

For fifteen years President
Of the College of William and Mary

Biographical Sketch of Dr. J. A. C. Chandler, 1872-1934

Dr. Julian Alvin Carroll Chandler, president of the College of William and Mary from July 1, 1919, until the time of his death, May 31, 1934, was born at Guineys', Caroline County, Virginia, October 29, 1872. He was the son of Joseph A. (M. D.) and Emuella Josephine (White) Chandler. After receiving the degree of Bachelor of Arts in the same institution in 1892, he attended Johns Hopkins University, where in 1896 he received his Ph. D. degree. In 1904 he received the honorary degree of L. L. D. from Richmond College. His marriage to Lenore Burten Duke, of Churchland, Virginia, took place the year following his graduation from Johns Hopkins University, July 10, 1897.

Dr. Chandler began his career as an instructor of History and English in 1891 and 1892 at the College of William and Mary. From Williamsburg he went to Houston, Virginia, to become principal of the public schools from 1892 to 1893. In 1894 he became an instructor at Morgan College, in Baltimore, where he remained until 1896. He occupied this position during his graduate studies at Johns Hopkins University. From that time on, Dr. Chandler advanced rapidly in his chosen field of education, holding such responsible positions as dean of the faculty, 1896-99, acting president, 1899-1900, in the Woman's College, Richmond, Virginia; acting professor of history and literature at Richmond College, 1897-1900, and professor of English in the same institution, 1900-04; dean of the Richmond Academy, 1902-04; editor for Silver, Burdett and Company, publishers, 1904-07; editor of the Virginia Journal of Education, Richmond, 1907-09; professor of history, Richmond College, 1908-09. In July, 1909, he became superintendent of schools at Richmond, Virginia, and held this position until his appointment as president of the College of William and Mary, Williamsburg, Virginia, on July 1, 1919. During this time he was given leave from October, 1918, to April, 1919, to serve as Chief of the Rehabilitation Division for Disabled Soldiers in Washington. He was director of history and education, Jamestown exposition, 1907. He held membership in the Virginia Historical Society, American Historical Association, Society for Preservation of Virginia Antiquities, National Education Association, Kappa Alpha fraternity, and the Phi Beta Kappa Society. In 1919 he was chosen President of William and Mary College, and completed nearly a fifteen year He died in Norfolk, Virginia, May 31, 1934.

With his many activities as an educator, historian, scholar, editor, and president of a college, he found time to engage in the preparation of the following valuable historical works relating to Virginia: The History of Suffrage in Virginia, 1901; Makers of Virginia History, 1904; Representation in Virginia, 1896; Colonial Virginia, written in collaboration with T. B. Thames, 1907; Makers of American History, written in collaboration with O. P. Chitwood, 1904; Virginia, written in collaboration with William L. Foushee, 1902. A Biographical Sketch of John Smith, with Selections from his Writings, by Dr. Chandler, appeared in the Library of Southern Literature in 1909, and his following contributions: The Beginnings of Virginia, 1584-1624; The South in English Politics, 1607-1763; The South in the Expansion of the United States; The South in the Interretation of the Constitution; and The Southern Inter-Colonial Relations, were published in "The South in the Building of the Nation."


WILLIAM AND MARY—0; WASHINGTON AND LEE—7


Shade and Jester led the field with two hits apiece.

W. and M. lost a tight one to Washington and Lee. Miller, the General shortstop, sewed the game up in the seventh with a triple to deep left.





INAUGURATION

Williamsburg had been planning for weeks for President Roosevelt's visit, and the old town was decorated in a gala fashion for the great occasion. The entire route from the railway station to the foot of Duke of Gloucester Street at the old Capitol building was lined with American flags and garlands of flowers. October twentieth broke crisp but clear, and when the Chief Executive's train arrived shortly after ten o'clock, a twenty-one gun salute was fired to welcome him to the place where much of America's history was made.

As the train stopped, President Bryan and Governor Peery boarded it, while Postmaster Farley stepped off to greet the throng of anxious spectators. About ten minutes passed before President Roosevelt finally appeared. A military band struck up "Hail to the Chief." The President, smiling broadly, raised his hat and the crowd cheered. After being escorted to a waiting automobile, the presidential party commenced its triumphant march to the College.

Along the sides of the road leading to the main street stood a corps of students from William and Mary, attired in white trousers and blue coats, forming with the great staves they carried, a sort of human bulwark. A huge American flag and an equally large Virginia state flag served as portals giving en-



trance to the Duke of Gloucester Street. As the procession advanced, the young men opened ranks, arrayed themselves on either side of the street and presented their staves as soldiers present arms.

The official car moved slowly. When finally the college was reached thousands of spectators burst into cheers and bands blared forth with martial music, which could scarcely be heard above the din. The crowds were herded to and fro by State Police and the Richmond Blues, but finally managed to group themselves around the rear of the historic Wren Building to hear the message of President Roosevelt.


Special visitors were seated within the white picket fence which marks the original boundary of the College. Such guests as Mrs. Franklin Delano Roosevelt, Mrs. Woodrow Wilson, Admiral and Mrs. Cary Grayson, Governor and Mrs. George Campbell Peery and many other notable personages, far too numerous to mention, were among the interested spectators.

From early morning till long after the President and his retinue had left, Williams-burg was abuzz with activity; military bands, flags, armed guards, and thousands of hustling excited visitors helped to restore to the Colonial Capitol some of the activity which had marked it in earlier days.

When the ceremonies drew to an end the crowds gradually dwindled away and life in Williamsburg resumed its usual easy tenor. There was, however, a feeling deep in the minds of the residents that the glory of their city was not a thing of the past, but rather a "link among the ages to knit the generations each with each."

- 6-Conferring of LL.D. on President Roosevelt,






