That must be grasped no matter what expense.
























The world gently passes by . . .






ROYALTY



THE BOARD OF VISITORS

As the governing body of the College, the Board of Visitors fulfilled its responsibilities by maintaining College property, approving the budget, setting tuition rates and admission requirements, appointing administration and faculty members, and establishing policies for the two-year colleges—Richard Bland in Petersburg and Christopher Newport in Newport News. Seven new Board members took their seats this year, on appointment by the Governor, to serve four-year terms without compensation. W. Brooks George of Richmond became Rector of the Board at its May, 1966, meeting. Governor Mills E. Godwin appointed two non-resident Visitors at the College as provided in legislation enacted by the 1966 General Assembly.








Construction Progresses on Life Science Building for BIOLOGY


















William and Mary Ties for Southern Conference Crown

William and Mary Cross Country: Number One in the South

The 1966 version of William and Mary's Cross Country squad achieved the top ranking in Southern cross country. Dominating the regional championships, as well as dual meet opponents, the Indians closed the season by taking eighteenth at the N.C.A.A. National Championship. With team captain, Joe Philpott—the only senior on the squad, the Indians were supposed to have faced a rebuilding year, but outstanding performances by Terry Donnelly and George Davis gave the Indians their best season in years. Finishing with a four and two dual meet record, which included wins over powerful teams from Virginia, Quantico, V.M.I. and Western Kentucky, the season was marred by narrow losses

to tough squads from Georgetown and Annapolis.

In regional competition, the Tribe overpowered its opponents in the N.C.A.A. Region Three meet, the State meet, and the Southern Conference meet, with record margins of victory. Five members of the seven man squad, Terry Donnelly, George Davis, Chop Jordan, Juris Luzins and Dick Widell, were named to the Conference All Star team in an unprecedented vote by Conference coaches.

At the National Championship, William and Mary's young team gained experience that will serve it well next year, finishing eighteenth.



This season also saw the Tribe hit the century mark for the first time in many years as they dumped Hampden-Sydney 100-78.







Larry Paffrath Coaches Frosh in Winning Year As Sherwood Paces Papooses to 10-5 Record












Coach Dick Besnier, although not having a winning record in dual meet competition with a two and seven mark, noted that four of the matches were lost due to weight forfeits.









Versatility also played an important role, as several team members played two positions during the campaign. The team's ranks are expected to provide the varsity with more players than those of previous years.




