced the records of all but one of the 279 institutions who were finalists in the alumni giving improvement competition. During 1978-79, the final year of the three-year Campaign for the College, 8,104 alumni contributed \$631,620 to annual funds at the

College, and a total of \$1,004,624 to the College through all channels. In a single year, alumni participation increased by 1346 donors, and the average gift increased from \$71.99 to \$77.94

Harriet Nachman Storm, former president of the Society of the Alumni, served as national chairman of the William and Mary Fund during the 1978-79 drive, and Gilbert Granger served as president of the Athletic Educational Foundation. Both funds showed tremendous improvement during the 1978-79 fiscal year, breaking all previous records for alumni fundraising.

"There's no doubt that this was a breakthrough type of year for the College," said James C. Rees, director for annual support. "The enthusiasm generated in '78-'79 has been carried through since then, and should continue to increase in the days to come."

Storm was succeeded by Bill and Jane Smith at the helm of the William and Mary Fund in 1979-80, and again the fund set a record for both money raised and number of contributors. James Ukrop, president of the AEF, led a similarly successful campaign to support the intercollegiate sports program.

## William and Mary Fund Nears Magic \$400,000 Mark

## Big Increase in W&M Fund Helps Alumni Support Near Million

Alumni contributed close to \$1 million to the College for the second consecutive year during 1979-80, inspiring a total of \$2,165,014 in gifts to William and Mary.

Although somewhat below the record pace of 1978-79, the final year of the Campaign for the College, William and Mary did see signs of enthusiastic response from the general alumni body and from parents of students.

The official total for the William and Mary Fund, after all calculations, edged ever-so-close to \$400,000, finalizing at \$396,000, far and away the highest total ever, and some \$41,000 above the 1978-79 total. President Thomas A. Graves, Jr., noted again "the outstanding leadership of Bill and Jane Smith, two alumni we can all be extremely proud to call our own."

In addition, the 1979-80 William and Mary Fund closed with the highest number of gifts and the greatest number of contributors to any annual fund in the history of the College.

"The volunteer support of alumni during this drive inspired a new sense of enthusiasm, a new feeling of togetherness, a new optimism for the future," said Jim Rees '74, Director for Annual Support. "We have every reason to believe that as far as support from our alumni is concerned, the eighties will indeed be our best and mightiest years yet."

The total of \$2,165,014 for 1979-80 consists of cash or properties in hand and includes no pledges, testamentary commitments, or government grants.

By categories, the College received \$386,870 from corporations and business concerns; \$70,029 from

parents; \$286,719 from foundations; \$16,121 from other groups; and \$474,180 from individual friends of the

College. Contributors specified that \$1,397,897 should be used for current operations, and \$767,117 should be

used for capital purposes, either to boost the College's endowment or for new facilities.

## Foundations Contribute \$286,719 To Support College

Foundations from across the nation contributed \$286,719 to the College during 1979-80, primarily to support educational programs at William and Mary. Other organizations contributed gifts amounting to \$16,121.

Although many foundation by-laws restrict gifts to private universities, colleges in certain geographical areas, or institutions which possess particular programs, William and Mary is eligible for gifts from a number of important foundations.

Associate Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Sciences David Kranbuehl works closely with faculty members to investigate principle needs of the College, possible foundation sources for needed funds, and in preparing proposals. S. Dean Olson, director of university publications, recently assumed the duties for foundation relations in the university advancement office, and will work closely with Kranbuehl in the days ahead.



# Duane Dittman Assumes Helm As Advancement Office Settles Down After Staff Changes

After over a year of extensive personnel changes, a move from one building to another, and a major regrouping following the end of the Campaign for the College, the Office of University Advancement is settled in and moving ahead at nearly full speed.

Duane A. Dittman, a veteran development professional who formerly headed offices at St. Lawrence University and Davidson, assumed the new position of Vice President for University Advancement in July. For the first time, the Development Office and Communications Office were united under one administration.

Ross Weeks, Jr., continues to serve as Assistant to the President and Director of University Communications, supervising an experienced staff in the publications, public information and special events areas.

Three alumni of the College serve as directors of development areas under Dittman: Robert Dutro '69 JD, director for estate planning; Jim Rees '74, director for annual support and corporate relations; and Jeffery Shy '72, director for development services. A search is still on for a fourth director in charge of capital gifts.

S. Dean Olson, director of university publications, has assumed additional duties in the area of foundation

The focal point of the current development activities of the College remains meeting the NEH challenge. The College must raise \$1.5 million from private sources to support the humanities programs at the College in a three year period in order to "earn" \$500,000 from NEH. The College got off to an impressive start during the first qualifying year, and has already earned \$200,000 of the NEH Challenge.

A special NEH Task Force of dedicated alumni, friends and faculty met on the campus last spring, working to outline a "plan of attack" to meet the challenge.

The 1980-81 William and Mary Fund drive has emphasized the importance of the NEH Challenge and mail solicitations have explained that new or increased gifts can be applied toward the challenge.





## Class of '44 To Receive **Board Trophy for** Outstanding **Fundraising**

The Classes of 1944, 1929, and 1964 showed dramatic improvement and outstanding fundraising performances during the 1979-80 William and Mary Fund campaign, winning the first competitive giving awards ever presented by the Society of Alumni.

All three classes were celebrating a reunion year in 1979.

The Class of 1944 is the first recipient of the Board of Directors Award for all-round improved performance. It increased participation from 98 to 109 of its 280 members, moving to just under 39 percent participation, one of the highest rates among all classes. Last year's reunion drive had heavy-hitter leadership: John and Marily Miller Entwisle served as reunion drive chairman for the Fund, and Bill Smith was national cochairman of the drive. In addition, Nancy Foster and Sunny Williams headed a drive to build a patio behind the Alumni House.

The Class of '29 experienced the largest percentage of increase in class participation, jumping from 28 to 33 percent, to receive the Class of '54 Trophy for spiritual alumni participa-

The Class of 1964 experienced a whopping increase in dollars given, moving from \$4,854 to \$7,038 in a single year, to win the Class of '25 award for percentage increase in giving. Participation also increased from 24 to 27.5 percent, and the average gift rose from \$29.72 to \$37.84. The special mail campaign for 1964 was chaired by Jackie Crebbs of Williamsburg.

The competition for the first alumni giving awards was extremely stiff, reports Jim Rees '74, director for annual support. During a year when overall giving and alumni participations improved so greatly, it's apparent that the increases were spread through a large number of classes. This shows that our network of volunteers is coming on strong, and that we can expect still greater improvement in the future.'

Other classes which turned in outstanding performances in at least one category were 1926, 1935, 1940, 1945, 1949, 1953, 1969 and 1970.
