THE first happens the 23^d of April, beginning 8 minutes before 1 o'clock in the afternoon, with latitude of the Moon, 1 minute 5 seconds South, descending node, visible in London and part of the western parts of Europe, and if the air be very clear, I believe will be seen here.

The second is on the 17th day of October, beginning at 42 minutes after 3 o'clock in the morning. The latitude of the moon will be 1 minute 57 seconds north, descending node. It will be seen in London, Wales, and Ireland, but will not be seen here.

The FEASTS, and FASTS, in the several months as they are fixt, or moveable, with reference to EASTER.

SEPTUAGESIMA or 70 days, observed in memorial of the 70 years the children of *Israel* were in servitude under the *Babylonians*, is 9 weeks before *Easter*. *Sexagesima* is 8 weeks before *Easter*. *Quinquagesima* or *Shrove Sunday*, is 7 weeks before *Easter*, the *Tuesday* after is *Shrove Tuesday* and the *Wednesday* following is *Ash-Wednesday* or the first day of *Lent*. *Quadragesima* or the first Sunday in *Lent*, is 6 weeks before *Easter*. The 40 days of *Lent* are observed in remembrance of the 40 days in which God drowned the world, or the 40 years in which the children of *Israel* did penance in the wilderness; the 40 days allowed the *Nine-vites* for their repentance; the 40 stripes by which malefactors were to be corrected; *Moses* fasted 40 days when he received the laws of our God; *Elias* fasted so many days; and our Saviour himself, when he was pleased to fast, observed the same length of time. But some do fast 40 hours only, beginning about 12 on *Friday* (the time of our Saviours falling under the power of death) and continuing until *Sunday* morning, the time of his rising again from the dead. *Midlent Sunday* (the day on which our Saviour wrought the miracle of the 5 loaves and 2 fishes) is 3 weeks before *Easter*.

of fire; this is time of *Pentecost*, so called from the 50 days between *Easter* and *Whitsunday* inclusive. The *Jews* kept their *Pentecost* 50 days after the *Passover*, in remembrance of the law delivered to *Moses* in the burning mount. The next *Sunday* after is *Trinity Sunday*, so called from the 3 persons appearing to *Abraham*, of which one was the Judge of all the earth, and it is not improbable but that the others might be the other two persons of the Blessed Trinity. The next *Thursday* is *Corpus Christi*. The 4th *Ember-week*, i. e. the *Ember-days* or fasts of the 4 seasons (in which the fruits of the earth, are either sown, sprung up, coming to their ripeness, or gathered in the barn) are the *Wednesday*, *Friday*, and *Saturday* after the first *Sunday* in *Lent*, after *Whitsunday*, after the 14th of *September*, and the 13th of *December*.

REMARKABLE DAYS.

NEW YEAR'S DAY, or the circumcision of our Lord, eight days after his nativity, inclusive.

Twelfth day, so styled because celebrated on the 12th day after the birth of our Saviour, exclusive, that is, not taking in *Christmas-day* for one, and it is called *Epiphany*, or appearance from the visible opening of the Heavens at this time, and appearance of a star like *Israel's* pillar of fire for its brightness, during its continuance, shining both night and day, to direct the *Magi* i. e. *Melchior*, *Jasper*, and *Balthazar*: Who went from *Susa* in *Persia* to *Bethlem* (where *Boaz* the *Jew*, and *Ruth* the *Gentile* were married) in *Palesine*; being about 520 miles in 12 winter days; and on the 13th worshiped our Blessed Saviour in the manger, presenting him with gifts, gold, myrrh, and frankincense.

Candlemas day, or *Purification* i. e. churching the Virgin *Mary* in the Temple of *Jerusalem*, 40 days after her delivery of the Holy child *Jesus*: She was the chief of those wise virgins that went to meet their

Lord with their lamps lighted and burning. From which custom this day received the name, it still retains of *Candlemas-day*.

Lady-day, the conception of our Lord. There be four creations of man, viz. The first without man and woman, as *Adam* out of the earth. The 2d of man without woman, as *Eve* of *Adam's* rib. The 3d of man and woman, as we are. The 4th of a virgin without man, as *Christ* of the virgin *Mary*, who conceived of him on this day (25 *March*.) She was mother of her father, and daughter of her son; and *Moses's* rod that buded, blossomed, and brought forth fruit without sap of earth, was a type of her.

All *Saints* and *Candlemas-days* are the first and last days of *Christmas*.

Saint Andrew was the first that found the *Messiah*, and brought others to him; his festival is placed at the beginning of *Advent*, as the most proper to bring the news of our Saviour's coming.

A cheaper and easier method of feeding HOGS and HORSES, than perhaps heretofore practised; taken from Gerard Elliot's essays on Field Husbandry.

FIND by experience the best time to fatten swine is to begin at the first of *August*, if you have old corn: Hogs will fat slowly in very cold weather; they will eat much and fatten but little: If you have a very warm house, they heat in bed and catch cold when they come out into the cold air.

To save corn, steep it in water or swill till the corn grow very soft; this opens the parts. Give them the corn to eat and the water to drink in which the corn has been steeped; the hard dry corn, a great deal of it, passed through them undigested; this is the hardest part of the corn and that which principally makes the flour. There is a tradition that if you feed one hog with corn, the dung of the first will fatten another, and his dung a third hog.

Although I believe the story to be fabulous, yet it serves to show that the sense of mankind is, that in the manner we feed swine, there is a great deal of loss. I asked an honest judicious neighbour of mine, who had leisure to try this method of steeping corn, longer and with more exactness than I had done, *How much he thought was saved by it?* He said, *at least one bushel in seven:* He believed more.

Since the foregoing was written, a person of good credit informed me, that there being in his neighbourhood a dealer in horses, who was famous for skill in making horses fat in a short time; he desired the jockey to tell him how he did it: The secret was, to mix Indian corn and oats together, and soak it in water till it was soft; that in cold weather he steeped it in a cellar that it might be kept from freezing.

A receipt for increasing a BARLEY CROP.

DISSOLVE three pounds of copperas in a pail full of boiling water; add to this as much dung-puddle water as will well cover three bushels of barley; stir it and let it steep twenty four hours; save the liquor, for after steeping, with a little addition it will do again and again; when the feed is spread and drained, sift on fine lime, which dries it fit for sowing.
