College Pays Tribute To The Governor

Burgesses Day 1981 Serves As An Occasion To Honor Governor Dalton '53

Burgesses Day 1981 served as a reminder of just how important a role alumni of the College have played in the life of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

About 350 state officials, legislators, alumni and friends of the College attended the festivities Sept. 12 which commemorated the historic

bonds between the Commonwealth and William and Mary.

Governor John N. Dalton '53 attended Burgesses Day -- his last during his term as Governor of Virginia -- and reminded the audience that he is the 21st alumnus of William and Mary to serve in the Governorship. A third of all Virginia governors have been alumni of the College.

Dalton added that much has changed in higher education since he graduated from William and Mary.

"Most people have no conception of what is happening" in higher education. In 1953, he noted, about 24,000 students attended state-supported colleges and universities, but today over 230,000 students are enrolled.

President Graves paid tribute to Dalton as "an alumnus (who has) brought great honor to your college." He said one of the great hallmarks of the Dalton administration, which will end in January, has been "its emphasis on fiscal responsibility and efficiency." He said Dalton had "worked diligently to maintain the

standards of quality of higher education" during his term.

"In your administration," said Graves "Virginia has risen from 15th to 11th in the ranking of states in terms of general fund appropriations for higher education. On a per capital expenditure basis, we have risen from 32nd to 24th."

In his remarks, Society President John H. Garrett Jr. '40, noted the importance of Burgesses Day as a tradition at William and Mary.

"Custom and tradition give meaning and purpose to nations, cultures and organizations," Garrett said. "The Society of the Alumni is no exception. Though separate and independent of the College, the Society has been supportive of the College, and sometimes critical, for 139 years.

"Our members have been a credit to our Country, to the Commonwealth, and to our College, far beyond what could be expected of our numbers. We are proud that this tradition continues, as witnessed by the presence of our alumni among the special guests today."

College Awarded \$750,000 Grant

Kenan Foundation Gift To Establish Humanities Professorship

A nationally-prominent foundation has given the College a \$750,000 grant to enhance one of the long-time cornerstones of William and Mary's academic program--the humanities.

The grant from the William R. Kenan Jr. Charitable Trust of New York City ranks as the largest gift from a national foundation in the history of the College. "This is a magnificent source of inspiration to all of us who believe in William and Mary," said President Thomas A. Graves Jr., who announced the gift at the first meeting of the faculty for the 1981-82 year.

The gift will establish the William R. Kenan Jr. Professorship Fund under the auspices of the Endowment Association. The annual income from the new fund will support the Kenan Distinguished Professorship in the humanities with the primary purpose of encouraging excellence in teaching at the undergraduate level.

The Kenan Professorship will be occupied annually by "a visiting professor with a preeminent reputation," according to President Graves.

"The award will hold innumerable benefits for the academic program at William and Mary in the years to come," President Graves said. "This

is one of the outstanding grants for the support of undergraduate teaching in American education. It is with a great deal of pride that we join the family of distinguished colleges and universities favored by the Kenan Trust's splendid professorship endowments."

Since 1965, when the Kenan Trust was established, the foundation has funded 86 professorships at 54 leading colleges and universities. Included in the list of other universities which have received Kenan grants are Harvard, Cornell, Columbia, Dartmouth, Stanford, Yale, Princeton, Duke, the University of North Carolina, of which Mr. Kenan was an alumnus, and the University of Virginia. Colonial Williamsburg recently received a \$500,000 grant from the Kenan Trust to strengthen its educational offerings.

Mr. Kenan was a prominent North Carolina chemist, engineer, industrialist, executive, and philanthropist who died in 1965. For some 40 years he was president of the Flagler Systems Company. The Kenan Charitable Trust established by his will has traditionally aided education, primarily through the establishment of Kenan endowed professorships of distinction to support excellence in teaching at the undergraduate level.

Mr. Kenan felt so strongly about the importance of education that he stated in his will, "I have always believed firmly that a good education is the most cherished gift an individual can receive, and it is my sincere hope that the provisions of this article will result in a substantial benefit to mankind."

President Graves said the College hopes to receive matching funds as a result of the Kenan Trust gift, in part through the Eminent Scholars Program of the Commonwealth of Virginia, which has a formula for matching income from private endowments for faculty salaries. The College will receive its grant by Dec. 15, 1981, in time to establish the Kenan Professorship for the 1982-83 academic year.

Although the grant from the Kenan Trust will fund a single position on the William and Mary faculty, it will undoubtedly touch the lives of many current and future students. Courses in the humanities continue to be extremely popular among William and Mary students. Virtually every student, whether majoring in the humanities, the sciences or business, will elect to take a number of the courses in the humanities.

The Kenan grant also helps to answer the College's number one priority need--the enhancement of faculty salaries, which rank near the bottom of the nation's colleges and universities.

"William and Mary's ability to continue to recruit and retain superior teacher-scholars is critical to the maintenance and enhancement of our mission in liberal education," said President Graves.

The new Kenan Professorship will hopefully attract some of the nation's most accomplished teachers, representing a variety of areas related to the humanities program.

The College community knows well the benefits of having a prestigious professorship designed to attract preeminent scholars. Since it was created in 1969, the James Pinckney Harrison Visiting Professorship of History has been held by some of the nation's most respected historians. The wide variety of Harrison Professors has been equally impressive. Several have been established veterans, while others visited the College during the most challenging periods of their careers. The Harrison Professor is also asked to present a special series of public lectures during his or her stay at the College.

College Moves On Cary

Architects Named To Study Best Approach

William and Mary has moved a step further down the road in the planned expansion of Cary Field Stadium.

The College announced in late August that it had employed the Lynchburg architectural firm of Wiley and Wilson, Inc., to conduct a pre-construction study of a phase I expansion that would bring the permanent seating capacity to approximately 20,500. It is anticipated that Phase I will continue the use of temporary end zone seating of 6,000 bring total seating capacity to 26,500.

The study, which will take from 90 to 120 days, will result in recommendations on how best to proceed with the expansion, taking into consideration costs, environmental impact, parking and traffic, and other matters.

Phase I of the expansion will consist of adding 11,500 permanent seats to the west side of the stadium, according to James Copeland, men's athletic director, who serves as chairman of a College building advisory committee which is in charge of the overall planning.

The Board of Visitors approved the expansion in 1978 and the General Assembly and the appropriate Commonwealth of Virginia offices gave the go-ahead in 1980, provided that the expansion is paid for from private gifts. The College has announced no donors to the project.

The pre-construction study, which will cost \$24,500, will be paid for from the Athletic Reserve Fund which consists of surplus funds generated by revenue sports at the College.

When the College announced the project in 1978, it drew opposition from elements of the College and the community. Factions at the College

objected because, among other reasons, they felt it would draw money away from academics and endanger the academic program if football became too "big-time" as a result.

Copeland reiterated the original Board of Visitors statement, that William and Mary has no intentions of promoting big-time football. With the exception of 1 or 2 games each year against such opponents as LSU, Georgia, UNC, and Penn State, the College will continue to play its traditional rivals while building new rivalries with Ivy League schools and other east coast and southern teams.

Copeland noted that the expanded stadium would enable the College to attempt to bring to campus teams such as VPI, Maryland, Virginia and which will not play at William and Mary now because of the limited seating capacity.

Such home games would enable the College to develop a broader revenue base to support the athletic program. Copeland said that without the expansion, the College has few other sources to draw on to meet the rising costs of the extensive inter-collegiate athletic program at the College.

The planned expansion drew protests from some community residents who felt that the larger stadium would be aesthetically incongruent with the Colonial Williamsburg surroundings and would generate traffic congestion and parking problems.

Copeland said the pre-construction study would take those concerns into consideration. He noted that the architects, Wiley and Wilson, had worked previously in Williamsburg with both the College and Colonial Williamsburg and were familiar with the "unique nature and traditions" of the Williamsburg community.

Letters To The Editor

Editor:

The recent article by Fred L. Frechette in the July, August, 1981, issue of the *Alumni Gazette* of the College of William and Mary brought back memories of my own experience in the War Worker Program, and I must say I tremendously enjoyed Fred's account. Although there were both pluses and minuses in the program from my point of view, on the whole, I regard the program as one of the more productive experiences of my life. I remember the thrill sustained in hearing about the program from an old friend -- Jack Carter, a student at William and Mary at that time. I passed the information onto Dusty Ash and we both immediately joined the program.

The bus trip to William and Mary was almost my first trip of more than fifty miles from Clarksburg, West Virginia. I was thrilled because I was removed from a totally dead end situation in Clarksburg. Sitting on the front seat of the bus to Williamsburg, I savored every moment.

The hard work at the Naval Mine Depot was a shock. The work was very hard at first. What really bothered me was the dirt and grease associated with some of those first jobs. The work shifted a little later to work in the Mine Assembly Plant and sometimes the loading of the TNT. I actually enjoyed both, but particularly the loading of the TNT boxes. I took pride in being able to physically handle those boxes hour after hour. There were also some 120 pound boxes that required two people to load and stack. The handling of these always gave me a sense of teamwork and camaraderie.

There were days at the Mine Assembly Plant where, for some reason, we all set out to make a record, and on those days we would turn out twice and normal produc-

tion. There were other days when I felt somewhat guilty because as a group we sorta loafed on the job and gave our work supervisors an unnecessarily hard time.

The cold weather later on was found to be unpleasant, and I must admit I was pleased when I was shifted to the Travis House. Shortly after that I was called into the C Premeteorology Program of the Air Force and sent to the University of Virginia.

The food never bothered me and, in fact, I thought the dining room food was exceptionally plentiful and satisfying. In fact, I wondered how the college could possibly serve us so well. The classes were exciting, the weekly dances were fun and I used to greatly enjoy leisurely Sunday afternoon walks throughout the town of Williamsburg.

I don't recall even being too short of money, although one of the major factors that caused me to go into the C program was uncertainty as to whether the money would be sufficient to carry on. I was not aware that there was mass discontent in the War Work Program. I thought that my dissatisfactions were unique with me. The crowded rooms did bother me.

As I look back, however, I realize how totally unaware I was of what was going on. I was not aware that there was any danger in the Mine Assembly Plant or in the handling of the TNT boxes.

All in all, I look back on my experience at William and Mary with fondness. The program gave me a unique opportunity to get started in a college career and I have always been grateful for that opportunity.

Updates By-Laws, Awards Medallions, Meets With College Representatives

A number of significant actions were taken by the Board of Directors of the Society at its three day semi-annual meeting September 10-12.

A self study being chaired by Dr. Henry Wilde '53 of Houston and extensive reports were received from all board members who have been assigned specific responsibilities in relation to the self-study. The study deals with the mission and function of the Society.

As noted by Bob Land '34, from Alexandria: "We must continue to explore, and find, ways for alumni to be of help to the College." Marvin West '53, Vice President, said "The Board is concerned with identifying both staffing needs and staff support and Society impact on alumni. Alumni views are being sought on all levels of Society activity."

The Board of Directors of the Society has approved a number of housekeeping by-law changes which are indicated in italics on page 11. Any alumnus desiring a copy of the entire current by-laws should contact the Alumni Office.

Alumni Medallions were awarded to Dr. William Bickers '29 of Richmond; Mark H. McCormack '51 of Cleveland; Harriet Nachman Storm '64 of Newport News and James E. Ukrop '59 of Richmond. Presentation of the medallion for service and loyalty, the Society's highest honor, will take place at the annual meeting, Nov. 6.

Associate membership was approved for "Mama and Pappa Steve" Sacalis of Williamsburg, Miss Rebecca Tinker of Williamsburg, and Mrs. Thomas A. Graves Jr. of Williamsburg.

The Baltimore/Annapolis chapter was recognized with the Outstanding Chapter Award. Honorable mention was given to perennial contender Georgia and to the Northern Virginia Chapter.

The Board recognized annual giving awards, instituted by the Society, which are awarded for outstanding effort in the William and Mary Fund, the annual giving solicitation among alumni. The Board of Directors Trophy, for best overall performance, will go to the Class of 1940, as will the Class of 1954 trophy, for the highest increase in percentage of

class participation. The Class of 1938 will receive the Class of 1925 trophy for the greatest percentage increase in dollars contributed. The Board accepted a trophy to be given by the Baltimore/Annapolis Alumni Chapter, to be awarded to an individual who makes a particularly significant gift in any given year to the William and Mary Fund. The Board lauded the efforts of Marilyn and John Entwisle '44, chairpersons of the 1980-81 Fund. Mrs. Entwisle is a current member of the Board of Directors.

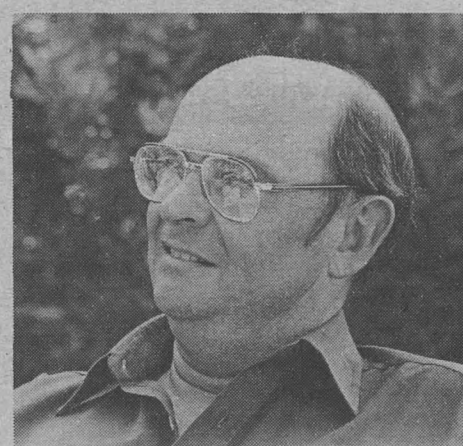
The Board met with a number of College administrators to discuss mutual programs. They included Harriet Reid in Career Counseling; Stan Brown and Bob Hunt of the Placement Office; Assistant Dean of Admissions Karen Schoenenburger '66, who outlined the Alumni Leadership Conference on Alumni Admissions Network training which is a pilot program in five areas designed to aid in recruiting and interviewing prospective students; Dr. Zeddie Bowen, new Dean of the Faculty; Jim Copeland, Director of Athletics for Men; Duane Dittman,

Vice President for University Advancement; and President Graves.

The Student Alumni Liaison Committee met with the College Relations Committee and later with the entire Board. This newly formed group, appointed by Senior Class President Lauri Brewer, and composed of four seniors, two juniors and two sophomores, will work with the Society to establish closer contacts between the Society and the student body, and to find ways to help meet student interests. Full endorsement and increased budgets were given to the Life After Dog Street program and the Career Exploration Day sponsored by the Society, which assist students.

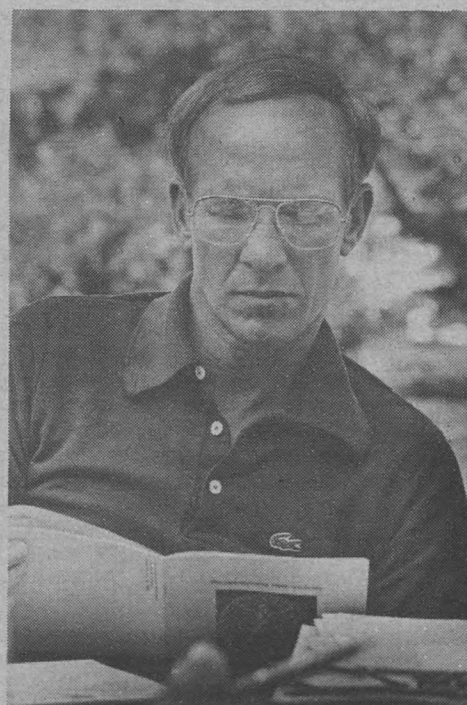

Women's Soccer: The Newest Varsity Sport

New Coach, Varsity Status Give It "The Right Ingredients" For A Major Sport

Coach John Charles is calling it the "next great major sport for women," while vice-captain Lori Okerstrom stresses the prestige of being one of the first colleges in Virginia to sponsor a varsity team.

It's women's soccer at William and Mary, an action-packed game which now boasts all the trimmings of a varsity sport: uniforms, priority on practice fields and water jugs provided by the athletic trainer.

After demonstrating interest and participation for five years as a club sport, the President's office granted the team varsity status last January. The 30 women who showed up for tryouts this year were enthusiastic, and 24 of them are now calling themselves "the varsity."

Charles is confident that his women will contribute to the growing success of the sport.

"Soccer has all the right ingredients to be a great sport," he says. "It's fast, exciting and entertaining. Both men and women can play and unlike many other sports, it requires all facets of fitness. . . balance, agility, speed and flexibility."

After coaching the junior varsity tennis team last year, Charles will turn his full attention to soccer this fall. He has previously worked with women's soccer teams at Wellesley College and the University of Oregon. As a player, Charles competed on school teams in England, was selected to the Oregon Southern

All-Star team, and currently plays midfield for a local Williamsburg Club.

Charles boasts a B-level license from the United States Soccer Foundation (USSF), an honor he says is harder than "gold dust" to come by. Certification requires over ten hours of exams in addition to advanced degrees, which Charles holds, having earned a teacher's certificate in English and Physical Education from the University of Oregon. He will lend his expertise to the Virginia AIAW State Soccer Committee this year as chairman.

While little leaguers used to grow up on football fields, the few foreign kids that filtered into American school systems were the only ones who had played a different kind of football--with a round black and white ball, not a pigskin. When Okerstrom was growing up, there wasn't an opportunity to play and learn the skills of soccer--for men or women. Now, however, with the headstart that youth soccer programs provide, Okerstrom marvels, "Some of the freshmen and younger players are really good."

Experience is the key for college teams too. The schools that have already invested the time and money to develop soccer, like Duke and North Carolina (Chapel Hill), are the ones that are producing quality teams.

William and Mary joins Hollins, Radford and Randolph-Macon with varsity squads in Virginia while

Richmond, Mary Washington, Old Dominion, Virginia and James Madison compete on a club basis. The Indians will complete their first season by participating in the first

AIAW National Soccer Championship at North Carolina.

In the team's first varsity game, William and Mary defeated the University of Richmond 5-1.

College Invites Suggestions For Sports Honor

Nominations are now being accepted for the William and Mary Athletic Hall of Fame. Induction of new members will be January 23, 1982.

Jim Copeland, athletic director at William and Mary, has provided the following criteria for membership in the Hall of Fame:

1) It shall be open to persons who have made a significant contribution to the College through intercollegiate athletics, as a competitor, coach, or administrator.

2) Consideration will also be given to continued contributions to society through community activities, through performance in chosen fields of endeavor and through

avocations, on such a level as to bring credit and distinction to the College.

3) In order that proper assessment may be made of the nominee, a time period of at least 10 years must have elapsed since graduation for a competitor and at least 5 years for a coach or administrator.

4) No more than 8 persons and no more than one team will be inducted annually.

Alumni who wish to make a nomination should fill out the ballot below and return it to: Athletic Hall of Fame Committee, Box 399, Williamsburg, Va. 23187, no later than October 30, 1981.

The Day Suey Eason '28 Beat Yale

In The Golden Age When Baseball Was King, An Historic Homerun Ruled The Day

*"We beat Lafayette and Lehigh, too
And now we'll beat Old Yale
And twist the Tiger's tail."*

William and Mary has had its "Great Moments in Sports." It has had, and still has, its heroes. Some are better remembered, and re-remembered, than others. One episode to especially savor needs to be dusted off for in its time it was a shining hour. It happened, too, in the Golden Age of Sports--the 1920s. This one happened in 1927, the first of the season, in April.

The story about "Suey" Eason and his historic homer might well be titled "The Day James Merrill, of William and Mary, Bested Frank Merriwell of Yale."

James Merrill is our own James Merrill "Suey" Eason '28.

Frank Merriwell was the brain-child of Gilbert Patten, who wrote under the pen name of Burt L. Standish.

In fact and fiction there were giants. In real life, there were the talked-about "names" -- Ty Cobb, Walter Johnson, Babe Ruth, Jack Dempsey, Red Grange, Jim Thorpe, Christy Mathewson, Home Run Baker, Knute Rockne. In collegiate ranks, Yale, Harvard and Princeton were still regarded among the "kings of the mountain."

In fiction, in dime and half-dime novels issued weekly and for which millions of boys "could hardly wait" there were the Merriwells, first Frank, and then a hitherto unknown half-brother Dick. Both played every sport for Yale.

In those days baseball ranked high as a collegiate sport, along with football. Basketball was played, but it did not rate as it does today. There was Big League, and minor league, baseball. Professional football and basketball? Hardly ever a dream. Radio was coming on, and television only a vision, pardon the expression.

Baseball, including college games, drew crowds, and there was one out at old Cary Field, on an early April day 54 years ago. The drama all but tells itself.

It was 1927, a year for which William and Mary had scheduled six baseball games home and home, with Yale, Harvard and Princeton, opening with Yale on the old pre-stadium Cary field. It was a first-ever game at home against any of the Ivy Big Three.

If this account carries before reaching the climax, remember, so did the game. It did not end until there were two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning. Insofar as William and Mary folk were concerned, it started building up as soon as the game was scheduled.

In 1923 William and Mary had had its first crack at any of the Ivy Big Three, Harvard. Playing in Richmond, the Indians won, 14 to 0, with freshman Bob Safelle '26 pitching a six-hit shutout, and wee Joseph "Scrap" Chandler '24 hitting two home runs, a double and a single. (One record says two doubles.) Last time up he drew a wall "Scrap" made five putouts and an assist from the outfield. He always said, to his dying day, that that game was his most memorable

of many athletic contests. William and Mary not only embarrassed Harvard, in 1923, but finally whopped the University of Virginia, 17 to 6, much to the satisfaction of all, including William and Mary's personification of a Virginia gentleman and coach, Jimmy Driver '09, in his last coaching year. Another high point in 1923 was Indian Pitcher Curt Thompson's '27, no-hit blanking of Amherst.)

Most every lad in the first third of the 20th Century had a dream of winning a home game with a home run in the bottom of the ninth inning. Frank and Dick Merriwell did it in their dime novels.

It was to happen in real life, for James Merrill "Suey" Eason, '28, against the Merriwell's Eli's. The campus had been ringing with the ditty:

"We beat Lafayette and Lehigh, too.

And now we'll beat Old Yale --and twist the Tiger's tail."

It was both inspiring and prophetic. Alumni and townspeople caught the students' excitement.

No rooster for the Indians was more excited than Dr. J. A. C. Chandler '19, president of William and Mary. This I know, for when I was working in the press office, on the first floor of Brafferton, beneath his, he would see the publicity worth of William and Mary playing Harvard, and other "name" schools. His foresight and backing had much to do with contacts and scheduling.

Now come inside the game with "Suey" recruiting:

"The Elis were tough and led 2 to 1 as the Indians came to bat in the ninth. Two Indians were quickly subdued by Pitcher Sawyer (a Yaleman with a national reputation).

"His wicked curve ball seemed to start at third base and end up on Richmond Road. (Was Sawyer the embodiment of Writer Patten's brain-child, Frank and Dick Merriwell. Frank had startled the collegiate baseball world with his famous "double-shoot," a pitch curving twice in different directions before piercing the strike zone at home plate. Dick hurled a "jump ball" that rose a foot just before crossing the plate. An "up-shoot," in contrast to a "drop."

On with Eason's account:

"With two outs recorded and no one on base, "Spud" Bloxom '29 was awarded first base when a pitch nicked his wrist. An infield tap put the batter on first behind Bloxom on second, the tying and winning runs.

"And there we were.

"Suddenly my thoughts became very sober, indeed. ("Suey" - that must be a prime understatement.)

"Certainly Someone Above seemed to be smiling on us. But could we expect another such break?

"A moment earlier I was begging for just one more swing. Now that it was assured--I wasn't so sure--and the odds became a personal factor. I had garnered two hits off Sawyer already and I knew he was worried.

But the situation required one more hit.

" 'STAY LOOSE, STAY LOOSE' a little voice from within kept repeating.

"Pitcher Sawyer did not duck the issue. Never in college baseball had I seen three more vicious curve balls thrown to a batter. But each was too wide. By this time fellow students were all over the place, even on the base line. The other players, coaches and managers were standing on the bench. Bedlam reigned. Three balls and no strikes. I wanted permission to swing at the next pitch if it was over by the coaches could not see me. Strangely, out of the Latin classroom came a thought of Caesar: 'The die is cast?'

"Then came the pitch. The bat met the ball on dead center and it took off. Before I left home plate I knew it was 'gone.' Away it soared high above the Eli fielders. Someone spotted its landing site. It was a measured 478 feet from home plate.

"The ball was recovered and presented to me. It now rests in the Alumni Hall with other sports memorabilia."

It is a reminder, too, of the year William and Mary broke even with Yale, Harvard and Princeton in six close games, the final a victory over the Tigers at Princeton.

Indian pitching ace in the series was Jimmy Wallace '30, out of Norfolk's Maury, when he and Eason, (South Norfolk) were high school rivals. His record on the mound against the Ivy Leaguers gained widespread attention.

Sawyer and the Elis, with the game on Cary field in 1927, had not seen the last of "Suey" and his bat. In the game at Yale, "Sawyer led us, 3 to 1, and had two outs in the ninth. At that point I connected with a fast one, which, according to their coach "Smoky Joe" Wood (former ace for the Cleveland Indians) traveled farther than the homer in Williamsburg.

"The oddity here was that it was only a triple. Coach Wilder Tasker stopped me at third, figuring that this might disturb Sawyer. Mac Zion singled and I scored but Zion was left stranded, and we lost 3-2."

"I enjoyed playing Yale," Eason reflects. In 1928, playing the Elis again in Williamsburg, he hit yet another home run, William and Mary winning by two runs. The ball rolled into the yard of the Bright House, now the home of the Alumni Society.

But it was the 1927 Victory-over-Yale ball that made it all the way into the house--after the passing of 54 years.

"It was my greatest thrill in sports," says Eason.

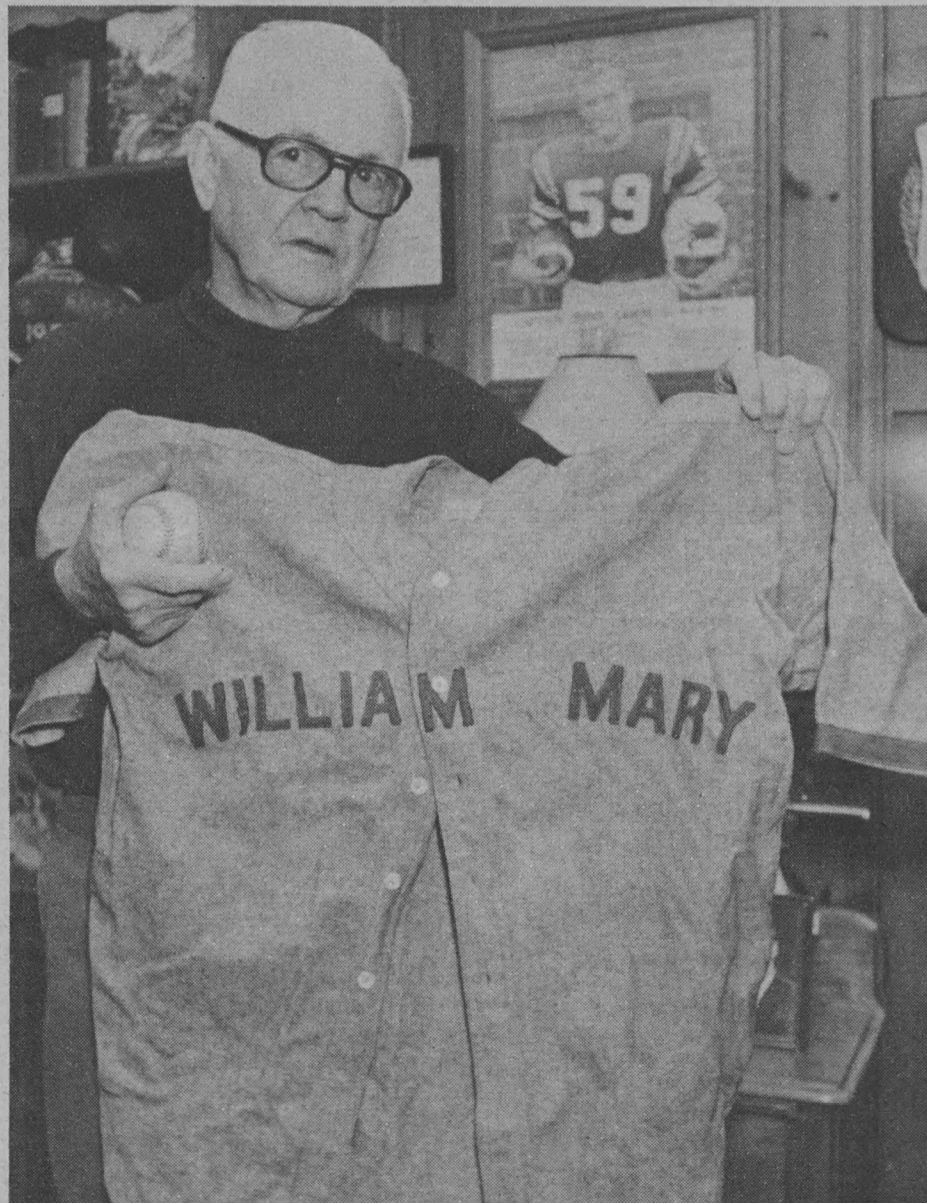
"Even greater than when he scored William and Mary's first ever touchdown against Harvard?" (He caught a Rosy Ryan pass to score, and did it again, the latter called back, questionably.)

"Yes"--and "Suey" says it emphatically.

A Disciplined, Organized Scholar

Drop A Pencil, Lose A Century In Fowler's History 101-102

Some fondly referred to him as "Little Napoleon," and he did indeed look up to many of the students who entered his classroom. Yet Harold Lees Fowler, for 40 years the hallmark of strong, solid teaching at the College, was a very big man.

This slight, orderly professor did not seek to be a father figure to the hundreds of students who passed through his classrooms. His image was one of the disciplined, organized scholar, intent upon getting the job done. That he did this job--the teaching of history--so consistently well was inspiring to his colleagues as well as to his students. No one individual on campus offered advice that was more carefully considered or rendered decisions that were more widely respected. It can truly be said that his mark on the College was a lasting one, and his influence on his students remains vividly alive.

Fowler joined the College faculty as an assistant professor in 1934, fresh from the halls of Harvard's prestigious graduate school. As one of President John Stewart Bryan's bright young "imports," Fowler taught four different courses during his first semester. One of his favorites was History 101-102, which he continued to teach for 30 years, establishing the course as one of the most popular in William and Mary history.

Ludwell Johnson, professor of history and a longtime colleague of Fowler, called this whirlwind tour of the history of Europe "a pillar of the curriculum."

"The standards were high, the organization was superb, and the lectures were delivered in Dr. Fowler's incomparable style," Johnson noted in a tribute to Fowler. "It was not only an introduction to European history, it was an introduction to a college education."

The many students who survived the rigors of History 101-102--the enrollment at one time exceeded 500 per semester--had learned to tackle problems, to concentrate with a scholarly intensity, and to write clearly, concisely and creatively.

But it wasn't without a great deal of effort. Fowler was a taskmaster, a tough disciplinarian who set "marvelously exacting standards," remembered Thad Tate, another colleague of Fowler and the current director of the Institute of Early American History and Culture.

Fowler placed a tremendous responsibility on the shoulders of the individual student. "He developed character in his students, largely by his personal example," recalled Bruce McCully, professor of history emeritus, who shared an office with his close friend Jimmy Fowler from 1940-43.

Fowler was a classic lecturer. He never talked down to his students, yet made certain his delivery was concise and orderly. History seemed to pass quickly in the hands of Fowler, and rumor has it that the student who was clumsy enough to drop a pencil might miss a century of European events.

The Great Professors

The result of such an error could be costly. Fowler believed in weekly quizzes, and the student who fell behind often never caught up.

Upon his retirement, Fowler noted that "lecturing to large numbers had a very definite appeal to me. It was in that way that I got to know so many students and why I know so many alumni today."

Fowler's students do indeed remember him well--he made a strong first impression and usually a lasting one.

"I can recall that I was somewhat afraid of him my freshman year," said David C. Titus '58, who took virtually every course Fowler taught, even though he majored in English. "He was known as a tough grader, and he was certainly not a gladder or back-slapper."

Yet Fowler's office was seldom empty during prescribed visiting hours, and Titus remembers spending a number of Saturday afternoons reliving European history with the master. "We talked for hours on the underlying causes of World War I, which was his thesis topic at Harvard."

In class, the communication was primarily one-way. Fowler talked, students listened. Even in the confines of his office, Fowler maintained his businesslike approach. Yet he loved to argue a point with a genuinely interested student, and he encouraged worthwhile questions.

"He had an amazing insight into human character," said Randall T. Bell '67, whom Fowler convinced to be a history major. "He had a special knack for cutting through things to the heart of the matter."

Fowler himself readily admitted that his true love was teaching. Yet the man possessed a marvelous intellect, and few of his colleagues doubt that Fowler could have been a successful author. "He had an amazing steel-trap mind and a mastery of factual detail," recalled Tate.

Fowler also breathed life into the facts, analyzing the human side of history. "He often said that any good historian had to have prejudices," said Titus. "And he certainly did himself." Those who listened carefully to his lectures could tell where Fowler stood--for instance, he nearly worshipped Bismarck, yet was seldom slow to criticize Napoleon III.

The potential books Fowler had locked in that steel-trap mind would remain there. In 1964, President Davis Y. Paschall '32 asked Fowler, then the head of the history department, to assume the critical post of dean of the faculty of arts and sciences.

During a period of unprecedented growth complicated by episodes of student unrest, Fowler "conducted his deanship with quiet efficiency," said McCully. "He was an expert at what we called legislative drafting."

"He knew the faculty and the academic rules and regulations as no one else did, an expertise that was invaluable," recalled Johnson.

Without question, Fowler was in a "hot seat" during one of the most turbulent eras in the College's history. The skirmishes between factions were many, and it was Fowler's reasonable approach to problems and unquestionable devotion to duty that kept the College moving forward, on a relatively steady course. "One might disagree with his conclusions, but one could never question his motives," said Johnson.

Through it all, he refused to stop teaching. "I'm never happier than when I close the door to the Dean's office and head up to the classroom," Fowler once told his close friend McCully.

Those few students who became close friends of Fowler outside of the classroom discovered a "real sense of warmth and a good sense of humor," recalled Bell. "He was never one to coddle a student, but beneath the tough exterior, there was an extremely sensitive and understanding man."

This man who died "prematurely" at age 69 in 1977 lives in the hearts and minds of his students and colleagues.

Fowler is still the "tour guide" when David Titus goes to Europe, and the trips continue to be more fascinating because of insights shared between teacher and student some 30 years ago.

This is indeed the greatest tribute--the kind Fowler would have appreciated most.

Does This Lecture Sound Familiar?

Excerpts From Dr. Fowler's Lecture On Henry VIII

After some years of delay Henry and Catherine were married in 1509. They were very much in love with each other. As the years went by Catherine gave birth to several children. However, all but one of the children were either born dead or died shortly after birth. The exception was the Princess Mary; both Henry and Catherine hoped for a son. But as the years went by no further children were forthcoming. And it began to be clear that Henry VIII was not to obtain a son from his Queen.

Now this situation was of tremendous concern for Henry. He becomes obsessed with the necessity of obtaining a legitimate male heir to carry on the succession. He feared that if he left the succession of the Tudor family to depend on a woman, the result might be disaster. What foundation was there for such fears?

In the first place England had never had a ruling queen. The only possible precedent was Matilda in the twelfth century. She was not a good precedent because there resulted 19 years of civil war. There was no law in England to prevent a woman from succeeding to the throne, but there was some doubt that a woman could. Furthermore, we must remember, in trying to read Henry's mind, that the Tudor dynasty was a new one. It had come to the throne in 1485. He was afraid that there would be civil war and that his family might be overthrown.

In England at this time there were men of royal blood who could challenge Mary's right. These con-

No one did more to increase the popularity of the one-and-the-only King Henry VIII than Harold Fowler. Alumni once recognized Fowler's 50-minute review of Henry's marital misfortunes as the "most famous and most popular lecture" ever given at William and Mary. It took only four or five years for the lecture to gain its campus-wide reputation, and the yearly "performance" played to standing-room only crowds in Washington 200.

It was indeed a rarity among lectures delivered by college professors. Students returned to hear Fowler's recitation of the English monarch and his six unfortunate wives time and again. The

lecture stood the test of time--it was delivered to two generations of William and Mary students, and today, parent and child can compare similar notes on Fowler's genius.

The following two excerpts from Fowler's written notes for his lecture entitled "The Divorce of Henry VIII and England's Break with Rome" have been edited only slightly. Dated December 10, 1958, they were still used as the basis for Fowler's lecture in the Project Plus Forum during the seventies. The organized, succinct style of Fowler comes shining through. The lecture notes are currently in the College archives in Swem Library.

siderations made him believe that he must obtain a legitimate male heir. So it is that by 1525 Henry begins to talk about the possibility of a divorce. He began to entertain scruples of conscience about his marriage. He began to say that his marriage to Catherine had been improper from the beginning, contrary to God's law. He said that he and Catherine had been living in sin all these years and he argued that the death of all the children except Mary was a sign of God's wrath. These are the arguments Henry used to justify his suit for divorce.

Meanwhile Henry's lecherous eyes have fallen on a lady at court. This is Anne Boleyn. Anne Boleyn came from a good family, in England. She had been educated mostly in Paris. She had returned to England in the 1520's and actually appointed a lady in waiting to Catherine.

Henry became infatuated with Anne Boleyn. Now I might add that

sometimes we wonder why. If you look at Anne's portraits, she was certainly no raving beauty. In any event, at the same time he becomes obsessed with the idea of divorce, he becomes infatuated with Anne. She was a rather shrewd, calculating woman. She had no intention of becoming just another mistress of the king. She thinks she can become queen and she is going to do everything in her power to bring this about. So for several years, Anne resisted Henry's advances until the possibility of becoming queen approached reality.

What about the position of Catherine in all this? When Catherine heard of her husband's intentions, she was shocked. Catherine loved Henry; she loved him until her dying day. Furthermore, she had maintained for years that her marriage to Henry was valid, that she had come to Henry as a virgin. Thus she never lifted a finger to help get a divorce. She was

determined to protect the rights of Mary to the crown. Catherine insisted that any decision in this case must come from Rome.

Anne Boleyn didn't last as queen for very long. Anne had made a very serious mistake at the beginning. She had given birth to a girl. Anne begins to decline in Henry's favor from that moment, particularly as time went by and no other children were born. She was accused of incest and adultery. She was guilty of the latter. She was executed in 1536.

Eleven days later, Henry took his third wife. This is Jane Seymour. She has the distinction of giving birth to a son. In October 1537 she gave birth to a boy who later becomes King Edward VI. Henry was delighted, but Jane died as a result of the birth.

Henry is a free man now, and in January 1540, he was talked into marrying a German girl, Anne of Cleves. This was a horrible mistake. He received good reports of her. He went down to the coast to meet her, and he was horrified. Henry went through with it, although he referred to her as the "Flanders Mare." He later got a divorce from her.

Henry married in 1540 Catherine Howard. She suffered the fate of Anne Boleyn. She was executed in 1542.

Finally in 1543 he married Catherine Parr, already twice a widow. He referred to her as the last and best of them. In the last years of his reign Catherine Parr brought together Henry's children. She also has the distinction of having outlived Henry.

The Merchant of Merchant's Square

Leonard Graves '35 To Retire From Men's Apparel Shop In November

This November, Williamsburg is losing a landmark on Merchant's Square with the retirement of Leonard L. Graves '35. The Frazier-Graves men's apparel shop has been a welcome sight to many members of the William and Mary family through the years, from first-day freshness to returning alumni.

Each year since 1970, a bright banner with "Welcome Alumni and Guests" on it has hung over the front door, signalling the beginning of the academic year and the start of football season. That sign replaced an earlier one in use since 1935, when Frazier-Graves had a different name and location. It was Frazier-Callis Inc. then, and the shop stood where Scribner's bookstore is now on Merchant's Square.

Leonard Graves says that he practically grew up in the clothing business, working with Garner & Co., an earlier Williamsburg men's shop, when he was in high school. When that business went under in 1934, the newly organized Frazier-Callis enterprise filled the void, employing Graves. In 1937 he bought interest in the store and became its general manager. In the early 50's, with a change in name, Graves became president of Frazier-Graves Co., Inc.

Despite his many years in the clothing business, it wasn't Graves' first and only enterprise on Duke of Gloucester Street. In 1921, he sold cold drinks down the street at R.W. Mahone & Co., at the request of a busy grocer who paid him in all drinks and candy he wanted.

"The perfect job for a nine-year-old," Graves says with a smile. "People would come to town on buggies -- you'd have to see it to believe it," he remembers. "Duke of Gloucester Street, from the Wren Building to the Capitol, was nothing but a big wide dirt road. After a heavy rain, it would turn to mud, and the buggies would get stuck."

Graves says that his childhood job was the start of 60 years in business on Duke of Gloucester Street. Born in a house on nearby Francis Street, he came to William and Mary in the fall of 1931. Some of Graves' goals were already set. For one thing, he wanted to stay in Williamsburg.

"I could see that Williamsburg was going to be some nice place to live, with Colonial Williamsburg coming in," comments Graves. He also knew that studying business would give him an advantage at a time when many young people had to leave Williamsburg to find work.

One other thing about Williamsburg: Graves thought it would be a wonderful place to raise a family. Those feelings were shared by Anne Fraser Thompson '38, whom Graves met when she was a student. They are the parents of six alumni and one alumna-to-be: Leonard L. Graves '68, JD '71, Joan Graves Brobst '70, Patti Graves Peverall '71, Anne Graves Matson '73, Libby Graves Gillett '75, who is married to Mark R. Gillett '75, and May M. Graves '78 (M.B.A. '80). Completing this real William and Mary family is the Graves' youngest daughter Lilly, who is a freshman this year.

Williamsburg, William and Mary and sports are dear to Graves' heart, and he has contributed considerable time and energy to all three. In addition to many community activities, Graves has been a longtime supporter of the William and Mary Athletic Educational Foundation. He was one of its founders in 1948 and has been an AEF board member several times.

"Sports has been one of my greatest pleasures in life," says Graves, who has followed William and Mary sports since Agnes L. Winn '31 (now Mrs. Davis Y. Paschall) was "the star of the William and Mary women's basketball team." He has taken special pride in seeing the College do well.

"We've had so many great years in sports, some bad ones, too, but that's sports. You take it as it comes."

Another type of satisfaction has come from employing close to 300 students over the years.

"So many of them have become so successful, and almost all were William and Mary kids," remarks Graves. Just as he has fond memories of students he has worked with, they often reciprocate the feeling, dropping in to visit all year long as well as at Homecoming.

Sitting in his office, Graves says, "You just can't imagine the people we've served." He speaks warmly of the late Jack Benny, "Duke" Wayne and Winston Churchill, especially. Along with the famous, customers from every state and several different countries have mingled with students and townspeople in Graves' shop, and he is happy to have had such a diverse clientele. "We've really served three groups -- the College, the local people and the

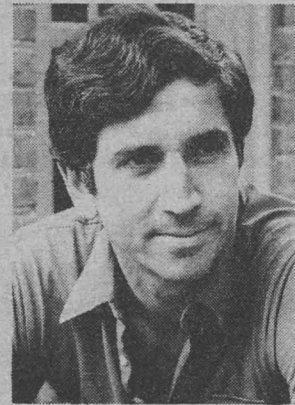
tourists -- and there are no nicer people," Graves emphasizes.

The closing of the Frazier-Graves next month will be followed by the opening of another men's apparel shop at the same location, Joseph Bryant Ltd. Graves is already anticipating what he'll do with that new commodity, free time. "If you've got a wife, a dog and seven kids spread from Hampton to Frisco, it's time to go see them," he says. "Also, I used to play golf and I love to play tennis, so I hope to play both now."

Leonard Graves has watched Williamsburg evolve from a sleepy village of 1,000 to a modern city of 10,000, and the College with it. He firmly believes that William and Mary has expanded into "one of the finest college campuses anywhere." Leaning forward in his chair, Graves adds, "If you were ever born and raised in a college town, you know it's a wonderful place to live. It helps keep you young."

How Do You Select A Freshman Class?

Question: If I were allowed just one criterion in selecting our freshman class, which would it be?

The answer to this intriguing inquiry might surprise many people. Believe it or not, I would not choose high school grades, or class rank, or SAT scores. Nor would I choose extracurricular activities or school recommendations. All of these are important elements in the formula we have developed for student selection but the most telling evidence of a student's potential to grow at William and Mary has not been mentioned. To me, the most comprehensive aspect of any applicant's dossier is his course selection in high school.

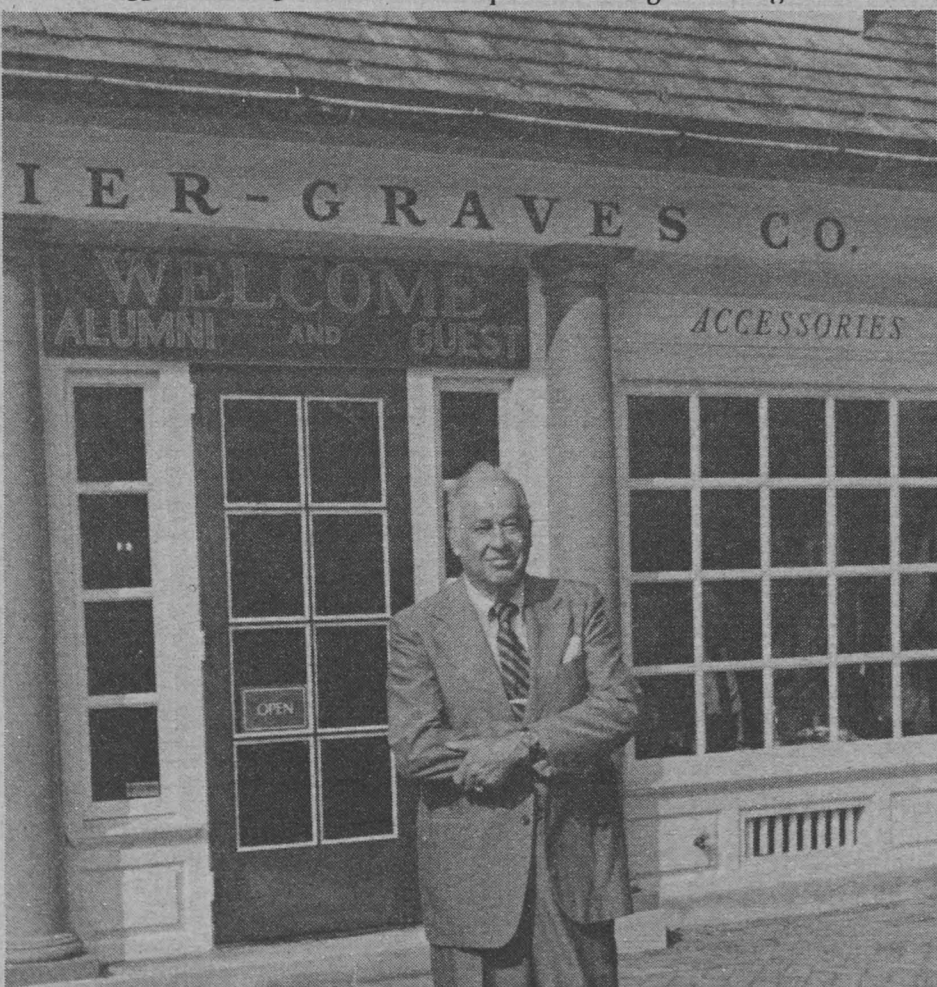
The progressive movement in secondary education has provided a broadening of the high school curriculum which now includes many academic choices for the typical student who has fulfilled minimum state requirements for graduation prior to the final year of high school. It is those choices that allow us to gauge many aspects of his/her academic zeal and intellectual curiosity for the challenges of the William and Mary academic experience.

It is far better for a candidate to achieve a B average in the most demanding academic subjects his high school can offer than to be a straight A student in something less. I realize that many students are concerned about vocational preparation and are now electing courses with carry over value for the job market after secondary school. On the other hand, William and Mary graduates have little difficulty finding gainful employment upon the completion of our classroom education which stresses the formal development of their basic competencies here. By maximizing intellectual potentials here, they have prepared themselves for a broad variety of vocational opportunities in a constantly changing job market.

Question: What are the basic competencies we look for in a high school student?

I believe the most important qualities are these: 1) the ability to communicate in both oral and written forms; 2) the capacity to read with speed and comprehension; 3) the ability to reason intuitively, to identify and solve difficult problems, and to make major decisions. While there are many other abilities one might add to this list, most will agree that these are the critical elements necessary for success at William and Mary and the best indicators for prospective employers after graduation.

I repeat my offer to answer specific or general questions posed by members of the Society of Alumni. Questions received in the past have provided interesting topics for my column and I look forward to hearing from you who might desire clarification of admissions policies here at William and Mary.

Tim Hanson '39 Steps Back In Time

Explains To Historical Group Why America Is In Trouble

One of William and Mary's distinguished alumni recently delivered a rousing speech in the historic Old Senate Chamber of Congress.

Arthur B. Hanson '39 spoke at the annual meeting of the United States Capitol Historical Society. For 30 minutes, he explained to Congressmen, historians and a host of Washington bureaucrats why America is in trouble. He was met with raised eyebrows and quite a few nods of agreement. As Hanson likes to say, "I shook them up a little." It was reminiscent of the time he told a chapter meeting of the DAR that George Washington was illegally elected the first President of the United States.

His address focused on John Hanson, a talented but seldom remembered patriot, who was actually the first President of the United States, under the Articles of Confederation. In many ways, he was George Washington's mentor, and helped set the style of careful, quiet leadership that the "Father of Our Country" would follow.

Hanson stepped into the colonial style shoes of his direct ancestor and presented an address on what John might say if he could appear before the combined houses of Congress in 1981.

"I am appalled to see our public education system in its present disarray," Hanson told the assembly. "When we in the Congress created our system of public education, we did so in the belief that every citizen of every state in the United States of America should be afforded an equal opportunity to be exposed to the educational process without regard to race, color or creed. We viewed the teachers of our children to occupy a privileged position and we expected these teachers to be the epitome of rectitude. I find here today that by the default of the states and the intrusion of the Federal Government, we have created a system of socialized imbalance and unionized recalcitrance which finds our school systems throughout the country totally disorganized and subject to strikes by public employees who seem to have forgotten their public trust."

Hanson also recalled the good old days, when "postmasters were trusted public servants who occupied a position of preeminence in there

communities." John Hanson, who signed the law which created the postal service, now would view the postal system as a "slough of despond."

Yet the brunt of Hanson's speech focused on the "boll weevils" of federal bureaucracy.

"I say to you today that if I, John Hanson, were able to once again lead you as I had the privilege to do in 1781, I would urge and insist that we convene a constitutional convention to review, for a period of several years, where we are heading from a governmental standpoint. What is the role of Federal Government

today? I cannot believe that the federal bureaucracy as created today, can long survive in its present form without swallowing the people of our country into a labor, socialist, marxist creation which I do not wish to be a part of, now or ever."

The answer to the growing problems of bureaucracy, reported Hanson, is to "put the responsibility of governing back on the people of the respective states where it was intended to be."

"Why not put the responsibility of government back on the Congress of the United States, its members elected by the people for the

purpose of governing them to the ultimate?" asks Hanson. "Why do we insist on existing under a form of government which when clearly analyzed, tells us we have gone to the Hamiltonian theory of distrust in the people and hiding under a monarchy under another name?"

Hanson left the Old Senate Chamber buzzing with conversation, much like it probably was during the early days of American government. John Hanson would have no doubt been proud of his articulate descendent, who spoke forcefully in support of the original articles on which America was founded.

A drinking fountain, gift of the Order of the White Jacket, has been installed in the lower level of the Alumni House.

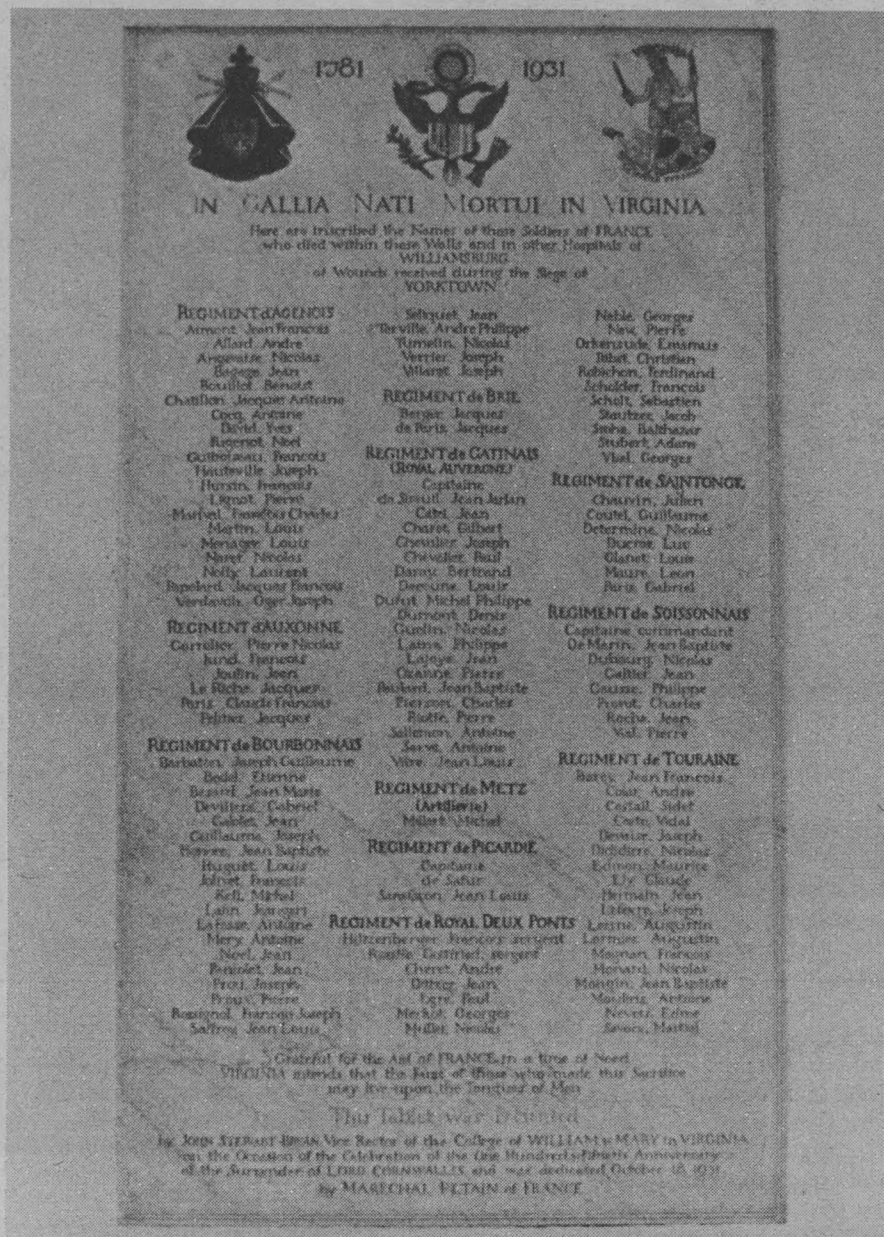

Reagan To Attend Yorktown Celebration

Four-Day Observance Will Honor 200th Anniversary Of Famous Battle



The plaque at the rear of the Wren Building commemorating French soldiers who died in the Wren Building and in other hospitals in Williamsburg of wounds received during the siege of Yorktown will be re-dedicated Oct. 16 in conjunction with the 200th anniversary of the Battle of Yorktown.

President Ronald Reagan, foreign dignitaries, 4,000 Revolutionary War soldiers in authentic costume, and 16 acres of "heritage festival" exhibits will help commemorate the 200th anniversary of the famous victory at Yorktown during the week of Oct. 16-19. Lewis A. McMurrin Jr. '36 is chairman of the Yorktown Bicentennial committee which is planning the historic event.

In conjunction with the celebration, French officials will rededicate the plaque commemorating French soldiers who died in the Wren Building when it was used as a hospital. Ceremonies, with full military band, will be at 3:00 on Friday October 16. The following day, the halftime show at the Marshall-William and Mary football game will be devoted to the Yorktown theme.

As most schoolchildren and history buffs know, the surrender of Lord Cornwallis to George Washington effectively ended the war on October 19, 1781. History says the

pageantry, patriots' honor, and victory commemoration. Activities on land and on the York River run continuously throughout the long week-end.

America's Victory Celebration begins on Friday Oct. 16, with a parade, and concludes on Monday, Oct. 19, with speeches by President Reagan and foreign dignitaries.

A favorite Yorktown experience is expected to be the 1,000-tent, eighteenth century military encampment—complete with Revolutionary era food cooked over open fires, and exciting demonstrations of siege tactics.

Highlight of the battlefield activities will be the recreated surrender ceremonies involving thousands of costumed French, American, British, Canadian and German soldiers. The historic surrender march and laying down of arms will take place on the afternoon of October 19.

Meanwhile, tall sailing ships will be anchored next to modern-day warships in Yorktown harbor. A

Memories Of A Past Celebration

Editor:

What follows is a true and almost forgotten anecdote, an event which happened to me in the Battle of Yorktown (the 1923 version). Thought maybe some of the Olde Guard would remember this. If memory serves me correctly, I was shot by Wince Irwin, class of 1925 or 1926. We had fun the day of the battle.

"I was shot in the Battle of Yorktown! Believe it or not, it is true. When I was a student at the College of William and Mary, in Williamsburg, Virginia, in the twenties, a motion picture company was filming a reenactment of the Battle of Yorktown. Several hundred students from the College and several hundred soldiers of the United States Army from nearby Fort Eustis, Virginia were transported to Yorktown, dressed in British and Continental Army uniforms and furnished muskets. Some of the participants were furnished blank cartridges.

"The battle scene was filled with smoke from smoke bombs, rubber balls shot from small cannon, and

much noise and confusion. Hand-to-hand "fighting" was common. In the close "fighting," I was "shot" by another student. The hot powder from his musket burned a hole in my trousers and the flesh on my left thigh. After the action was completed, everyone was excited and comparing their participation in the battle with the other students. I noticed the burned hole in my trousers and stated aloud, jokingly, that I had been shot." One of the directors overheard me and immediately came over and inspected the "wound." He took me to the nearest doctor in Yorktown for treatment. Incidentally, the doctor was a very elderly man, a former member of General Robert E. Lee's staff in the Civil War, in which one of his ears had been shot off.

Today, I have a scar about the size of a quarter dollar on my left thigh, the result of my being "shot" in the Battle of Yorktown. It looks like a vaccination."

I certify that the above is a true story.

Dr. Marvin West '52 presented initial plans for expansion of the Alumni House, as prepared by John Morton '58 of New Orleans. In support of the plans a feasibility and use study conducted by the School of Business, under Dr. Don Messmer, was reviewed. Proposals for developing the expansion, including extending current usage of the house, will be developed for presentation at the next Board meeting. Alumni input is invited.

Approval was given to accept a gift of sculpture for the patio area of the Alumni House from alumni Anna Belle Koenig Nimmo '45 of Denver.

The by-laws of the Society were revised. These changes will be voted upon at the November 6 meeting of the Society, at the annual banquet. Alumni should forward comments to the Alumni Office prior to the meeting should there be concern or question.

A committee was authorized to pursue study and recommendation on full automation of alumni records. Alumni interested in participating in this review should notify the Alumni Office of their interest and qualifications. The development of leadership skills, and opportunities to practice those skills while in College, was

discussed. Ways to assist in the identification opportunities for leadership development will be a strong effort of the Board. The Society will also be working to find ways to be of greater assistance to the fund raising efforts of the College to help meet a critical need, and to extend the base of alumni support both financially and through participation in a variety of programs which will require active involvement of alumni.

President Jack Garrett '40 termed the Board meeting one of the most productive he had enjoyed in his five years of service.

"This weekend we have continued the overall momentum, and have taken giant strides in several key areas," he said. He particularly noted the strong leadership of the chairmen of the two major committees: Austin Roberts III '69 and Marilyn Entwisle '44.

"We are working very hard, with great enthusiasm and eagerness, to guide and assist the willingness of alumni to help, and the excitement that we feel about our College that is there among all alumni," said Garrett. "We are moving ahead, and we are already seeing results that are indeed rewarding. This is an active board."

British band played "The World Turned Upside Down" as Cornwallis' troops marched out of Yorktown in defeat. More than six years after the first shots were fired at Concord, America had finally won her independence.

"The celebration should be a lot of fun for everyone," says McMurrin "and will also make people stop and think about the hard-won freedom we enjoy today in America."

With the "meaningful fun" theme ever in mind, a wide range of events is scheduled to take place over a four-day period in and around the picturesque waterfront village, on the York River, and on the actual field of battle, about 12 miles from Williamsburg.

Each of the four days has a designated focus: festival fair, military

Virginia seafood feast, an underwater warship excavation in progress, and fireworks exploding high over the water are expected to draw many visitors to Yorktown's historic waterfront.

For four days in October, Yorktown will come alive with patriotic fervor, the music of fifes, the smokey smell of campfires, and the sights of eighteenth and twentieth century America side by side. From sailboat races and historical exhibits to flag-waving and cannonfiring, the victory ceremonies and events have been carefully planned to honor the American ideals fought for—and won—on the battlefield at Yorktown, 200 years ago, McMurrin said.

Board Revises Society Of The Alumni By-Laws

(The changes made in the By-Laws of the Society of the Alumni are indicated by italics. If you would like a copy of the entire By-Laws, please contact the Alumni House, Box GO, Williamsburg, Va. 23187, or telephone 804 229-1693).

ARTICLE I - THE SOCIETY

SECTION I. The exclusive ultimate control of the affairs of the Society shall be vested in its active members and shall be exercised, subject to control of said members, by a Board of Directors consisting of fifteen persons, a majority of whom shall constitute a quorum.

(a) **MEMBERSHIP.** All persons who shall have been matriculated students at The College of William and Mary in Virginia, other than regular summer session students, evening students, and extension course students, and who have been enrolled at The College of William and Mary in Williamsburg for as much as one regular college semester, or who have received earned degrees from The College of William and Mary, are considered alumni. Any person recognized as an alumnus of The College of William and Mary by this definition, and who has received honorable dismissal from the College, is eligible for membership in the Society of the Alumni.

(b) **ACTIVE MEMBER**
1. An active member, with the privilege of voting, and such other privileges as the Board of Directors may confer, shall be either an alumnus who has been designated a Life Member of the Society or an alumnus who has contributed to any fund recognized and/or accredited by the Office of College Develop-

ment or the Society of the Alumni, during the previous fiscal year or by September 1, in the same calendar year in which the election occurs.

2. **HONORARY MEMBER -** *Honorary Degree Recipients will have the same privileges and obligations as earned degree recipients.*

(c) **ASSOCIATE MEMBER.** A person not otherwise eligible for membership in the Society of the Alumni may be designated an Associate Member by the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors in recognition of meaningful contributions to the Society. An Associate Member may neither vote nor hold office in the Society.

SECTION II. The annual meeting of the Society shall be held in Williamsburg, Virginia, on the weekend designated for Homecoming.

SECTION III. Special meetings of the Society may be held on call of the Board of Directors or on petition of *seventy-five (75)* members of the Society submitted in writing to the President of the Society.

SECTION IV. Notice of all meetings of the Society shall be given by the Secretary. Notice of special meetings shall state the purposes of such meetings.

That notice should be published in the Alumni Gazette preceding the date of the Special Meeting and the Special Meeting will be held no sooner than twenty-one (21) days after the publication of the Gazette.

SECTION V. A quorum of any meeting of the Society shall consist of *one hundred fifty (150)* members, present in person. Matters requiring decision shall be determined by a majority of such quorum.

**ARTICLE III
BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

SECTION I. Members of the Board of Directors shall be *active* members of the Society and shall be elected by *active* members of the Society for terms of three years. Five Directors shall be elected annually.

SECTION II. The method of election of members of the Board of Directors shall be as follows:

(a) In addition to the nomination procedure provided above, any *seventy-five (75)* members of the Society may, by petition, make nominations to the Chairman of the Committee in Nominations, provided that such petitions are received by the Chairman of the Committee on or before July 15.

(b) Each ballot *must* be signed on its *envelope* by the member casting the vote to permit validation by tellers. Ballots shall be returned to the Executive Vice President not later than seven days preceding the date set for the Annual Meeting of the Society.

ARTICLE IV - BOARD MEETINGS

SECTION III. Notices of regular and special meetings shall be mailed by the Executive Vice President to each member of the Board of Directors to be received no less than *ten (10)* days before any such meeting and in the case of special meetings shall state the purpose thereof.

ARTICLE V - COMMITTEES

SECTION I. There shall be an Executive Committee of the Board of Directors to be composed of the President, Vice President, and at

least one member at large, selected by the President. This Committee may act on behalf of the Board as necessary in a situation requiring immediate action.

SECTION II. The President of the Society shall assign each member of the Board of Directors to one of three major committees through which the Board will function. The President shall designate one member of each of these three committees as Chairman and shall further designate other members of said committees Chairman or Co-Chairman as may be required. The three major committees of the Board of Directors and their functions shall be as follows:

(a) **ALUMNI SERVICE COMMITTEE.** This committee shall be concerned with the *Alumni House, Alumni Chapters, Communications, Homecoming, Alumni Medallion and other forms* of recognition of alumni, Merchandising, and with such other matters as may from time to time be assigned to it by the President.

(b) **COLLEGE RELATIONS COMMITTEE.** This committee shall be concerned with the Society's relationships with the College Administration, Board of Visitors, Faculty, and Students, and with such other matters as may from time to time be assigned to it by the President.

(c) **OPERATIONS COMMITTEE.** This committee shall be concerned with matters pertaining to the budget, with the Bylaws, with planning, and with such other matters as may from time to time be assigned to it by the President.

(d) Alumni other than members of the Board of Directors may be appointed by the President to serve on committees or sub-committees of the Board of Directors.

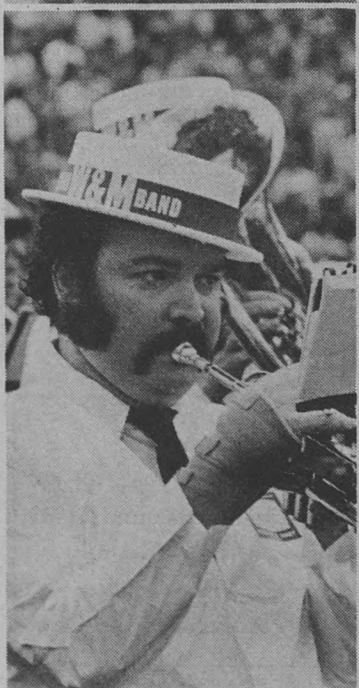
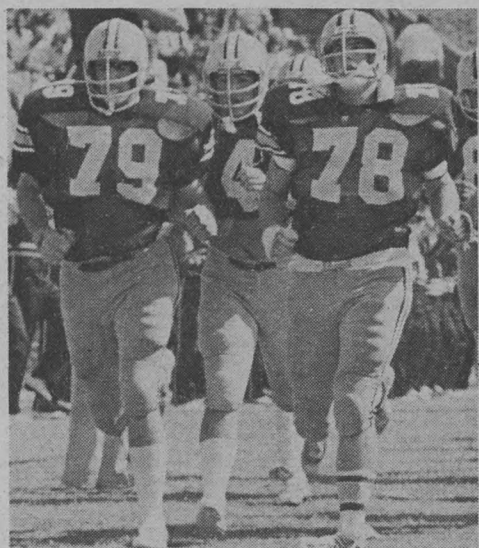

Apropos of the bicentennial of the Battle of Yorktown on October 19, it is worthy of note that the Class of 1927 numbers among its members one who probably is the only wounded survivor of the battle--**Robert W. Corstaphney**.

That's right, folks. Bob was shot in the battle. Well, maybe not the original battle of 1781, but most certainly was in the reenactment of said battle in the fall of 1923. To make matters worse, the wound was sustained in a part of the anatomy which made sitting down for lectures a bit uncomfortable thereafter!

Recently, I wrote to Bob, who now lives in Dallas, Texas, to ask for help and he promptly sent me a copy of his recollections:

A motion picture company, we forget which one or the name of the picture, "drafted" several hundred men students from our campus. It also requisitioned several hundred soldiers from nearby Fort Eustis. They were duly transported to Yorktown, outfitted in British and Colonial uniforms, issued replica muskets and some were given blank cartridges to help provide a realistic touch. They were put through a bit of drill and then, as the British say, "had at it" while the cameras ground.

Let Bob finish the story:
"The battle scene was filled with smoke from smoke bombs, rubber balls shot from small cannon, much noise and confusion. Hand-to-hand 'fighting' was common.

"Unfortunately, in the close combat, I was 'shot' by another student. The hot powder from his musket burned a hole in my breeches and the flesh of my left thigh caught the blast.

"After action ended, everyone was excited and comparing notes. It was then that I noted a hole in my trousers and jokingly announced: 'I've been shot.'

"One of the movie directors overheard the remark, came over immediately to inspect the 'wound' and then insisted on taking me to the nearest doctor in Yorktown.

"Incidentally, the physician was a very elderly gentleman, a former member of Gen. Robert E. Lee's staff in the Civil War, who had had an ear shot off in real battle.

"Today," reports Bob, "I still have a scar about the size of a quarter dollar on my left thigh, even though it looks more like a vaccination."

Almost needless to say, Bob took a lot of kidding about the nature and location of his wound, which he was unable to show for verification, at least in mixed company.

I had completely forgotten the incident until Bob reminded me. Far more serious than what happened 54 years ago, he had open-heart surgery this past May, but has recovered quickly, I'm glad to report.

Dallas alumni of William and Mary have not met in several years, Bob reports. He adds he won't be able to attend the reunion of Yorktown battle veterans, if any.

August 5 brought an interesting postcard from **William J. (Bill) Hogan** mailed at Fishbourne, England, as he was preparing to leave for home after spending another summer acting as a guide at the First Century (A.D.) Roman Palace excavations.

Judging by the artist's conception of the palace on the postcard, this must have been a fabulous place even for 2000 years ago. I mentioned in a previous letter that Bill has spent his summers for a number of years working at the archaeological digs where he meets many interesting people from all over the world.

"Each day something interesting happens," he writes, "and, of course, there was the wedding of our fellow alumnus (**Prince Charles**) to **Lady Diana**. I have been

pleased with the number of friends who knew of the ceremony at the College (When Prince Charles was made an honorary fellow).

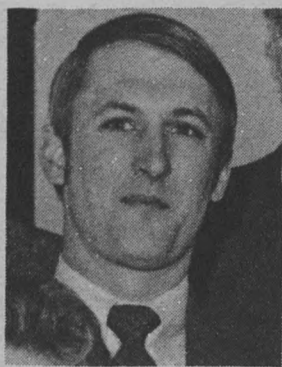

"THEIR MAJESTIES' ROYALL COLLEDGE"

The College of William & Mary in Virginia,
In the Seventeenth and Eighteenth Centuries



THEIR MAJESTIES' ROYALL COLLEDGE, a title taken from usage during the 17th and 18th centuries, covers the period from the beginnings soon after the first settlement at Jamestown, until the end of the 18th century when alumni of Virginia's pre-eminent College were helping guide the destinies of the young American Republic.

Working almost entirely from original sources, the author Jack E. Morpurgo, Class of 1938, produced a fascinating account of the dreams, frustrations, and achievements of the tiny College of William and Mary and its people. The lively text is liberally interspersed with more than a hundred illustrations, many culled from various historical archives. It is written with great wit and warm style that typifies its author, but it also manifests scholarly instincts throughout. Not merely a dry, institutional history, it is as readable as any popular work.

W&M Fund Tops Half Million



1980-81 William and Mary Fund Chairman John and Marilyn Entwisle celebrate victory at the half-million mark.

The William and Mary Fund surpassed the half-million-dollar mark for the first time in history during the 1980-81 fiscal year.

The Fund reached \$500,703, an increase of \$104,141 or 26 per cent over the 1979-80 total of \$396,562.

Headed by Co-Chairpersons, Marilyn (Miller) '44 and John '44 Entwisle, the Fund showed an increase of the average gift from \$48 to \$60 per alumni donor.

103 donors gave contributions of \$1,000 or more, nearly double the 67 \$1,000 plus donors for the previous year. Contributors of \$500 to \$999 numbered 94, as compared to 74 last year; and 1,228 donors gave \$100 to \$499, as compared to the previous year's 990 donors. 190 more donors joined the \$50 to \$99 giving rank, while 44 fewer gave less than \$50.

Jackie Crebbs '64, director for annual support for the College, credited the success of the 1980-81 Fund to two influences--the interest generated by the National Endowment for the Humanities Challenge Grant and the leadership of Marilyn and John Entwisle.

The Entwises made hundreds of personal calls and hand-penned nearly 400 personal letters to classmates in support of the Fund. "They traveled, phoned, organized alumni parties,

hosted phonathons--they gave over their lives to the Fund for an entire year," said Crebbs.

The Entwises encouraged alumni to increase their gifts to the Fund, which generated additional funds from the National Endowment for the Humanities. Under the conditions of a three-year Challenge Grant, the NEH will match, on a \$1 to \$3 basis, new and increased gifts in support of the humanities.

During the past year \$93,806 was considered "increased" giving, and \$31,635 was "new" money from first-time donors. A total of \$125,441 qualified for matching gifts from the NEH.

The Entwises also visited other colleges and researched other alumni fund programs. In the process they became highly committed to the cause of private support for public education.

"We came face to face with the financial crisis in higher education - especially in State supported colleges," says John Entwisle. "As time goes on, State institutions will not be able to depend on funding at the level they have enjoyed in the past.

"Federal cuts in education, combined with the less stringent income tax regulations of the next few years, will put the responsibility of higher education right back into the hands of

Private Gifts Up 18 Per Cent

William and Mary received more than two and one-half million dollars in private gifts in 1980-81, an 18 per cent increase over the previous year.

Led by a 26 per cent increase in annual giving by alumni through the William and Mary Fund, the College received \$2,563,319 in the fiscal year which ended June 30, 1981, compared to \$2,165,014 during 1979-80.

The 1980-81 total includes gifts in kind such as works of art, library books or antiques valued at approximately \$250,000.

The William and Mary Fund exceeded \$500,000 for the first time in its history, an increase of \$104,000 over the previous year. The exact total was \$500,703.

Total alumni giving to the College was \$984,271, an increase of more than \$50,000 over 1979-80.

Duane A. Dittman, who completed his first full year as vice president for university advancement on August 1, noted that the increased gifts from alumni, parents and other friends of the college indicated "there are more and

more people who understand the necessity for private support at a unique state institution such as William and Mary."

"They know private funds are necessary in order to be able to afford those special faculty and student activities that enrich the academic program," Dittman said.

Dittman said 12 of 28 capital gifts of \$10,000 or more received by the College during 1980-81 were designated by donors for faculty salaries or faculty research.

"Since the first priority of our many priorities in fund-raising is to underwrite faculty salaries and faculty research," Dittman said, "we are gratified by these figures."

Financial support included \$200,000 from the National Endowment for the Humanities as part of an NEH Challenge grant which requires the College to raise, in new money, three dollars for every one NEH matching dollar. Of the 1980-81 private gift total, \$526,369 qualified, bringing the cumulative two-year total to \$628,361.

The College has now received \$400,000 after two years of the three-year challenge. The N.E.H. funds are dedicated to endowment for faculty salaries.

Of the more than \$500,000 in gifts to the William and Mary Fund, over \$125,000 qualified as new money toward the NEH Challenge grant. Nearly 7500 alumni contributed to the 1980-81 Fund, a new record, which included 1000 new donors who had never contributed in the past.

William and Mary received gifts and firm pledges totaling \$1,205,000 toward a new Museum of Art on which construction will begin in October.

The College also received \$85,000 from local "Friends of the College," the business and professional people in the greater Williamsburg area. This represented a 52 per cent increase over 1979-80.

In other categories, parents contributed \$76,080, corporations contributed \$72,997 in matching gifts and \$318,596.83 in other gifts, foundations

private sector - alumni and parents, in particular. It will be up to us to make up the difference, and to maintain the high quality of the William and Mary experience."

Marilyn Entwisle feels the alumni must be made increasingly aware that William and Mary offers "the biggest bargain in education in the country." "Tuition fees at the Ivy League schools are over \$11,000 per year," she says. "We simply can't continue to provide comparable excellence at William and Mary unless private support dramatically increases. Safeguarding 'the William and Mary Experience' really boils right down to alumni dollars and cents. Fortunately alumni are beginning to realize how badly their contributions are needed - every one of them."

The Entwisles were assisted in the 1980-81 Fund effort by volunteer reunion class agents Blake Newton, Jr. '35; Jack Garrett '50; Bill Prince '55; Tom Farrington '60; Laurie Yingling Soleau '65; Lynda Lotz Brown '70; and Barbara Ramsey '75. Special appeals were also made by Dr. Billy Bickers '29 to all physicians; and by Joan Showalter '55 and Dick Sikorski '68 to alumni with corporate matching gift benefits. Agents, in a special mail campaign, brought about an increase in dollars and donors to the Fund from all constituencies solicited, and the Class of 1940 has been awarded the Society of the Alumni Board of Directors Award for the most significant overall fundraising increase of all classes.

Although the gift is not included in the 1980-81 total, William and Mary began its 1981-82 year on a positive note when the Kenan Foundation announced a \$750,000 grant to the College. The grant will be used to establish a Kenan Distinguished Professorship in the Humanities.

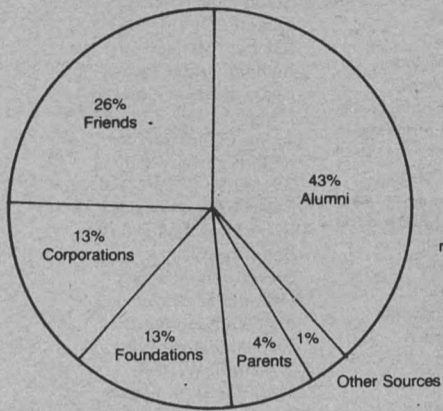

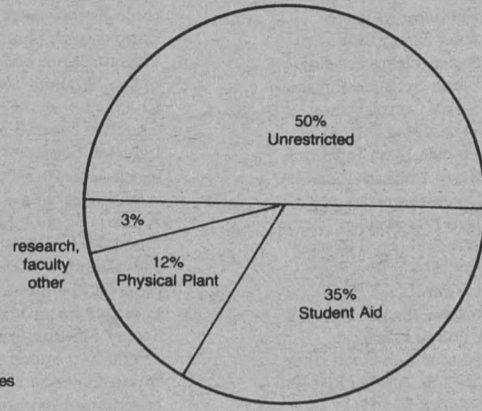

CURRENT OPERATIONS = \$1,729,297.15

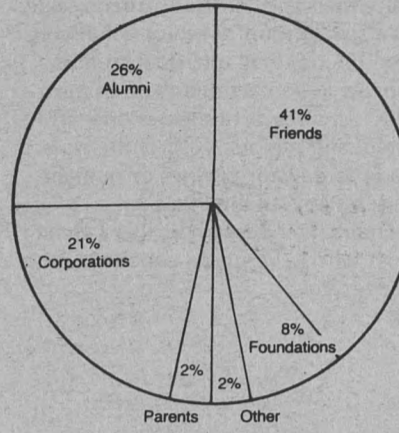

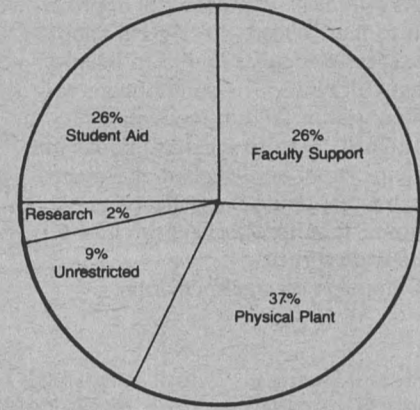

"J.B." And His Friends

"I've always felt that if you had the opportunity to do something for someone else you would be successful."

With this philosophy, J.B. Hickman has become a very successful retailer and an equally successful fundraiser.

Until recently the owner of Binns in Williamsburg, and for the past seven years chairman of the Friends of the College, Hickman has accumulated an enviable record in both endeavors. His fashion shop attracts customers from across Virginia and neighboring states who have come to rely on his emphasis on quality merchandise and his deft hand with the ever changing caprices of fashion.

In 1980-81 the Friends of the College raised \$85,393 for William and Mary. In 1979-80 the total was just over \$55,000. Inspired by this 52% increase in giving, plans are already under way for a goal of \$100,000 for 1981-82.

How does Hickman "sell" the College so successfully to area businessmen and women? "I tell them it is one of the best investments they are ever going to make," he explains.

"I tell them that I have been in Williamsburg for 37 years and think that when you are living and working in a community you have to contribute to that community, and the more you contribute the more it will do for you. If you do participate, you are going to reap dividends from your investment."

J.B. and Mildred Hickman have made a major investment in the College. In 1979 they committed \$100,000 to William and Mary, and their generosity supports various College programs from the Choir to the football team.

"I wish more people would take an interest in Williamsburg. It is a wonderful place in which we work and live. Where else can you find three big institutions doing things for us like William and Mary, the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation and Busch?"

The personal approach is at the heart of Hickman's fundraising strategy. He is anxious to hear of anyone who might be interested in joining the Friends, and either he or someone on his Advisory Council will make a personal call. Just recently a woman wrote to President

Graves expressing interest in contributing to the College. After a five-minute visit, Hickman had a new patron from whom he received a \$1,000 check. But he is quick to add that the Friends of the College is composed of people who have made large and small donations. There is no restriction on the size of the gifts by Friends," he says. "All are welcome."

His enthusiasm and commitment to fundraising for the Friends comes from a natural tendency toward hard work

and optimism in his fellow man.

Hickman sought his first position during the depression years with Leggett's Department Stores. Mr. Leggett told the young job seeker that he didn't need anyone but if he wanted to come in on Saturday they would see what he could do.

"I worked that Saturday in the men's department," he recalls, "and two days later he called and said to come in on Thursday and work Thursday, Friday and Saturday. I had had good sales the

one day I did work, and he wanted me to see what I could do in three days. At the end of the day on Saturday he came to me and said 'You start Monday as a regular employee.'"

Thus was launched a career which took him to Richmond for the Textile Finance Corporation (now Southern Department Stores); to Smithfield, Virginia as manager of Betts, Inc.; and after a wartime stint with the Provost Marshall's office, to Williamsburg.

Hickman first managed the Williamsburg Shop which was formerly located in Merchants Square. He became manager of Casey's in 1954 and in 1960 left to open his own store, Binns, on Boundary Street.

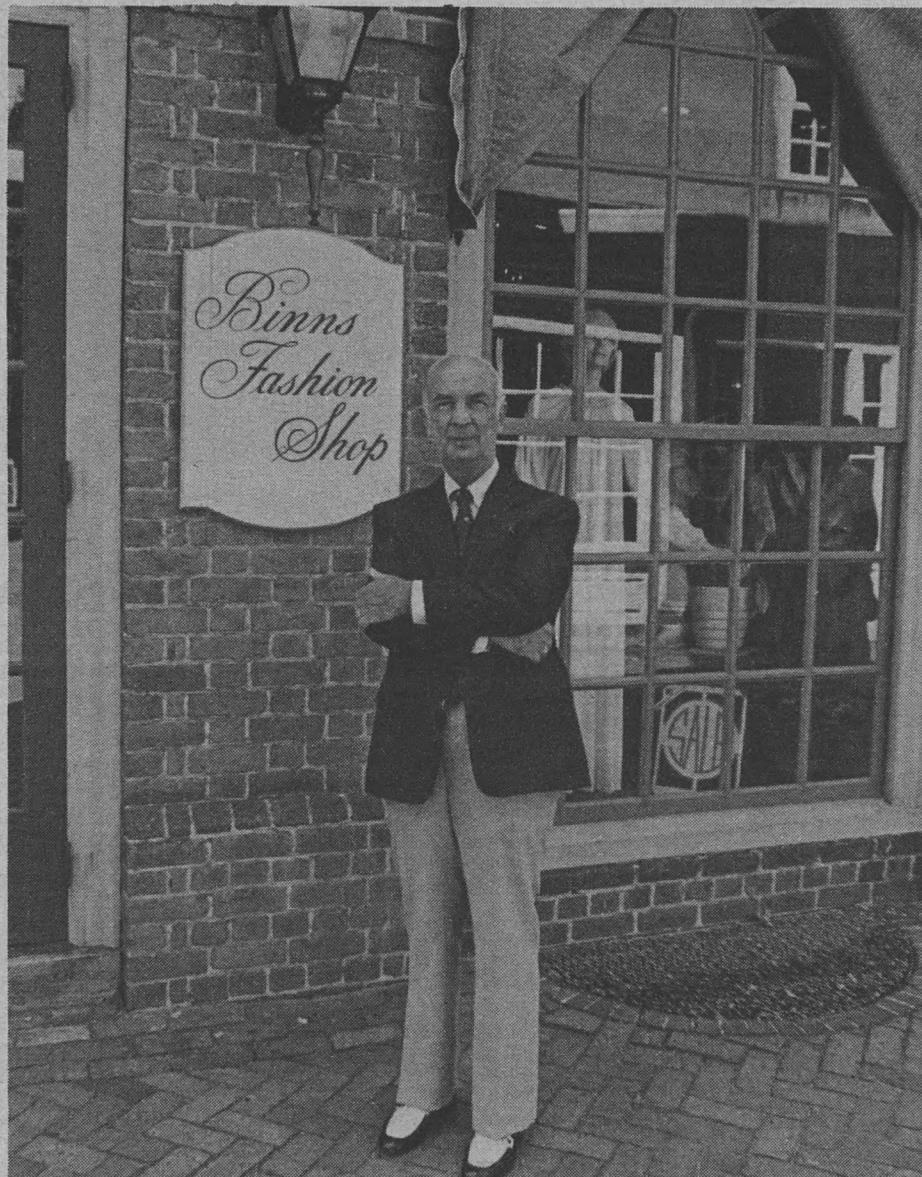
There were doubters who wondered why Hickman would leave the security of an established store such as Casey's to go to a store that wasn't even in the main shopping area. Hard work, says Hickman, is what made the difference. "If you are only interested in pay day and quitting time, you are only going to be so-so. And you have to live within your means and not be greedy if you expect to survive," says Hickman.

Through the years, Hickman's six and sometimes seven day work-weeks have been shared by his wife whom he married in 1942. As one of the buyers for Binns, Mildred Hickman shares her husband's philosophy that the most important people in the store are the customers, second the employees, and then the Hickmans. "So many people put themselves before anyone else, and if you do that you are going to have a rough road to travel," says Hickman.

Each year Binns has a traditional Christmas party for employees at which bonuses are handed out. Last Christmas some \$60,000 in holiday bonuses were distributed by the Hickmans.

The Hickmans have sold Binns to a Richmond couple but will continue to maintain an interest in the shop which caters, says Hickman, to "the cream of the crop" in customers.

Although his work-week can be expected to shrink since he is no longer owner of Binns, Hickman will undoubtedly continue to maintain a busy schedule. His goal for the Friends is one commitment for next year that he fully intends to reach.

Endowment Exceeds \$20 Million

College Qualifies For Second N.E.H. Check

Hundreds of loyal William and Mary alumni responded to a special challenge offered by the National Endowment for the Humanities last year, enabling the College to earn a second \$200,000 check from NEH.

And the good news is that alumni, parents and friends will have one more chance to take advantage of this challenge during the 1981-82 year, when NEH will once again enhance the College's efforts to support its humanities programs. NEH offered the College a one-for-three match for all new gifts to the humanities program over a three-year period, with a total of \$500,000 available if the College could raise \$1.5 million.

So far, William and Mary has garnered gifts and pledges totaling just over \$800,000 during the first two

years. The year-to-come remains a stiff challenge, and the College will be hard-pressed to come up with \$700,000 in additional commitments.

Alumni have responded with enthusiasm, increasing their gifts to the William and Mary Fund to qualify "new" money toward the NEH Challenge.

The NEH Challenge focuses on the College's number one priority need--the enhancement of faculty support. Although highly respected by students and their professional peers, faculty members at the College remain some of the lowest paid professors in the country.

A special Task Force of alumni, faculty and friends was appointed by the President in 1980 to lead the effort to meet the NEH Challenge.

Alumni, parents and friends of the College joined together during the 1980-81 year to help William and Mary surpass an important milestone--the \$20 million mark for the College's endowment.

More and more loyal donors are recognizing that the endowment represents the College's security for the future, when educational institutions are

predicted to face skyrocketing costs and difficult financial decisions. As a result of greatly increased support, the endowments at the College have doubled during the last five years.

During 1980-81, contributions were made to dozens of diverse programs at the College, both to endowments and as expendable special gifts. The following list includes these special gifts.

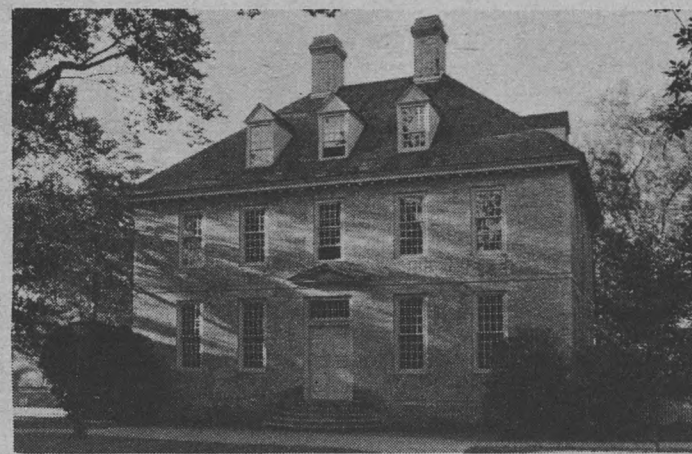

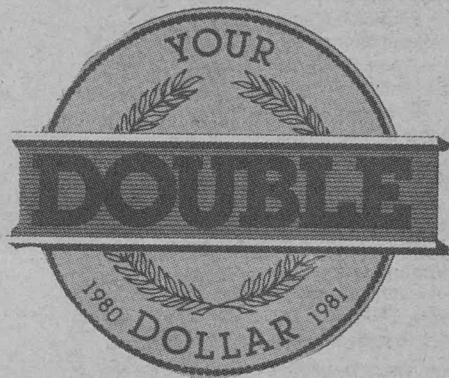

Shakespeare took Williamsburg by storm this summer, with a new support group adding extra zest to the Old Dominion's most celebrated summer theatre festival.

Over 150 theatre enthusiasts contributed more than \$13,500 to the new Lord Chamberlain Society of the Virginia Shakespeare Festival.

But members of the Society contributed much more than financial help during the successful but hectic 1981 season.

Few cast or crew members left Williamsburg at the close of the season without knowing a number of Lord Chamberlain members as very special friends.

Although less than six months old when the Festival began, the Society organized quickly to find support for the artistic enhancement of the Festival. New "bonuses" during the 1981 season—the guest artist, three exciting sets, more lavish costumes, and the return of the ever-popular Terry Aselford—were all made possible by Lord Chamberlain donations.

The advisory board of the Society, under the leadership of co-chairpersons Bob and Lois Hornsby, hosted three lively receptions for members, cast and crew following each opening night performance. The costumed performers were able to meet and to greet their most avid fans and join in numerous champagne toasts.

During mid-season, the Society also staged the Festival's first "appreciation" night for members of the James City County Board of Supervisors, Williamsburg City Council and other government organizations which offered help to the Festival during 1981. After an Italian-theme dinner, the Hornsbys tapped two honorary members of the Lord Chamberlain Society—artistic director Kent Thompson and general manager Patrick Micken.

To boost ticket sales as the season entered the final stretch, Lord

Chamberlain members helped to increase public contact points by arranging to establish Festival information tables at a number of locations, including the Williamsburg Pottery Factory.

Meanwhile, the vice-chairpersons of the Lord Chamberlain Society, Bob and Ann Cowling, were hosting brunches in their home for hungry young cast members, who were beginning to miss the wonders of home cooking.

The Virginia Shakespeare Festival was also given an added boost by the creation of a new award for outstanding theatre students at the College which was established during the 1981 season to honor one of the College's

most respected alumni in the entertainment profession, Martin A. Jurow.

The Martin Jurow Award for Theatrical Excellence will be presented annually to a student at the College who plans a theatrical career and has demonstrated talent and enthusiasm for theatrical arts. The award will include a scholarship to be used to support the student's summer involvement in regional theatre, with preference to a student participant in the Virginia Shakespeare Festival. A special endowment has been established to support the award by Jurow's brother, Irving Jurow, and his wife Mae of Chevy Chase, Maryland. John Wesley Taylor,

a rising senior theatre concentrator from St. Stephens Church, Virginia, was named the first recipient of the Martin Jurow Award.

With more time to plan their efforts during 1982, the Lord Chamberlain Society hopes to increase support for the Festival by reaching out to more individuals and businesses. TAX-WISE WAYS OF GIVING

"So many people feel so close to William and Mary, and want so much to express in a meaningful way how they feel," says Bob Dutro, '69 J.D. director for estate planning in the office of university advancement. "To be able to suggest ways that loyal alumni and friends can express their love and appreciation to the College has got to be one of the most rewarding and enjoyable jobs in town."

Dutro, who joined the College in 1980, uses his legal background as well as his longtime association with the College to field a growing number of questions, from a wide variety of concerned individuals.

For instance, a successful surgeon is nearing retirement, and wants to feel secure in his old age. How can he best fulfill a heartfelt desire to give a major gift to his alma mater?

Another William and Mary graduate has reviewed his many property holdings and uncovered a real headache—a large downtown building which is nearly impossible to rent and requires extensive repair. How can this valuable property be given to the College to support student scholarships, and enable the investor to escape an extremely taxing situation?

A couple in New England has for years made an annual trip to the College, often enjoying the traditional appeal of the Wren Building and the President's House. Without children, the couple is concerned that their extensive collection of antiques and art will be scattered and uncared for upon their deaths. Is the College prepared to receive such gifts, and to offer a secure home for cherished family heirlooms?

The answers to all three of these questions focus on an increasingly popular method of demonstrating support for the College through careful estate planning.

"The only way many of the relatively new and innovative methods of deferred giving can be understood is to ask questions, and sometimes it takes a great deal of careful thought and planning to design a specific plan for an individual alumnus or friend," says Dutro.

Some of the most frequently asked questions concerning planned giving are included below, yet Dutro says each individual must consider his own particular situation, and come up with his own set of questions.

QUESTION: In planning a major estate gift to William and Mary, where should a person begin?

ANSWER: Before considering such a gift, we always counsel donors to seek the advice of their financial and legal advisors. They should also always ask themselves, "How can a gift help achieve my personal goals?"

QUESTION: I'm confused; can you just explain the options I have when considering a gift to the College?

ANSWER: In general, there are three basic methods of giving. The donor has a choice of a deferred gift, an outright gift or a gift by will.

QUESTION: Just what is a deferred gift?

ANSWER: This type of gift is popular with the donor who would like to make a substantial gift during his or her lifetime, but cannot afford to give up the income the gift property produces. One popular type of deferred gift is a charitable remainder trust.

QUESTION: How does the charitable remainder trust work?

ANSWER: In general, the donor transfers a gift to the College and a trust fund is set up. The trust pays the income produced by the assets to the donor, his wife and children during their lifetime. Then the assets of the trust go to the College.

QUESTION: Are there other forms of deferred gifts?

ANSWER: Yes, another popular method is a gift of a life insurance policy. A charitable income tax deduction is available upon assignment of benefits under the terms of the policy, with the amount of the deduction depending upon the value of the policy on the date of the gift. In addition, any premium paid after the gift is made may be treated as a deductible contribution.

QUESTION: Are there any advantages to an outright gift of cash?

ANSWER: Such gifts are most welcome to the College because of the immediate benefit they provide. A gift of cash is also the simplest to understand from a tax standpoint, as it provides a deduction up to a maximum of 50 percent of adjusted gross income in a given year. Any excess deduction may be carried over into the five years following the gift.

QUESTION: Is a cash gift the only way to make an outright gift?

ANSWER: Certainly not. Gifts of securities, real estate or other properties which have appreciated in value may provide a greater tax advantage. We've received an incredible number of unusual and extremely valuable items, which can be either used at the College or sold to provide much-needed cash.

QUESTION: Is it possible to contribute art or antiques to the College?

ANSWER: The College has been fortunate to receive a number of significant gifts of rare books, antiques and art through the years. Such gifts are normally deductible at their current market value at the date of the gift, and many are now prominently displayed on campus.

QUESTION: If you want to make a gift to William and Mary but simply can't afford a gift now, what can you do?

ANSWER: Perhaps you should consider a gift by will. A will is among the most personal of our possessions and should be considered and prepared

with special care. It should be drawn by your lawyer, who can tailor it to fit your personal situation.

QUESTION: Can a gift to William and Mary be added to an existing will?

ANSWER: Definitely. Your lawyer can help you to add a codicil to your will. In fact, now is an excellent time to review your estate plans, due to the major changes in estate and gift tax laws which are contained in the tax act of 1981. These are of such importance that you should review all documents relating to financial and estate plans with your lawyer as soon as possible.

QUESTION: How can I find out more?

ANSWER: I'm really here to answer questions, as is everyone in the office of university advancement. It is also a common occurrence for me to visit an alumnus or friend at his or her home, particularly if transportation or poor health is a problem. The first thing to do is to give me a call at 804/253-4391. Working together, you'd be surprised what good things can happen, both from the standpoint of the donor and the College.

Class of '40 Sweeps Two Giving Awards

Class of '38 Honored For 10% Giving Increase

The Class of '40 has won two of the three competitive annual giving awards for 1980-81 William and Mary Fund participation.

The Class of '54 award for the greatest percentage of increase in class participation will be awarded to the Class of 1940 for its 8.4% increase in donor participation in the Fund. Thirty-eight percent of the class participated, the highest percentage of participation among all competing classes.

The Class of 1940 will also receive the Board of Directors Award for the greatest overall improvement in fundraising. The group also showed the greatest jump in donors (31), the second largest increase in dollars (\$6,112), the largest dollar amount credited (\$14,299), and the third highest percentage in increased giving (75%) of all competing classes.

Class President Jack Garrett chaired the special Class of '40 appeal during its fortieth reunion year. Captain Garrett is also President of the Society of the Alumni.

The Class of 1938 will receive the Class of '25 Award for the highest percentage of increased class giving.

Last year the Class of '38 contributed \$3,496 to the William and Mary Fund, and this year it more than doubled its giving to \$7,233. This remarkable 107% increase placed it ahead of the Class of 1934, whose dollars increased by 86%.

The Class of 1934 received honorable mention for their \$6,392 (86%) increase in giving, and for its largest average gift per donor to the Fund (\$126.66).

In addition, special recognition was made of the following classes for their support:

Class of 1970: for 29 new donors;
Class of 1975: for 27 new donors;
Class of 1945: for 37.7% participation;
Class of 1937: for 31.4% participation;
Class of 1944: for a \$4,778 increase in giving, and the second largest average gift (\$106.36).

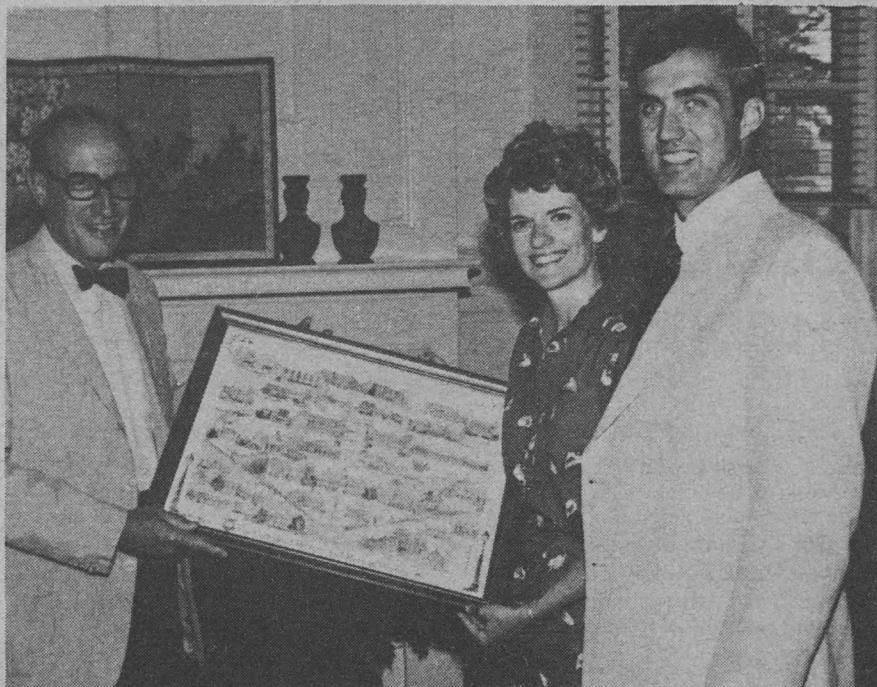

A New Wave of Alumni Leadership: COUPLES

Husband and wife spread out their notes and papers on the dining room table. Late into the night, they peer over countless names, writing letters to friends and acquaintances. They organize phonathons in their hometown, attend meetings and dinners—all to spread the word that the College of William and Mary needs alumni support NOW.

They are active, successful and vitally involved alumni couples who have helped turn the William and Mary Fund into a growing alumni giving program.



The Smiths

Willard Sanders Smith '44 and Jane Spencer Smith '48, who chaired the William and Mary Fund in 1979-80, set a trend that has become a key to William and Mary's successful appeal to alumni donors each year thereafter.

"Janie and I have always operated as a team," says Bill Smith of the couple's decision to serve as husband-and-wife fund-raising chairmen. "It was particularly fun for us because both of us are tied to the school—plus, three of our four children went there."

In their year as co-chairmen, the Smiths conducted a high-energy, fun-loving campaign that reminded alumni of the good times and inspired them to create even better times for the College. "We developed the idea of 'Making the 80's our Best Years Yet,'" recalls Bill. "Our goal for the campaign was to get a few of the older folks off dead center and churn up the alumni."

In past years, the Smiths said they "never felt people at William and Mary asked us enough" for financial help. "We both had been out of school many years, and all the appeals we had seen were really quite soft," says Bill. "We decided to tell people that their help really was needed in a direct way."

That direct campaign not only involved the creation of a catchy slogan, but also the hosting of a kick-off dinner for the fund complete with cheerleaders introducing the new slogan, balloons and t-shirts. "We had a lot of fun with the campaign," says Bill, "so much so, that our sons started saying, 'Ye gads, Mom and Dad, you're not exactly camera-shy!'"

In addition to the razzle-dazzle of the campaign, the Smiths backed up their creativity with hard work. Together they wrote between 800 and 900 personal notes asking for support to alumni friends and acquaintances. Although the Fund missed its goal of \$400,000, contributions increased by 12 percent.

"We were searching our way all the way through the campaign," Bill admits. "We were delighted with the results, although we would have liked to reach our goal of \$400,000. It was exciting to keep reaching new plateaus."

Looking back on that husband-and-wife effort, the Smiths are optimistic about the foundations they laid for the Fund. "The alumni seem more aware than ever before of the needs of William and Mary. I think they understand now that they have to get involved."

Like the Smiths, John Entwisle '44 and Marilyn (Miller) Entwisle '44 felt the need to motivate more alumni to contribute. As co-chairpersons of the William and Mary Fund for 1980-81, they, too, wrote hundreds of personal notes and letters, made hundreds of contacts.

"There are many advantages to a married couple doing this," says Marilyn. The Entwisles point out that not only can two people do twice the work, but also they know twice as many people.

"Another advantage of working as a couple was that we could discuss with each other what we are writing and how to approach different people."

Marilyn adds. The results of their thoughtful, intelligent approach to fund-raising was that many of their negative replies eventually turned into positive responses as the year progressed. The Entwisles based their appeal on the financial realities that face William and Mary. Academic programs, hard-hit by inflation and tightening state budgets, need private support more than ever to maintain high quality. "Private support is absolutely necessary if we're going to keep William and Mary the excellent university we know it to be. We tried to high-light that excellence in our appeal," says Marilyn.

Although the Entwisles say that they encountered "a mental block" from the private sector in supporting state universities, both acknowledge that the image of fund raising at state universities is changing—with help from concerned alumni.

"We must get out the message that state support cannot possibly do the whole job and maintain the excellence for which William and Mary is noted," Marilyn says. "We're going to preach that gospel as long as we can."

"And we expect to be involved in William and Mary," says John, "for many years to come."

Two people who appreciate the Smiths' and the Entwisles' continuing enthusiasm for fund-raising are Dr. Stewart Sell '56 and Patricia King Sell '58, chairmen for the 1981-82 Fund. Like their predecessors, the Sells are active, involved people who have decided to devote a year of hard work to the College.

"At first I had a little bit of fear at taking on the chairmanship of the Fund," says Pat. With four children still in school, the oldest at the College, she wondered if devoting so much time to fund-raising would be possible. "Then the idea of the challenge of it came next," she adds. "You find if you don't take the opportunity when it comes along, it may never come again."

After looking at some of the more successful alumni giving programs around the country, the Sells developed the idea of providing incentives for those who contribute to the Fund. A full color print depicting scenes of the campus will be sent to donors in appreciation of their gifts of \$100 or more to the 1981-82 Fund. Of course, the incentives are just the beginning of their campaign, which will consist of many appeals, contacts, and hard work.

"One of our first priorities is to carry on the tradition and high standards set by the Entwisles and the Smiths," says Pat.
