Society To Honor 6 With Alumni Medallion

Brickell, Giermak, Kinnamon, Muscarelle, Sands, McCormack To Receive Highest Society Award

Six distinguished members of the Society of the Alumni will receive the Alumni Medallion at Homecoming on Nov. 5-6 in recognition of their service to the College, community and nation.

The six include five alumni who are being awarded the Alumni Medallion this year and Mark H. McCormack '51 who will be at the College to accept the Medallion that he was awarded last year but could not be available to receive it.

The other recipients are Dr. Edward E. Brickell, Jr. '50, former rector of the College and superintendent Virginia Beach, Va., schools; Chester F. Giermak '50, Erie, Pa., president and chief executive officer, Eriez Magnetics Company; Jeanne S. Kinnamon '39, Williamsburg, a member of the Board of Visitors and a generous benefactor of the College; Joseph L. Muscarelle '27, Hackensack, N.J., chairman of the Board of Joseph L. Muscarelle, Inc., and the prime benefactor of the Joseph L. and Margaret Muscarelle Museum of Art now under construction at the College; and Dr. George D. Sands '39, Williamsburg, retired chief of the Scientific and Technical Information Programs Division, NASA, Langley Research Center.

Dr. Brickell, who received his M. A. from the University of Chicago and his E.Ed. from William and Mary in 1973, has been superintendent of the Virginia Beach schools since 1968. A former administrative assistant to the President at the College, he was superintendent of schools in Franklin, Va. from 1962-65 and assistant superintendent in the Virginia Beach school district and director of secondary education 1966-67. A recipient of many awards, he was named one of the nation's top 100 school administrators in 1980. He has been a member of the Board of Visitors since 1976 and served as rector from 1978 to March, 1982.

Giermak, a member of the Athletic Hall of Fame and a former member of the Board of Directors of the Society of the Alumni (1967-73), joined the Eriez Magnetics Co. in 1960 and worked his way up to the top job by 1971. A former All-American basketball player at William and Mary, he is a member of several boards of directors of businesses. He is a member of the President's Council, the Order of the White Jacket, of which he is a board member, and a trustee of the Endowment Association. Three Giermak

children have graduated from William and Mary and a fourth is now a student at the College.

Mrs. Kinnamon, who was appointed to the Board of Visitors in March, is a former teacher and vice president of Boundary, Inc., a builder of townhouses in Williamsburg. She and her husband, Gilbert T. Kinnamon '34, made a substantial gift to the College for the construction of the Muscarelle Museum and are benefactors of William and Mary in many different ways. A member of many boards, including the Board of Trustees of the Endowment Association, Mrs. Kinnamon is a charter member and former secretary of the President's Council and a member of the Lord Chamberlain Society of the Virginia Shakespeare Festival. In 1976, she and her husband established the Sheridan-Kinnamon Scholarship at the College.

Muscarelle, who is chairman of the board of one of the nation's largest building firms, has been honored many times for his charitable and civic contributions which include the Joseph L. Muscarelle Center for Building Construction Studies at Fairleigh Dickinson University in New Jersey. Among his awards is the Pope John Paul II Humanitarian Award from

Seton Hall University. Muscarelle has been a member of the Order of the White Jacket since 1977.

Dr. Sands retired in 1979 from distinguished career in the nation's space program which included nearly 20 years with NASA's Langley Research Center. A member of the Board of Visitors from 1970 to 1978 and of the Board of Directors of the Society of the Alumni from 1959 to 1966, he served as president of the Society in 1965. Dr. Sands was an associate professor of chemistry at William and Mary from 1948 to 1956. He received the NASA Exceptional Service Medal in 1977 and the NASA Sustained Superior Performance Award in 1967.

McCormack is founder, president, and owner of International Management Group, Inc., a complex of companies specializing in athletic management and sports promotion with offices around the world. McCormack, who established the Mark H. McCormack Scholarships at William and Mary for men's golf and women's tennis in 1977, was elected to the William and Mary Athletic Hall of Fame in 1969. He is a member of the Board of Trustees of the William and Mary Endowment Association and the President's Council.

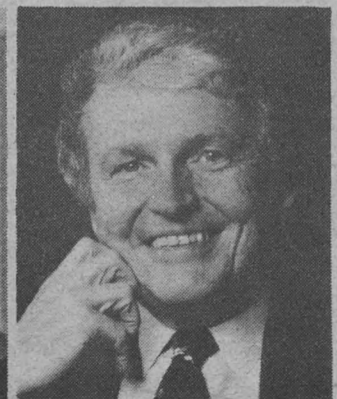

College Pays Governor "Quitrent" At Burgesses Day

State Officials Visit William and Mary For Society Of Alumni Sponsored Event

Governor Charles S. Robb and Lt. Gov. Richard J. Davis '42 headed a list of distinguished state officials and legislators who came to William and Mary on Sept. 18 to attend Burgesses Day, sponsored annually by the Society of the Alumni.

The festivities began at 11 a.m. with a reception outside of William and Mary Hall, after which the guests stepped inside the hall for lunch and a short program. After lunch, they were bussed to Cary Stadium where they watched William and Mary defeat VMI 24-12.

In welcoming the state officials to campus, Dr. Marvin West '52, president of the Society of the Alumni, noted that "the tradition of the College hosting the General Assembly dates back to 1699, when the General Assembly held its meetings in the ancient Wren Building, the oldest academic building in continuous use in our country."

"Many of our alumni were active in those early governments, as they have continued to be through the centuries, as they are today," said Dr. West. "In continuing this event we are proud that it represents in part our record of service to both the Commonwealth and to the College for the past 140 years."

The highlight of the program was the presentation to Governor Robb of two poems translated into Latin by Dr. J. Ward Jones, chancellor professor of classics, from verse composed by Fay P. LeCompte '30 of Portsmouth. According to the Royal Charter, the College is required to present Latin verse to the Governor of Virginia every four years in lieu of the quitrent for 20,000 acres tendered to the College by King William III and Queen Mary II. The Charter states the verses will be in full payment for all "customs dues and burdens whatsoever, due or to be due to us or our successors." President

Graves jokingly suggested that the verses might serve in lieu of a five per cent budget cut that William and Mary and other state agencies have been ordered to make by the Gover-

nor. Robb replied in a light vein that he would agree to the suggestion if the College would accept verse from the state in place of tax dollars for its budget.

The program concluded with Dr. West presenting Robb and Davis with William and Mary Tribe coaching caps which both state officials put on for pictures.

Board Takes Several Actions

Board Names Outstanding Chapter; Accepts Conference Center Plans

A number of actions were taken by the Board of Directors of the Society at its semi-annual three-day meeting, held September 16-18, at the Alumni House.

The Outstanding Chapter Award was given to the Baltimore-Annapolis Chapter, the 1981 winner, on a very close vote over the Northern Virginia chapter.

The Board reviewed and accepted plans for a proposed Alumni House Conference Center which will more than triple the size of facilities at the multi-use Alumni House and provide the entire college campus with more adequate conference, seminar, and general meeting facilities, some overnight accommodations for visiting alumni and faculty, as well as space for the expanding Alumni merchandising program. The plans and pro-

posals are the work of John F. Morton, Jr., '58.

A number of new items in the merchandising program were reviewed and the board requested implementation of a catalog to be made available to all alumni.

The recently completed Self-Study was received and will be discussed in greater detail by the Executive Committee as it begins to implement recommendations of the study.

John H. Garrett, Jr., '40, immediate past president of the Society, was named to compile a policy manual for the Board. Andrew Parker JD '69 and Dr. Marvin West '52 were named to the Tri-Centennial Committee with a third person to be named from the incoming Board members who will be elected on Homecoming weekend.

That Homecoming Spirit

Homecoming is a special time for any college. For William and Mary it is a very special occasion, because of the size and unique character of the school, the beauty of the campus, the warmth that comes to all of us who have experienced the special feeling that comes from being a student here, which becomes a stronger part of our lives with each passing year.

Homecoming is a coming home, a fun reunion not only with friends, but with a place that occupies a treasured niche in our memories.

One of the reasons I came to the College was a Homecoming for someone else. While getting a physical for a series of college applications a medical resident filling in for our old family doctor noted the one for William and Mary, and said "of all the people I met in medical school the only ones who went back to their undergraduate school for a homecoming were two guys from William and Mary. That must be a special place." I think that was what swayed me to Williamsburg. And as events proved, he was right. Now here I am, responsible for Homecoming for others.

For the first time in recent memory every one of the reunion classes will be having a hospitality suite as well as several non-reunion year classes. The latter group is led by the Class of 1939, who have their own reunion *each and every year*. They lead the parade in ideas and enthusiasm for reunions.

You will notice several changes this year. We hope we have solved the problems for the Saturday Luncheon on the Lawn. There will be twice as many cooks and twice as many lines. If you are worried about getting out of line for your reunion class photograph you can relax. This year the reunion class will be let through a special line immediately after their picture. This way you don't have to worry about the line, and all of you can eat together.

As we noted in last month's ALUMNI GAZETTE the Sunset Ceremony is being changed to give it more of a reunion class touch. As a part of this very moving event, featuring the Queens Guard and the College Choir, the names of all reunion class members who have died since the last class reunion will be read. A member of the class will carry the class banner behind the Queen's Guard during the procession.

The Homecoming Parade is also showing some streamlining. This year the parade will begin at the Capitol, at the end of the Duke of Gloucester Street, promptly at 10 a.m. and, proceeding only one time up the street, will turn at College Corner and continue on Richmond Road to the Alumni House, disbanding in the stadium area. The judging stand will be in the Blow Gym area. The Society feels this will encourage more alumni to attend the President's Continental Breakfast at the President's House, and bring the parade closer to the campus.

The Saturday night dance will be in old Blow Gymnasium, scene of College dances for so many years. The band will feature Big Band sounds and should provide a nostalgic background for the BYOL event.

With the exception of 1983, when Homecoming will be on October 22, future Homecoming weekends have been moved into early November. There are several reasons for this change in general policy. First upcoming football schedules have helped dictate such a move. Secondly, the College now has a fall break schedule in mid-October. To have Homecoming during that time would have precluded active student participation in the weekend, and since it is jointly an alumni and student event the Society felt both groups should be encouraged to enjoy it and take part.

All alumni, not just reunion classes, are welcomed back. Even though it is not your reunion year, there are those in such classes you are sure to know. Come back and enjoy a weekend in Williamsburg. There is nothing like the fun and excitement of a college campus on a football weekend... and there is a special magic walking on the brick walks under the trees of this Camelot of campuses.

If you are a contributor to any of the funds of the College you should have received a ballot to vote for the Alumni Board of Directors. Five persons will be elected. These people are a part of the only elected Board that is a part of the College, and as such have a special responsibility in the ongoing life of William and Mary. Exercise your suffrage. Cleveland Francis "Keeps The Music Going"

Talented Alumnus, Now A Cardiologist, Balances Medicine and Music

William and Mary leaves a lasting impression on its students.

But the reverse is also true: William and Mary is alive with memories of the many students who have left their mark as individuals. Often extraordinary students come along who light up the College community like Haley's Comet because of their exceptional gifts, and they are remembered on campus for years to come.

One of those people is Cleveland Francis Jr. ('69 M.A.), who arrived in Williamsburg in 1967 armed with a B.A. in pre-medical zoology from Southern University in Baton Rouge, ready to do graduate work in biology.

Francis found something else at William and Mary: a talented singer, he developed a style of music that fit beautifully, and much of this innovation blossomed, he says, because of the atmosphere at the College. Performing with his new sound in concert at the College and around the Tidewater area, the young graduate student gained both fans and a solid reputation for talent.

As he neared completion of the M.A. in biology, Francis put aside thoughts of Ph.D. work in that field to pursue a new goal: to become a doctor. He is now in private practice in Northern Virginia as a cardiologist and practitioner at the Mount Vernon Hospital, where he is director of cardiac rehabilitation as well.

As Dr. Francis himself says, however, he has "kept the music going," through his rigorous medical studies at MCV, an internship, residency and fellowship at George Washington University Hospital in Washington -- and now, through a demanding daily schedule that means the difference between life and death for many of his patients.

"I deal with a lot of emergency medicine, like cardiac arrests, and it's good to get away and relax with my music," says Francis. For him, getting away and relaxing with his guitar doesn't mean just sitting in his living room and strumming.

He's still actively involved in public performance and has performed for the last five years at Singer's Studio in Georgetown. Currently he appears on a periodic basis at the Sherry Cafe in Washington.

Most people would find the combination of a medical practice like Dr. Francis's with performing to be almost impossible to manage, but this alumnus doesn't.

"I have kept the music going because I had it before I got into medicine," Cleveland Francis says. "I did a couple of concerts at the College for the Martin Luther King Scholarship Fund, and I did some benefit performances for the P.O.W. movement while I was at medical school (the Medical College of Virginia). I have always had a love for music, and it doesn't conflict with medicine."

A member of the Virginia Medical Society and the Alexandria Medical Society, the 37 year old cardiologist says that his medical practice is very broad-based because of the international population of Washington.

Although he is in Washington, Francis still takes the time to return to Williamsburg because his mother, Mrs. Mary B. Francis; a sister, and several friends live in the city. Two of those friends are also William and Mary professors whom Francis de-

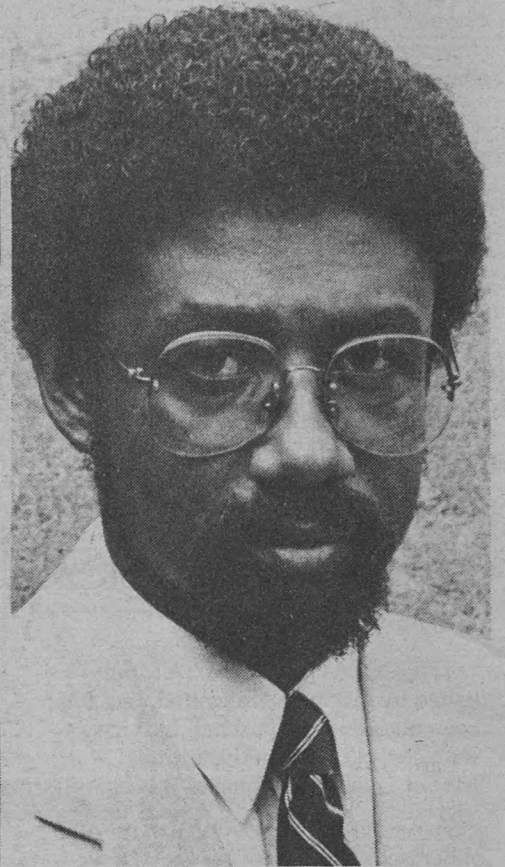
scribes as "very important" to him: Garnett "Jack" R. Brooks Jr., professor of biology, and Victor A. Liguori, associate professor of sociology.

It was Brooks and Liguori who encouraged Francis early on in his singing as a graduate student at the College, listening, criticizing, and modestly financing his recordings.

like Bob Dylan," comments the singer, who usually accompanies himself on the guitar. Even so, one Francis/Liguori song, "Forgotten Men," sung at a P.O.W. rally in Richmond in the early 1970's, earned the approval at that time of Mrs. Jeremiah Denton, wife of the Junior U.S. Senator from Alabama and a former P.O.W. in North Vietnam.



Although he helped to finance Francis's single because he believed in his musical ability, Dr. Jack Brooks downplays his role.

"It was a simple little thing, nothing to take credit for," Brooks says, "He's a very good singer, and if Cleveland hadn't become an M.D., he would have made it singing."

Part of what makes this friendship one of mutual respect is that Brooks was also Francis's major professor while he was a student at the College.

"I guess I was his first contact, as I was chairman of graduate studies in the biology department," says Brooks. Of the 10 or 11 graduate students Brooks has supervised, he says that "Cleveland is the most talented from an artistic standpoint."

In his sophomore year at Southern University in Baton Rouge, Francis gained the enthusiastic support of Dr. Huel Perkins, then head of the University music department, who arranged his first concert before music majors and members of the faculty. During his senior year, Francis began writing his own songs, some of which he recorded during his graduate student years at the College.

From a scientific standpoint, Francis also did well at William and Mary, having his Master's thesis published in a scientific journal, *Comparative Biochemistry and Physiology*.

"He was working on determining the function of the third eye -- the parietal eye -- of lizards, and he did a pretty good job," says Brooks with professional pride about his former student.

Liguori met Francis in the Fall of 1967 while Cleveland was singing in the Cave, across the street from campus. He also sang frequently in the Forge, a College coffee house.

"In February, 1969, Cleveland appeared in concert with guitarist and fellow biology graduate student David Gapp," says Dr. Liguori. "The two drew a crowd to Phi Beta Kappa

Hall that would have narrowed the fire marshall's eyes."

While at William and Mary, Francis recorded both a single and an album in the style he called "soul folk." "Louisiana is not really known for folk music," says Francis "and not many people sing folk there. When I came to the College, I called the music 'soul folk', because it had a soulful ring to it -- it was a new sound, and people liked it."

Cleveland Francis's "easy listening" style also has another more important fan -- his wife, Elizabeth. "Elizabeth is not a musician, but she's a fan, and very supportive of my musical side." Also a graduate of the Medical College of Virginia, she is a physical therapist.

Although Francis has written songs and co-written several with Liguori, he says that he would rather reinterpret other people's songs. "Harry Chapin is my favorite, and I

Looking back at his own William and Mary "experience," Cleveland Francis remembers that he was "one of only five blacks on the entire campus."

"I anticipated a great deal of cultural and emotional adjustment, coming as I did from Louisiana," he says.

"It wasn't easy," he adds, referring to the social and the academic experience at William and Mary, "but I found the people at the College very receptive and the campus more relaxed than I had expected."

Francis is very comfortable with his dual identities.

"I have always been interested in science; for a long time I have had a sensitivity about professionalism. I remain a cardiologist to those who have physiological heart problems; to those who come to hear me on stage, I'm a singer and interpreter of songs -- a musician."

Jeff Powell: "The Nashville Flash"

Tribe Football and Track Star Excels Over Summer In International Track Meets

When Jeff Powell of Nashville, Tenn., arrived at William and Mary last year as a freshman running back, he was quickly tagged with the nickname, "The Nashville Flash."

In little more than a year, Powell, a tailback on the football team and a hurdler for the track team, has shown just how well deserved that nickname is. As a freshman, he quickly broke into the starting backfield of the Tribe football team, reeling off 435 yards as the team's second leading rusher while scoring five touchdowns, including a 54 yard romp against Dartmouth. In the Tribe's first win this year, a 24-12 victory over VMI, Powell scored two touchdowns, including one on a 29-yard pass from quarterback Stan Yagiello. His other touchdown came on a one-yard leap over the VMI line after he had set the TD up with a 19-yard run. As a member of the track team, Powell made it all the way to the NCAA Indoor Championships in the 60-yard hurdles and was an All-East Selection, running the 100-meter dash in 10.5.

Powell, who has been clocked at a sensational 4.35 in the 40-yard sprint in football, is the fastest football player William and Mary has ever had. If he doesn't run up big yardage as a sophomore, it will only be because Jimmie Laycock's pass-oriented offense uses the run sparingly.

A pre-med/psychology major, Powell, whose father is a distinguished Nashville pathologist, has to think a bit before he singles out his favorite sport -- and probably both Coach Laycock and track coach Roy Chernock hope he never chooses one over the other.

"Honestly, I am not sure I could say I like one sport better than the other," says Powell. "It's not one or the other. The team effort and atmosphere of football is like no other sport. It's something special. The cliché, thrill of victory and agony of defeat, is so true.

"In track, it is more of an individual thing. A one-on-one situa-

tion. The ups are yours, the downs are yours. Hitting that finish line is an incredible feeling."

A 5-10, 180-pound, Powell enjoyed plenty of that "incredible feeling" on many occasions during the Spring and Summer. In fact, his summer provided notoriety and achievement on the national and international level.

Following his NCAA Indoor Championship appearance and All East selection in the spring, Powell was primed for the 110 meter hurdles in the Junior National Championships in June.

One of the entrants he ran against was Boris Pendergrass, who, like Powell, doubles in football (wide receiver) and track, at Rutgers. Jeff finished second (14.04) to Pendergrass (14.03) and made the national squad. For the remainder of the summer, Powell was the top finishing American in every race he ran.

Powell next traveled to Houston where the USA team met Canada. He took top honors in the 110 hurdles in the time of 13.90, his best performance ever.

"I really felt good and everything just clicked," reflected the Tribe standout.

Next stop for the USA team was Caracas, Venezuela, and the Junior Pan American Games.

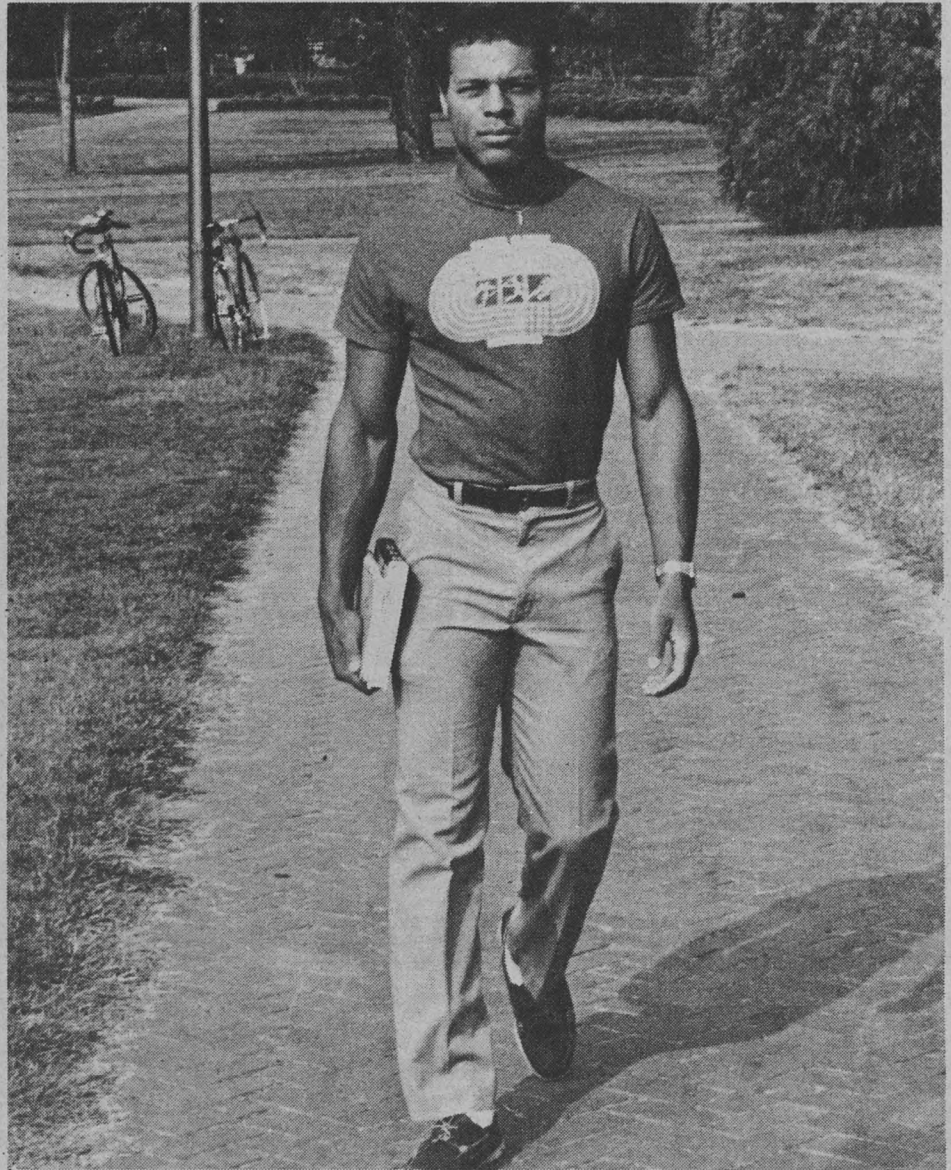
"What a trip that was. We had a full week there. The sites were unbelievable and the competition was great."

Powell, who aspires to be a doctor, lost to the Cuban runner in a very close finish (14.00 to 14.05) before some 10,000 spectators. "I thought I should have won."

After the Pam Am Games a select team was chosen to represent the U.S.A., in the World Junior Games in Korea.

"You talk about thrilled. I was one of 11 chosen."

So, it was off to Korea to compete against the teams from 22 other countries. The World Junior competition, in which one must be 19 or

younger, represented a host of future Olympians.

"The Korean fans took their track seriously," he says. "We had a driving rain during much of the competition and over 15,000 people were in attendance."

Like South America, Korea left some strong impressions on Powell.

"It was somewhat of a contrast. Homes were clustered on top of each other on hills and of course the rain in Korea didn't help."

The hurdler Powell rose to the occasion. "I was in great shape. Mentally I was 100 percent ready."

He proceeded to win the 110 meter hurdles in a personal best ever time of 13.74.

"You talk about an exhilarating feeling. All those people cheering your success. That was truly a magic moment in sports for me."

To add icing to the cake, Jeff was the leadoff leg on the U.S., 4x100 relay team. They won it all (41.60).

"The friends I made. The places and people I saw. It was an unforgettable experience," said Powell, who clearly established himself as one of this country's premiere sprinters.

Jeff returned from Korea in August and quickly came to campus for pre-season football camp.

"I missed the first couple of days of practice and upon my return to Williamsburg I had to get my other

muscles used to the other sport," he said.

What does the picture have in store for this most talented student-athlete?

"Right now it's my studies and football. I want very much to go to medical school after graduation and as far as football, we have the makings for a good season."

"Next June I want to compete in the national seniors meet. If I'm fortunate enough to do well and make the team, the summer would be spent competing in Europe."

Just about everyone knows 1984 is an Olympic year. The mention of that kindled a spark in Jeff's eyes.

"The events of the next year will be very significant to my determining a future course," concluded Powell who chose William and Mary because of its "outstanding academic programs and the opportunity to compete in both football and track."

The thought is of one 19-year-old youngster whose near future could include Olympic competition, pro football and medical school.

These are no ordinary tasks by any standards.

But then, Jeff Powell has already shown he is an extraordinary individual whose accomplishments have carried the College of William and Mary's banner far and wide.

Women's Field Hockey Receives "Green Carpet Treatment"

Returning Team Members Find Barksdale Field In Excellent Condition

"Thanks for the green carpet treatment." That's what the card said. No, the printer wasn't confused or color-blind; the card's senders had crossed out the word "red" and (for they) replaced it with the other hue. What they, the senders, who happened to be the members of the 1982 hockey team, were gratefully alluding to was the excellent condition of their playing field. The recipients, who happened to be Landscape Supervisor Roy Williams and the William and Mary grounds crew, were moved by their expression.

"We've never really received appreciation like that before," commented Mark Whitney, grounds supervisor and turf management specialist. "It really meant a lot to us."

This past July, Williams and Whitney et. al. began systematic renovation of Barksdale Fields. They selected the two striking circles of the varsity field as test areas. Then, the crew removed the old, highly compacted, weed-ridden earth and installed new sod in its place. The latter contained an improved Bermuda-grade grass called "Vamont," which is expected to be more durable under the wear and tear of the sports season, as well as that of winter weather.

"The field is in the best condition it's ever been in since I've been here," said fourth-year coach Jean Stettler, who became head coach last season, "Roy Williams did a terrific job."

One player remarked, "The field looks beautiful. It looks like a putting green." Another exclaimed, "It looks like Astro-Turf!"

Barksdale "lawn-lift" isn't over yet. Herbicide treatment is scheduled for February and eventual renovation of the irrigation system will finalize success. Whitney predicts that by the end of the current growing season, improvement will be one-hundred percent over last year.

Coach Stettler is hoping to see similar improvement by the end of this field hockey season. The Indians who were 6-7-4 in '81 and finished fourth in the state tournament, have their sights set on regaining national status.

"We'd like to be among the twelve teams to play in the first-round of the national tournament," Stettler stated. With tough matches against Division I powers West Chester, Maryland, Old Dominion and Connecticut slated for this month, William and Mary should be well-primed by tournament time.

Basia Deren is back to lead the Tribe attack. The fourth-year veteran began the season with 52 career goals, only 9 short of breaking the school record. The senior standout will be joined by junior forwards Karen Thorne and Lisa Fuccella. Thorne, at right wing, upped her own position among William and Mary All-Time scoring leaders from sixth to fifth with her game-winning goal in the Tribe's opening victory over Ohio State (2-1). Fuccella tallied an assist on the shot.

The Tribe has a solid core of mid-field players returned in junior Meg

Donahue and sophomores Sheila Cunneen and Heather Grant. Defensively, the team boasts experience in senior captain Susan Aldworth, junior Chris Paradis, and sophomores Maryellen Farmer and Kim Stewart. Sophomore Cristi Galan, who saw limited action last season, and freshman Susan Creigh are tending goal.

Tennis player Cherie Dow also received a card last month. Just two days before she was due back at

losing both to pro-hopeful Sheryl Maskell.

Though Dow has had minor bouts with tendonitis, she had never before been prevented from playing. "At first, I was really disappointed," she said, "I like to play when I'm at school. It's hard when the team goes away on weekends and I'm not with them."

"It's hard for them, too," she added, "But, they've been really great, really supportive. And, so has our new coach."

Elizabeth Sharp, the Tribe's new mentor, had barely been in Williams-burt two weeks before she received the bad news. Sharp, a former North Carolina assistant coach and University of Tennessee star, and the team held a dinner for Cherie following the team's opening wins over Georgetown (7-2) and George Washington (8-1), which was where Cherie received her get-well card.

While waiting for the go-ahead from the doctor and her foot, Dow has kept busy lifting weights, swimming (she had to tie a buoy to her cast), bicycling and "doing lots and lots of push-ups." She expected to be back in the lineup this month, when the Tribe competes in the Tennis Life Tournament October 9th-10th.

Coach Ann T. Lambert's six golfers have two tournaments in store for them this month, one at Duke and the other at North Carolina. Sophomore Anne Bierman, a 1982 All-American, and senior Mary Ellen Fedor, an '82 national-qualifier, are leading this year's squad along with newcomer Terri Carneal, a freshman from Edina, Minn. Returning senior Wendy Rilling, sophomore transfer Kathy Erdahl, whose brother Ken plays on the William and Mary men's team, and freshman Alison Seyler, from West Allenhurst, N.J., round out the roster.

The Tribe volleyball team is out to dominate its opponents this season. New coach Cindy Laughlin has seven junior and senior veterans, as well as height, quickness and good all-around skills among her ranks. The team will vie for its respective VIL title at VCU in November.

Exploring "The Historical Gem Of The Caribbean"

Anthropology Department Establishes Field School On St. Eustatius In West Indies

Residents of Sint Eustatius call their island the "Historical Gem of the Caribbean," and there is one professor at William and Mary who emphatically endorses that title.

Two years ago, Dr. Norman Barka, chairman of the department of anthropology, began a field school on St. Eustatius for students from William and Mary and several other universities in the United States and Canada. He and his students have found literally "tons" of artifacts on the island, which was a key port during the 18th century for both European and American ships.

"Historically," says Dr. Barka, "there are probably more ruins on St. Eustatius than on any other island in the West Indies."

While St. Eustatius is a small island, only five miles long and two miles wide, it emerged as the most important free port in the Caribbean during the period when America was winning its independence. "Everything was sold, both legally and illegally," says Barka, "including the gunpowder that helped America with its Revolution."

Its history, which began in 1636, is what makes St. Eustatius so valuable to archaeologists, especially archaeologists like Barka whose special interest is early America.

The island, located about 160 miles southeast of Puerto Rico, was formed by volcanic eruption and consists of cones sticking out of the ocean floor at each end of the island, with a flat plain in between overlooking both the Caribbean and the Atlantic Oceans. A large inactive volcano on one end of the island, called the "Quill," has a rain forest inside its crater into which Barka and his students have descended during their research forays. In addition to learning about the geological formation of the island, the Barka teams have found evidence of Indian habitation that goes back several thousands of years.

But it is the history of the island in the 17th and 18th centuries that intrigues Dr. Barka even more because of what it tells about America during its formative years.

Only about 1500 people, most of whom have descended from Africans brought to the island in the 18th century, now live on St. Eustatius. But in its heyday, Barka notes, the island had a booming economy with possibly 8,000 residents, many of whom were involved in international trade characterized by a large complex of warehouses along the west coast of the island, known as the Lower Town. In 1776, in fact, the "Statians" became the first "government" to salute the American flag when an American ship, the *Andrew Doria*, came into port.

"Statians feel they have a very special relationship with America," says Dr. Barka, who notes that each year they commemorate the arrival of the *Andrew Doria*.

That relationship has proved invaluable to Barka, both when he and another William and Mary professor flew to St. Eustatius three years ago to arrange for the archaeological field school and subsequently when the William and Mary teams conducted

their research on the island. The government has provided free housing to Dr. Barka and his students, and the St. Eustatius Historical Foundation has given valuable logistical and organizational support for their research. The federal government of the Netherlands Antilles, through its Institute of Archaeology and Anthropology (AINA), has also helped to make the field school a success. In September, representatives of the Statia government visited William and Mary and paid their respects to President Graves.

In addition to the assistance of the Statians, the United States Navy has given support to the research by providing a Navy jet to take aerial photographs of the island and by bringing the artifacts found by Dr. Barka and his team back to Norfolk.

Dr. Barka and the Statians, of course, believe that the research will be mutually beneficial.

"One of the purposes of our research is to help the Statians themselves become more aware of their past and to help them see that their archaeological sites are not destroyed before they are investigated by professionals," says Dr. Barka. "This has been a very gratifying experience because we can see them becoming very proud of their past."

And a rich past, it is, says Dr. Barka, who notes that the Caribbean is one of the big unexplored areas for pre-historic and historic archaeologists -- an area "that I've been interested in because you have a lot of diverse islands that vary in size, vegetation, topography and culture."

"Many of them are relatively unspoiled," he adds. "On some, such as St. Eustatius, there has been little destruction of archaeological sites. For example, although St. Eustatius is small, there are possibly 600 to 700 sites of many different kinds that are still well preserved. They include warehouses, sugar plantations, military structures, and homes."

"So we have the possibility of learning how the English -- the same English who were coming to Virginia and other parts of the Eastern seaboard -- adapted to tropical conditions. We can also learn about Dutch culture during this time since St. Eustatius is a Dutch island, and about trade between Europe and North America during Colonial times. We are also hopeful that much can be learned about the Africans who lived on the island, since history records little of their way of life. There was also a good-sized population of Jewish merchants living on Statia in the 18th century. How did they live on the island? It goes on and on and on."

Although they have already found many important artifacts, Dr. Barka and his team of students have used their first two years mainly for exploration.

"We have tried to determine the variety of sites on Statia, how many there are, and where they are," he says. "There is so much there that we now need to really think about what can be done and then zero in on specific objectives."

Dr. Barka and his teams, which usually consist of about 30 students, spend six days a week "in the hot,

Caribbean sun" digging on the island. The climate is a good deal like Virginia, says Dr. Barka, "with the saving grace of trade winds and the beautiful, clear Caribbean water that you can jump in at lunchtime and after work."

So far, he says, his teams have surveyed a large part of the island, "walking the ground and looking for archaeological sites," of which they have turned up 500, most historical but some prehistoric. Along the west shore or Lower Town, the main port facility which consisted of as many as 600 warehouses, they have found evidence of at least 200 foundations. In addition, they have tested and dug unto the warehouse area, about eight feet deep, and found well-preserved remains of warehouse walls and other artifacts. By accident, the teams discovered a "rich trash deposit" filled with pottery, glassware, buttons, coins, animal bones and other debris that will provide important information about the inhabitants of the island.

The trips to St. Eustatius have not been without their thrills. Besides their research on St. Eustatius, which is one of six Dutch islands, the students have made side trips to other islands, including one called Saba, which consists of "literally the top of a cone with the people living in the crater of the volcano." Since there is no flat land, airplanes carrying visitors to the island have to land on slope from which a short landing strip about the size of an aircraft carrier has been carved out of the mountain.

The field schools have proven very valuable to Barka's students. Last year, for instance, he took four William and Mary graduate students, and three of whom will write their masters' theses based on research on the island. Undergraduates enjoy the island's archaeology, beautiful scenery, and friendly people.

In conjunction with the archaeological research, Dr. Eric Ayisi of the Department of Anthropology has been studying the present-day inhabitants of the island.

Dr. Barka served as editor of the *Society for Historical Archaeology Newsletter*, which goes to about 2000 members and libraries. He is also former president of the organization. Dr. Theodore Rheinhardt is past editor of the *Quarterly Bulletin For the Archaeological Society of Virginia*. He also has run a field school over the past several years on the Shirley Plantation in Virginia.

In other research areas, Dr. Vinson Sutlive, former department chairman, is an editor of an international journal called *"Studies of Third World Societies"* as well as editor of the *"Borneo Research Bulletin."*

But it is the St. Eustatius research that intrigues Barka for now.

"We will be going there for many years to come," he says.

Campus Perspectives

Academic Pressure: A Myth?

At a recent workshop for members of the Alumni Admissions Network, a great deal of attention was devoted to the issue of academic pressure. Students frequently talk about the pressure they feel and about the intensity of their quest for grades. What causes this pressure? What effect does the "pressure" have on our students?

The adjustment from high school to college is a big one for many of our students. Most are just not accustomed to working as hard as they must at William and Mary to achieve the success to which they have become accustomed. The old axiom that a student should spend at least two hours out-of-class for every hour in is still a valid one. But the high ability of most of our students has permitted them to graduate from high school at the top of their class while spending an average of only 10-12 hours per week in preparation. The increased workload they encounter at William and Mary is compounded by the averaging which takes place at the College. Almost 70% of our entering freshmen have been in the top 10% of their high school class. 70% cannot be in the top 10% of their graduating class at William and Mary. This is an issue at a selective college and does require adjustment. The current state of the economy has added new concerns about the importance of achieving high grades to secure the "right" job or entry to the "right" graduate or professional school. Much of the feeling of pressure can be explained by the interaction of these factors.

Without minimizing this feeling, the facts concerning the performance of our students are impressive. In 1982, only ten freshmen were dismissed for academic deficiencies. Annually for the past five years fewer than 2% of all students have been academically ineligible to continue. In spite of our lack of grade inflation, impressively, the average GPA of members of the senior class last year was 2.8 on a 4.0 scale. The College average was 2.66. The College also has an extraordinarily high rate of graduating its seniors in four years. The last study on this subject showed that the College graduated approximately 75% of its students in four years while the average for all State institutions in Virginia was 37%.

Given the ability of our students, several ingredients are essential for success at William and Mary. Hard work and self-discipline are two requirements. Support and encouragement are also important and a great deal of both is available. A Study Skills program teaches time management, note-taking skills, test taking techniques, and other strategies for academic success. A career planning program assists students in identifying life options and helps bring focus to the College experience. A counseling center is available both to help students through times of difficulty and to aid them in achieving a greater level of self-understanding. In addition to the traditional services of the Student Affairs staff and faculty advising system, 26 special advisors are available to counsel students with interests in particular academic and career programs. Lastly, and very importantly, William and Mary is still a warm and caring place. Time and time again when students are asked what they like most about the College, the response is "the people here." As much as anything, the relationships students develop provide a natural bridge against the impact of "the pressure." As William and Mary has grown, its capacity to be a supportive environment has not been diminished.

William and Mary is demanding. The pressure for some is very real. Almost everyone complains about it. But pressure is not always a negative quality. William and Mary students continue to achieve at an extraordinarily high level and with a great deal of personal satisfaction.

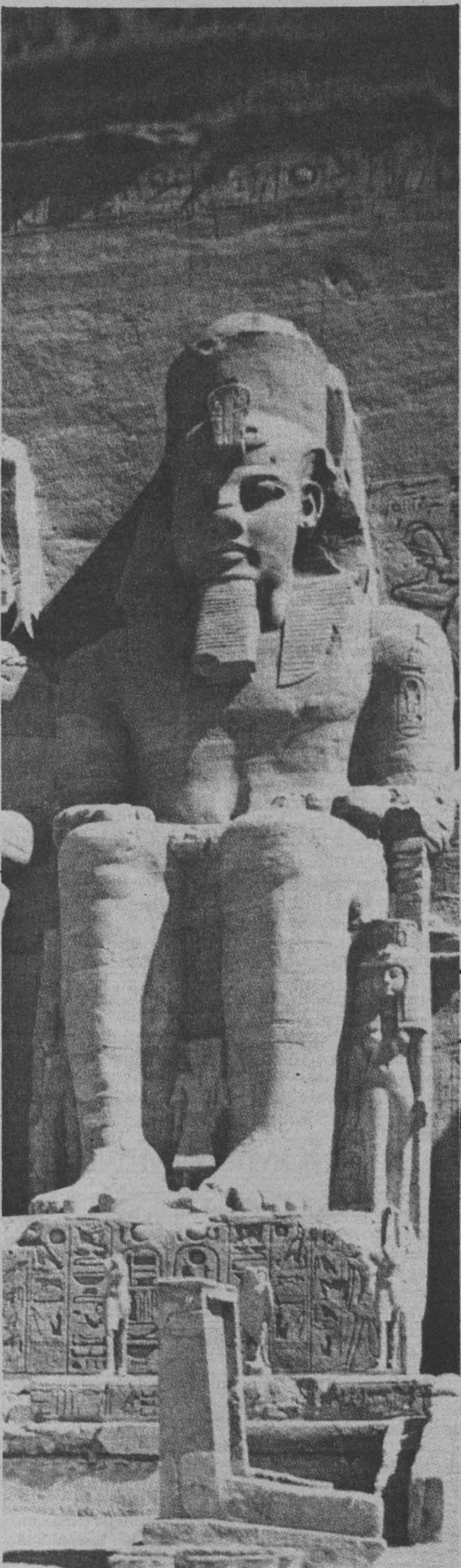

William and Mary: A "Communal Body"

Rector Encourages Collective Effort To Push College Forward

(Following is an address by Herbert V. Kelly '40 JD '43, rector of the College of William and Mary, at the first College-wide meeting of the 1982-83 year.)

I am delighted to be here today—to be a part of the initial meeting of what will be another outstanding year in the history of this great institution.

I was particularly pleased when President Graves asked me to participate in today's meeting. Fortunately and regretfully, I cannot say that it is nice to talk to some of my old professors: Fortunately, because they would say "I never thought that fellow would make it!" and regretfully, because I miss the opportunity to be with some faculty and friends I greatly admired and respected, and also because this situation emphasizes how old I've become.

Most particularly I am proud to be here because I have a great and abiding love for William and Mary. My association with this great college goes back to my boyhood days when, as a child growing up in Williamsburg, I played on its campus, scaling its wooden bleachers to see its football games and used its facilities (Blow Gym) its pools, and later its great library—and dated the girls.

Certainly no days of my life have been happier than those spent here as an undergraduate and as a law student.

Building upon the foundations established by my parents, this college molded my life. It gave me the capacity and opportunity for whatever successes I have found in life—not in just a monetary sense—but in an appreciation of the great joys of living.

Now, why do I tell you all of that? Although I know you know about the Board of Visitors, I would hope that it would give you some flavor of the character of its membership.

The members of the Board are almost exclusively graduates of William and Mary and, as such, I would suggest that in pure love and admiration, their enthusiasm for the college exceeds yours for it is a love nurtured in the formative age of their teens.

As a member of the Board of Visitors for almost 7 years, I can assure you that its members' hopes and aspirations for the college are the same as those of its faculty.

Admittedly our methods may be different, our approach to the problems may not always be the same, but the Board's ultimate goal coincides with yours in our efforts to preserve and enhance "the quality, the integrity, the reputation of the William and Mary degree."

We do believe that a university is a collective body of all of its people: Its students, its faculty, its staff, its alumni and its many friends. The communal person that is William and Mary must grow academically; it must also grow and develop in other ways. Just as the healthy, well-rounded person must grow and develop fully, with two eyes, two ears, and all of its appendages, so must the college grow. If it fails to develop and progress socially in its campus life, in its athletic life, in its relationship with its alumni, then it must suffer just as the

individual suffers who fails to develop one of his appendages. Without development in every way, its robustness fails to appear.

Certainly over the years the most apparent differences between the Board and the expressed attitudes of the faculty have had to do with athletics. The Board sincerely believes that athletics is a part of the college function. We recognize that athletics does have a part in our program and an impact upon our capacity to raise funds. In fact, I happen to believe that the greatest thing that could have happened to William and Mary football is its relegation to division 1-AA status because, as such, we can compete on a representative level with an opportunity for a sound and less expensive program.

You may rest assured that your Board recognizes that athletics is only a small part of the common body—a small contribution to the ultimate goal of our institution.

If we were to rely upon the media, we might easily conclude that a major part of the Board's endeavors involve football. Please be advised that this is not the case. I, for example, seldom miss a meeting of the Academic Affairs Committee. Unfortunately, the actual truth is that we spend the largest part of our time on money matters.

I do believe and hope that the faculty's problems with the Board have in the main been minor. I know that our present faculty liaison system is working. You are well represented by the members of your committee who present your views forcefully and straightforwardly. Whatever differences we do have are addressed in an honest fashion.

I entreat your continued use of the Academic Affairs Committee to foster our relationships.

Obviously, the greatest challenge to the Board is to somehow meet the ever-ascending needs for money in an environment of reducing availability from traditional sources. Rest assured that in this function, your Board is as active as any in this Commonwealth. Our need to find funds to support increases in academic salaries has been our number one goal these last seven years. This effort led to our first campaign for the college and now leads to a massive campaign in conjunction with our tricentennial celebration.

Our efforts over the last few years have had their success. We have to some degree improved our salary structure but there is, as you well know, much to be accomplished. Beyond this, we must now look more to the private dollar, and to these ends your Board has dedicated its efforts.

We search for more private funds—more endowments. In connection with the 1982-83 William and Mary Fund, the members of the Board of Visitors have personally committed to contribute over \$40,000.00 as a challenge fund to match dollar for dollar all contributions over \$600,000.00.

Our great love and respect for this proud institution spurs us in endeavors on its behalf.

We do so because we are convinced that the quality of the William and Mary degree lies in the quality of its people—that excellence and vitality of its faculty is the foundation upon which it stands. To that end, we know that we must bend every effort to improve our capacity to pay our faculty commensurate with its excellence.

We are dedicated to serving the needs of the people who teach, for we

must look to you, our faculty, to sustain the excellence that is William and Mary.

On this, the beginning of a new school year, the challenge to you is that, whatever our financial problems be, they not be allowed to jeopardize the quality of our educational program. We are blessed with a supply of excellent students and with a faculty which has demonstrated the capacity for excellence and quality.

The Costs Have Gone Up

Frank Moncure's Bill Was \$239 In 1906-07

It cost one fraternity man \$239 to attend William and Mary for the 1906-07 academic year -- a year which had an inauspicious beginning for Frank P. Moncure '09.

Almost as soon as he arrived in Williamsburg in September 1906, the faculty placed Moncure, a proud member of Alpha Zeta chapter of Kappa Alpha, on probation for "aiding and abetting" hazing -- and they formally notified his father of the action. How long the probation was enforced is unknown, but Moncure did attend the KA German dance during the Finals Weekend in June 1907.

Moncure's financial accounting, the faculty's letter of reprimand and a KA dance souvenir have all been kept in an informal family scrapbook, now owned by Moncure's grandson, Del. Thomas M. Moncure Jr. of Stafford.

Moncure attended William and Mary from 1905 to 1907. He was graduated from Georgetown. He later served in the Virginia General Assem-

bly, representing Stafford in 1936-37 and then from 1944 to 1956. He died in 1969.

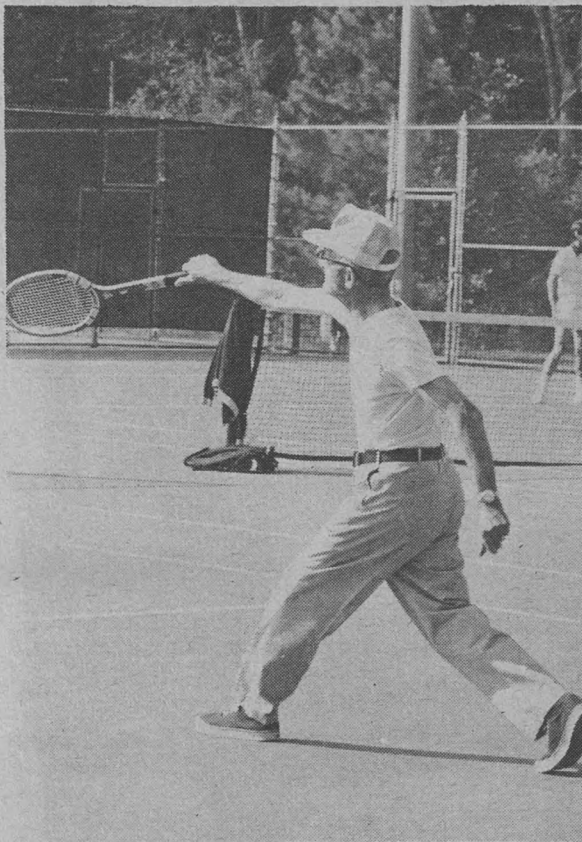
Moncure apparently went into debt while at William and Mary. His father, Dr. Walker Peyton Moncure, a Confederate veteran, gave him \$203.50 for his education in 1906-07 and others gave him \$35.50 -- and he spent every penny. His "matriculation fee" was \$28 and he spent \$5 for books and \$10 for a new raincoat and had \$1 "pocket money." Room and board were his largest expense, totalling more than \$127.

Moncure's account sheet doesn't list payment of any fraternity dues. Elsewhere in the scrapbook is a receipt, dated Feb. 24, 1910, from Kappa Alpha for \$3 in dues owed since 1906.

Costs have risen slightly since Moncure was at William and Mary. It now cost an in-state student approximately \$4300 per year.

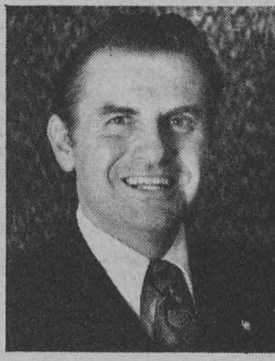

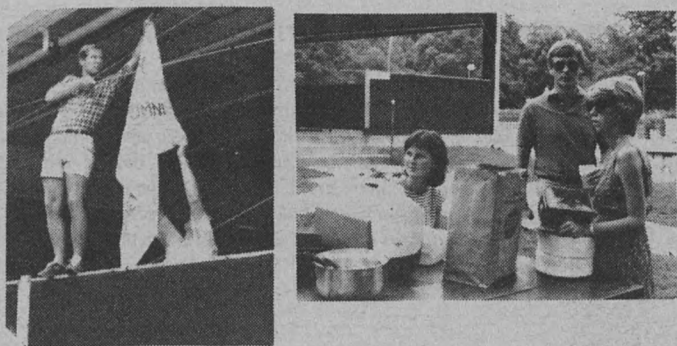

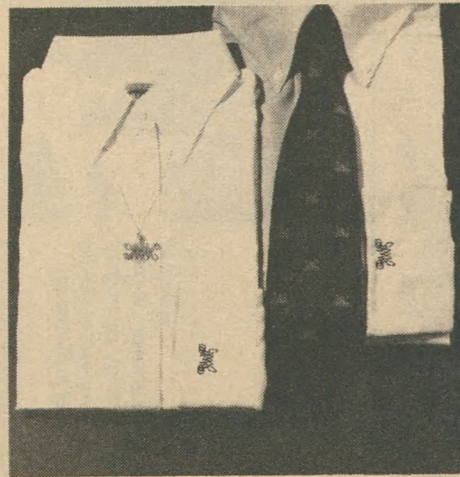

He worked for two years at the former Citizens and Marine Jefferson Bank in Newport News before joining Newport News Shipbuilding, where he was employed for 36 years, retiring in 1965. He was the Shipyard's paymaster for 20 years. He served for many years as treasurer of both the Peninsula Airport Commission and the Mariners Museum, retiring from the Airport Commission in 1972 and from the Museum in 1980. One of the founders of the Peninsula Airport in Hampton (which operated until shortly before Patrick Henry Airport opened), he was an active member of the First Presbyterian Church of Newport News. Survivors include his wife Helen, two daughters, and a sister.

Private Gifts Set Record

College Receives Nearly \$5 Million

The College of William and Mary received nearly \$5 million in private gifts in 1981-82, its highest total in history and nearly a 100 per cent increase over 1980-81.

The \$4,947,091 in private gifts exceeded the previous record of \$3,783,100 set in 1977-78 during the height of the Campaign for the College and was almost \$2.5 million more than last year when William and Mary received \$2,563,319.

"This was obviously a most gratifying year," said Thomas A. Graves, Jr., president of the College. "To have such a dramatic increase in private giving to the College, during a year when the economy did not perform well, indicates a strong faith on behalf of the donors, particularly our alumni, in the College of William and Mary."

The 1981-82 total included a record \$1,568,007 from 8288 alumni, which represented a \$600,000 increase over last year. The William and Mary Fund set a record for the second year in a row, totaling \$568,898 in cash with an additional \$35,318 in outstanding pledges for a total commitment of \$604,216.

Increases in other components of private giving were also dramatic:

*The Athletic Educational Foundation, which raises money to fund grants-in-aid for student-athletes, received a record total of \$622,102, a 38 per cent increase over last year's \$451,000.

*Foundation gifts, which included the two largest single gifts during the 1981-82

year, totalled \$1,556,548. The foundation total included grants from the William R. Kenan, Jr., Trust and the Alfred Wilson Lee and Mary I.W. Lee Memorial Trust. (See details elsewhere in this report).

*Corporate gifts increased by 27 per cent to nearly \$500,000 and corporate matching gifts were up by 100 per cent to \$155,000.

*Gifts from the "Friends of the College," under the leadership of J. B. Hickman of Williamsburg, one of the leading volunteers who helped the College during the year, increased by more than \$16,000 to top the \$100,000 mark for the first time.

*Gifts to the Women's Athletic Association, which initiated its first fund drive in history, totalled nearly \$22,000, surpassing its goal of \$20,000.

*Gifts-in-kind, represented by works of art, library books, antiques, and furnishings, exceeded \$644,000.

A \$750,000 gift from the Kenan Foundation to endow a professorship in the humanities was one of the largest foundation gifts in the College's history, while a \$1.75 million gift over 7 years from the Lee Trust to establish an Institute on Bill of Rights Law in the Marshall-Wythe School

Alumni Give Over \$600,000

W&M Fund Sets New High

Following a record-breaking 1980-81 year, the William and Mary Fund received \$568,898 in cash with an additional \$35,318 in outstanding pledges, for a total alumni commitment of \$604,216 on June 30, 1982.

This was a 13.6 per cent increase over the previous year's cash total. 1980-81 had represented a remarkable 26 per cent increase over the preceding Fund, rallying new donors to the cause for the National Endowment for the Humanities Challenge.

Headed by Co-Chairmen Pat King Sell '58 and her husband Dr. Stewart Sell '56, of La Jolla, Calif., and Houston, Tex., the

Fund showed an increase in the average gift from \$60 to \$74.

116 donors gave contributions of \$1,000 or more, as compared with 103 in 1980-81 and 67 in 1979-80. Contributors of \$500 to \$999 numbered 104, as compared to 94 last year and 1576 donors gave \$100 to \$400, as compared to the previous year's 1228 donors at that level. Gifts under \$100 decreased from 6041 in 1980-81 to 4986 this year.

The focus of the Fund's efforts this year was alumni pride -- pride in the College's quality, its national reputation, its famous alumni, and its long and prominent history. A medical school professor, Dr. Sell pointed to the College's academic standards:

"While at other universities grade inflation and lenient regulations for dropping courses have led to a lack of appreciation for scholarship and discipline," Sell said, "William and Mary's high academic standards, strict course requirements and discriminating grades continue to reinforce her status as an institution of the highest quality."

A former member of the Board of Directors of the Society of the Alumni, Pat Sell continued to stress not only the maintenance of William and Mary's quality, but the involvement of alumni in the future of their alma mater. The overall upward trend in giving, she feels, is indicative of a new awareness by involved alumni.

"We've come to recognize that the William and Mary Fund is the very backbone of private support for the College," she says. "In these depressed times, our gifts are crucial to keeping William and Mary at the forefront of quality educational institutions."

Director for Annual Support Jackie Crebbs '64 hailed the Sells as magnificent fundraisers. "These wonderful, dedicated alumni flew back to the College from California several times to get the job done,

Exceeds Goal AEF Receives \$622,101 To Set New Gift Record

The William and Mary Athletic Educational Foundation raised a record \$622,101.60 in cash and pledges during fiscal year 1981-82, a 38 per cent increase over last year's \$451,000.

"Our ability to raise this tremendous total is in direct proportion to the hard work of the some 100 volunteers who helped in the campaign," Austin L. Roberts III '69, president of AEF, commented.

"We set two goals, one to raise over \$600,000, and the other was to significantly increase our list of donors," Roberts added. "We accomplished both."

Sparked by an intensive campaign in the Spring to add new donors, the AEF list of donors totaled 2,300, up 20 per cent from last year's total of 1,912. The campaign got off to a great start through the "Big Bucks for the Big Green" campaign in the fall during which over \$400,000 was raised in just five weeks.

"We emphasized to our past donors that we needed their commitment now so that we could concentrate on new donors in the fall," said Barry Fratkin '64, director of development for athletics, explained. "They really responded well and consequently we were able to have the time and resources to concentrate on new gifts."

As in the past, the campaign was divided into areas across the State of Virginia and other states with goals for each area. Other states, headed by Richard V. Savage, '57, raised the most money, \$179,528, which was 115 per cent of its goal. Middle Peninsula, headed by Paul Massey, raised 111 per cent of its goal; Northern Virginia, headed by James E. Callahan '70, raised 109 per cent of its goal, and Richmond, led by Walter W. Stout '64, raised 107 per cent of its goal.

Areas that raised more than \$100,000 in addition to other states included Richmond (\$102,000) and Williamsburg (\$105,285) which was headed by Joseph Montgomery '73.

Every area raised a campaign high. Other chairmen included Duff Kliever '50 (Peninsula), Doug Henley '57 (Tidewater), Aubrey Mason, '72 and Nancy Spigel '55 (Western Virginia), Becky Vaughan '69 (Petersburg) and Henry Edwards '41 (Northern Neck).

A key ingredient in the 1982 campaign was the addition of a point system for workers in the campaign. Those who made

They also hosted a San Diego alumni chapter party to kick off the efforts of the William and Mary Fund, personally contacted 200 President's Council members on behalf of the Fund, and provided volunteers and Homecoming attendees with over 500 William and Mary Fund T-Shirts listing prominent alumni: "Thomas Jefferson, James Madison, James Monroe...and me!"

The increasing involvement of dedicated and prominent alumni, says Crebbs, is the key to the success of the Fund. The Sells follow another outstanding alumni team, Marilyn '44 and John '44 Entwisle, who led the alumni fund to its historic half-million dollar mark in 1980-81.

Assisting with the 1981-82 Fund effort were volunteer reunion class agents Dick Velz '36, Austin Roberts, Jr., '41, Pam Chinnis '46, Jim Kelly '51, Dr. Dick Blanchard '56, Susie Farrington '61, Gigi Schiff '66, David Bernd '71, and Glenn Gundersen '76.

Special appeals were also made by Dr. Billy Bickers '29 to all physicians, by Tom Farrington '60 to all attorneys, and by Lois Spratley Donald '44 and Jim Anthony '52 to all alumni with corporate matching gift benefits.

of Law was the largest gift in the College's history. The College received seven other gifts in excess of \$100,000 and 42 more from \$5,000 to \$100,000.

Unrestricted annual support for current operations-- those funds allocated for budgeted uses -- reached \$711,391.92, an increase of \$258,763, or 24 per cent, over the previous year. The balance of \$1,333,849 was designated for restricted purposes by the donors.

Gifts designated for capital support, primarily endowment and the Joseph and Margaret Muscarelle Art Museum now under construction, totalled \$2,901,850, or more than 50 per cent of all gifts. Almost \$2 million of the capital support was designated for endowment, of which \$1,274,979.57 was specifically designated for faculty salaries, which the College considers its top priority. A total of \$261,986 was designated for endowed scholarships and fellowships.

Duane A. Dittman, vice president for University Advancement, paid tribute for the record setting year to the hundreds of volunteers who contributed their time and talent and the 11,000 donors who contributed their hard-earned dollars.

"Volunteers, along with the generosity of our donors, are what insures the future of the College's high quality educational programs and the value of a William and Mary degree to society," he said.

Sissy Mason will tell you how consumed with William and Mary Aubrey Mason is.

She'll tell you how, on their wedding day, Valentine's Day 1948, the honeymoon had to wait until Aubrey had called a radio station to check the W&M/UNC basketball score.

But she'll tell you with an approving smile, for not only does she admire Aubrey's fierce loyalty to his alma mater, but she joins him in it.

Aubrey and Sissy Mason met and were married at the College, and he still enjoys teasing her about it: "It was the most expensive education I ever had!" The result is a 34-year liaison between Lynchburg's first family and the College of William and Mary, one which extends to a myriad of William and Mary adventures, activities, leadership roles, children, parents, neighbors, and friends.

The Mason tradition is a sturdy one. 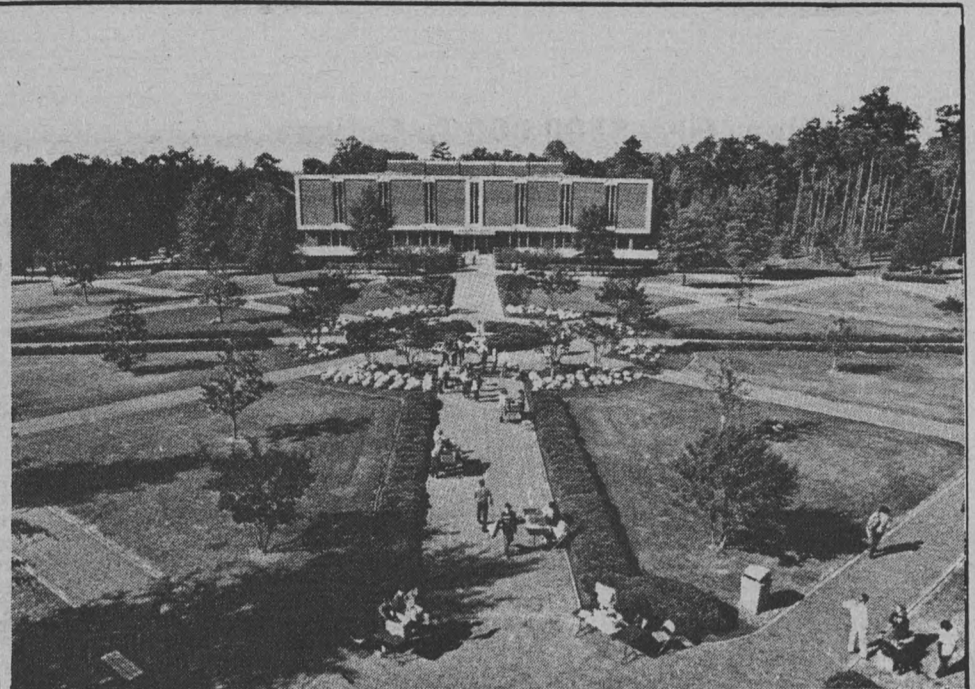
Aubrey's father, Walter G. Mason, served on the Board of Visitors from 1962-70, and was rector for the last two years of his term. And in the Mason tradition, Aubrey, who received the Alumni Medallion in 1967, now serves as a member of the Board of Visitors.

Aubrey and Sissy Mason lead dual lives. Not only are they intimately involved with the affairs of the College, but they are Lynchburg's leading citizens. Both aggressive and skilled fundraisers, Aubrey and Sissy have been involved in numerous charitable support issues "back home" for years -- the church, the hospital, politics -- and have long championed the cause at their own alma mater. Their goal is two-pronged: to elevate alumni support to heights never before attained and to express the Board's commitment to the educational program at William and Mary.



The Class of 1934 Fiftieth Reunion Gift will support Swem Library through the establishment of an endowment to fund the acquisition of scholarly additions to the Swem collection. Chaired by Robert Land '34, the Class has contributed nearly \$10,000 toward the project, which will culminate in the Spring of 1984 at their Fiftieth Reunion celebration.

"William and Mary must be our priority for support in 1982-82," says Aubrey. "This is a real challenge. That extra bonus will only come in response to increased giving this year."

Involvement is critical, says Sissy, who has never understood the student who walks away with diploma in hand saying "I earned it" -- the graduate who leaves and never looks back. "We can understand the inability to give, but not the disinclination," she says.

"In our household we found that first things must come first," say the Masons, "and all other requests must be listed in descending order."

William and Mary comes first. Just ask the Mason children. They'll tell you how, since they were infants, Daddy and Mama have been dragging them off to all the

games in Williamsburg. They'll tell you how there was never a doubt as to where they were supposed to go to College.

Just ask Sissy. She'll tell you how, back in 1948, Aubrey Mason was almost late for his marriage vows because his ear was glued to the radio in the Wren Chapel vestibule, waiting for the score of the W&M/UNC basketball game.

Kenan, Lee Gifts Are Largest Ever

Foundations Give \$1.5 Million To College

Paced by two major grants, including two of the largest gifts in William and Mary history, foundation giving to the College in 1981-82 increased from \$292,132 in the previous fiscal year to \$1,556,548.

The total included a \$750,000 cash gift from the William R. Kenan, Jr., Charitable Trust of New York City and the first installment--\$250,000--of a \$1.75 million gift from the Alfred Wilson Lee and Mary I.W. Lee Memorial Trust Fund to establish an Institute on Bill of Rights Law in the Marshall-Wythe School of Law.

The Kenan gift has been used to establish the William R. Kenan, Jr., Professorship Fund, the income from which will support the Kenan Distinguished Professorship in the Humanities to encourage teaching excellence at the undergraduate level. The College announced in September that the first incumbent will be William Fleming, a renowned cultural and intellectual historian and musicologist.

Dr. Fleming, a professor emeritus at Syracuse University, will be on campus for the Spring Semester to teach courses in "Art and Ideas" and "Masterpieces of Art" and to give several public lectures.

President Graves said the Kenan Professorship, one of 86 that the Kenan Foundation has funded at 54 leading universities, "will hold innumerable benefits for the academic program at William and Mary in the years to come."

"This is one of the outstanding grants for the support of undergraduate teaching in American education," he said. "It is with a great deal of pride that we have joined the family of distinguished universities honored by the Kenan Foundation."

The gift establishing the Institute on Bill of Rights Law from the Lee Trust will enable the Marshall-Wythe School of Law "to serve as a research center not only for the citizens of Virginia, but for our entire nation in this field," according to Arthur B. Hanson '39, '40 BCL, a Washington, D.C. attorney who arranged the gift for William and Mary.

The School of Law will receive \$250,000 a year for seven years, but after an evaluation in the sixth year of the program, the trustees may allocate an additional two to three million dollars to the law school in the final distribution of the trust monies.

The Institute will emphasize study of the First Amendment, of ethical philosophy, the American history of jurisprudence, and the use of legal English.

The \$1.75 million gift is the largest in College history, exceeding a \$1.61 million gift in cash and properties from the Jay Winston Johns estate in 1975. The Kenan and Lee Trust gifts were the two largest gifts made to William and Mary in 1981-82.

Corporate Matching Gifts Increase 100 Per Cent

William and Mary realized more than a 100 per cent increase in corporate matching gifts in 1981-82 over the previous year, receiving \$154,902 in funds coming to the College from corporations which matched employee contributions.

Last year's figure was \$72,230.

In addition, direct corporate grants provided another \$344,883.81, an eight per cent increase over 1980-81, and brought total corporate gifts for the 1981-82 fiscal

year to nearly a half million dollars.

More than 800 corporations have matching gift programs that provide contributions equal to or in excess of the employee's gift to a charitable organization.

In an effort to capitalize on the program, alumni, parents and friends of William and Mary have been urged by the University Advancement Office to take advantage of the corporate benefit.

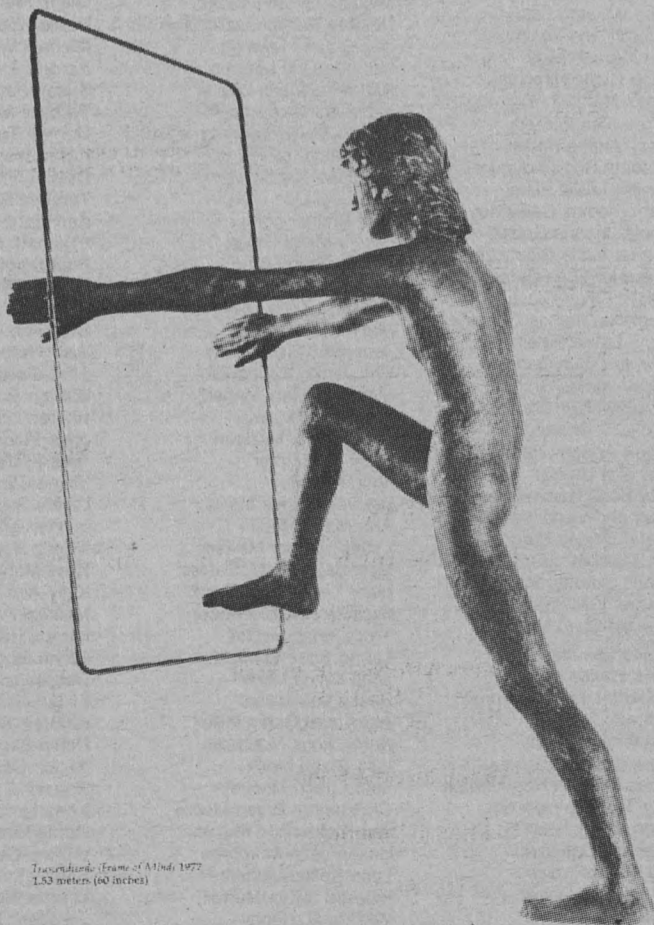

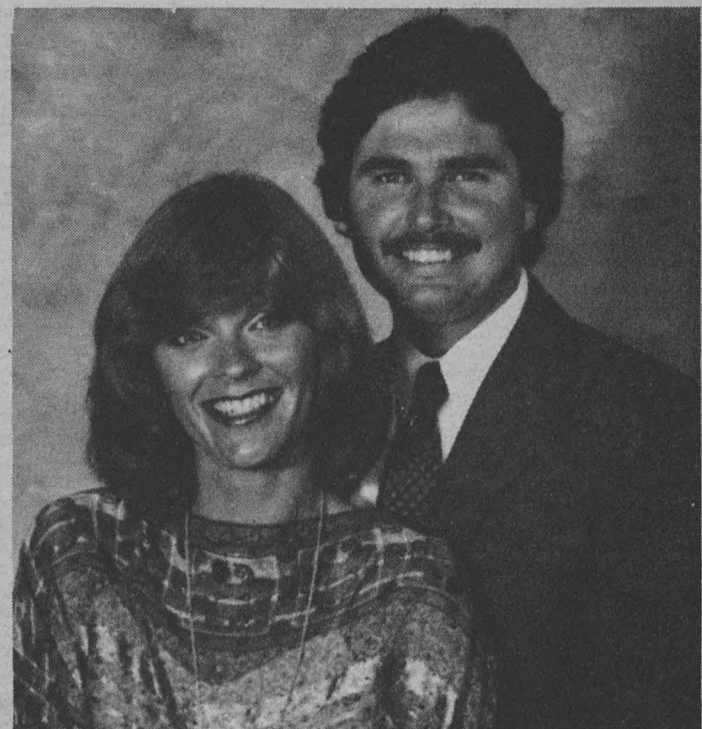
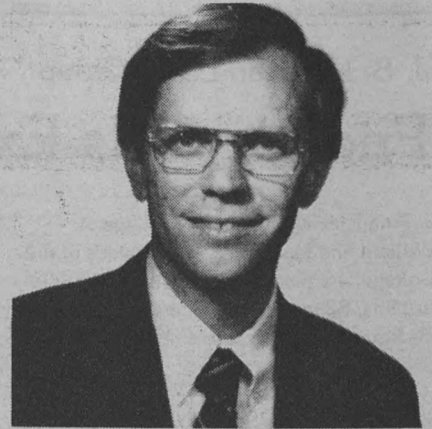

At the end of the fiscal year the AEF made available to the College over \$597,487 in cash and services. "We had gifts to the AEF endowment of \$40,718, received gifts-in-kind totaling \$34,121, raised \$88,747 for the non-revenue sports, and contributed \$384,400 for football and basketball. In addition we made payment of \$49,500 to the Athletic Reserve Fund," said Fratkin.

First Fund Drive Raises \$22,000

Women's Athletics Exceeds Goal

In its first official fund drive, the William and Mary Women's Athletic Association raised nearly \$22,000 in 1982, exceeding its goal of \$20,000 by nearly 10 per cent.

At the conclusion of the five-month drive, under the leadership of its first full-time fund-raiser, Karen Arwe, the program had received \$21,705 from nearly 400 donors. In 1982-83, the Women's Athletic Association has raised its goal by 50 per cent -- to \$30,000.

Millie West, athletic director for the women's intercollegiate program, noted that William and Mary has an outstanding product to present to potential donors.

"In 1981-82," she said, "325 women, or 13 per cent of the undergraduate female

student body, participated in intercollegiate athletics for William and Mary. Eight teams participated in AIAW national competition, with the lacrosse team placing fifth, the golf team fourth, and the tennis team second in the nation in Division II." In addition, Mrs. West noted, fifteen William and Mary women athletes were named All-American and three won national titles in their individual events at AIAW tournaments.

William and Mary offers 13 varsity level sports, four junior varsity teams, and third and fourth squads in field hockey and lacrosse.

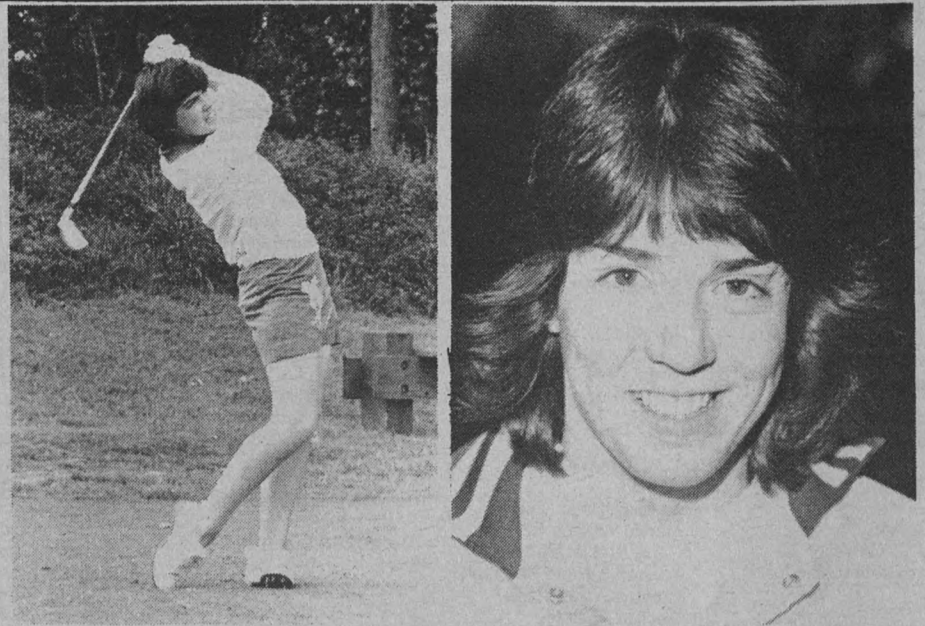

President's House To Celebrate 250th Anniversary

The 250th anniversary of the President's House at William and Mary, one of Williamsburg's most important residences, will be celebrated during the current year.

Constructed in 1732-33, the President's House has been used by all 24 of the College's presidents and is the oldest presidential home on any American college or university campus.

Special events to commemorate the distinguished history of this fine Georgian building will be planned by a volunteer committee headed by Mrs. William M. Bangel of Williamsburg. Dr. Clement E. Conger of Alexandria, who is curator of the White House and of the State Department's Diplomatic Reception Rooms, has been chairman of the decorating effort since its inception in 1977.

Gifts of period furnishings valued at nearly \$1 million have been donated to the program as a result of the Committee's efforts. A number of Queen Anne, Chippendale, Georgian and Hepplewhite pieces are displayed in the entertaining areas of the President's House, complementing the extraordinary American paintings from the College's Fine Arts Collection.

The anniversary celebration will be a highlight as the Committee's goal nears completion. A number of items continue to remain high on the priority list, including a tall case clock, a marble topped table for the front hall, an especially fine secretary, an appropriate lighting fixture for the hall, and a number of decorative arts objects.

Funds to preserve and maintain the collection will be sought on an annual basis through the President's House Friends, which is chaired by Parke S. Rouse, Jr., Williamsburg author and historian; Mrs.
