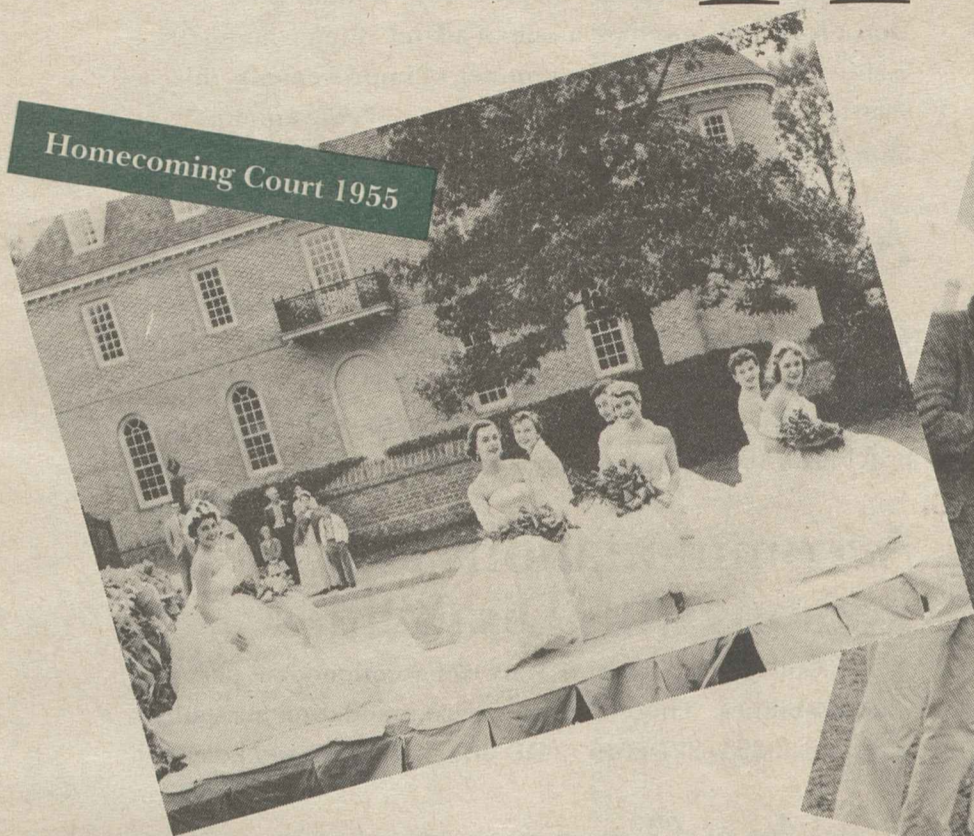

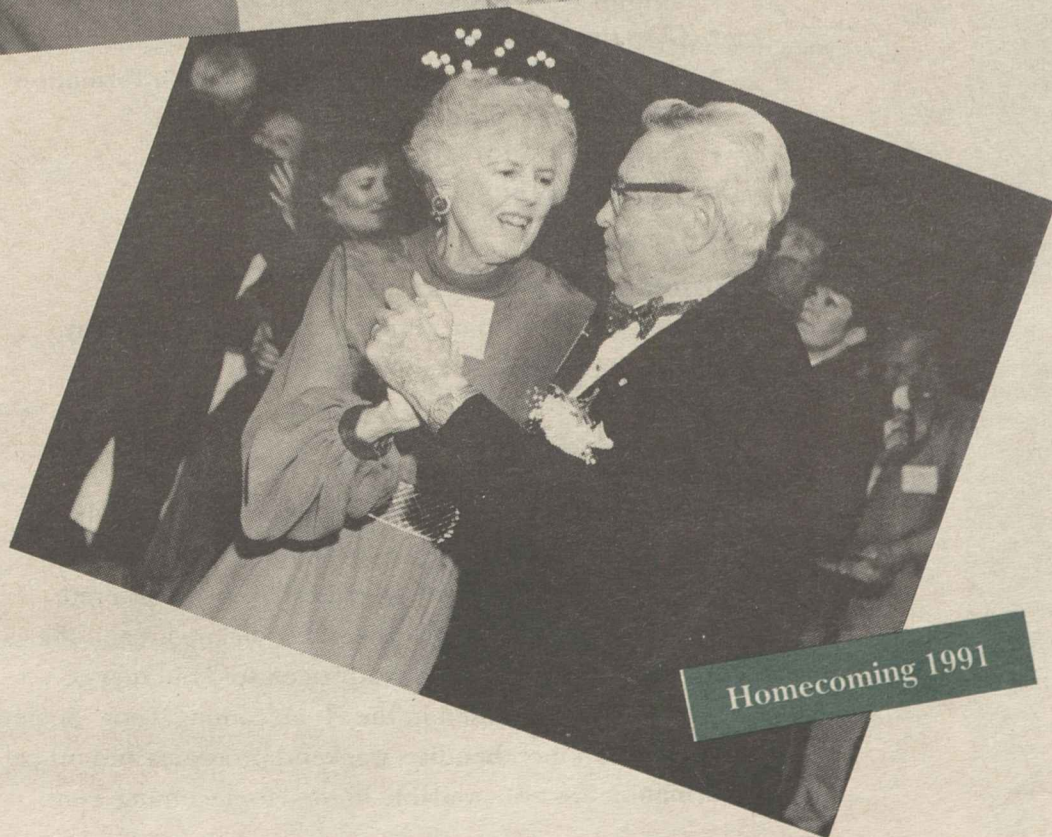
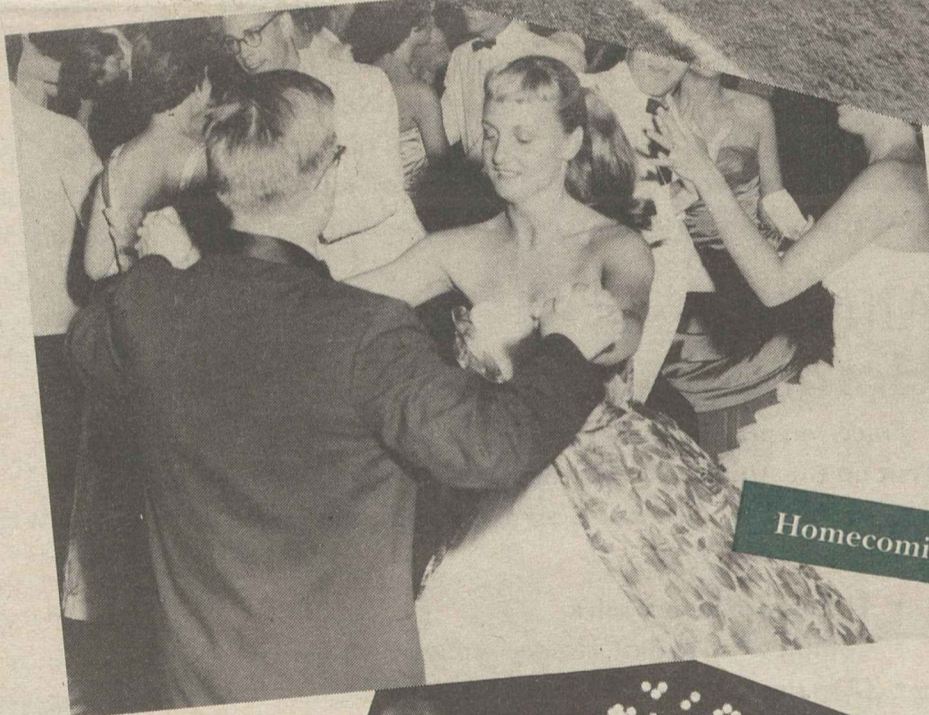

Reservation Deadline

This publication contains registration information and forms for all Homecoming events. In order for the Society of the Alumni to plan this weekend, your reservations must be prepaid. Reservations are due no later than October 14, 1994.
