By traveling throughout the country, the Cochrans were able to gather a body of work that reflects the spirit, culture and creativity of African-American artists since the 1930s. The variety of African-American expression is evident in this exhibition on loan from the Cochran Collection, La Grange, Georgia. The collection includes prints, drawings, paintings, and mixed media pieces from such artists as Alma Thomas, Romare Bearden, Jacob Lawrence and Faith Ringgold.




