For the YEAR 1786, are five; three of the SUN,
and two of the MOON.

THE first is of the D , January 14th, beginning at 52 minutes after 5 o'clock in the morning (look sharp the D is going low) the continuation will be two hours 18 minutes; it will end at 20 minutes after eight o'clock; you will not see that part, however, the greatest observation of 49-10 digits, will be at one minute after 7 o'clock in the morning.

The second is of the SUN, January 20th, beginning at 32 minutes after 8 o'clock in the evening, eclipsed 10 digits and better, it will continue visible on the earth 2 hours 34 minutes, though invisible to us; it may frighten the Western Savages.

The third is of the MOON, July 10th, beginning at 37 minutes after four o'clock in the morning, the middle at 22 minutes after six o'clock, totally eclipsed; we shall hardly be able to see even the first beginning of it. It will continue visible on the earth 3 hours and 30 minutes.

The fourth of the SUN, July 24th, beginning at 37 minutes after four o'clock in the morning, visible if the horizon be very clear.

The 5th is also of the SUN, the 18th of December, beginning a few minutes before 12 o'clock in the day, but not visible here.

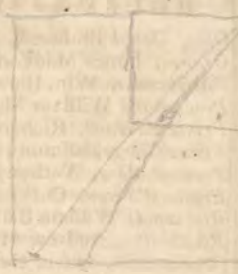

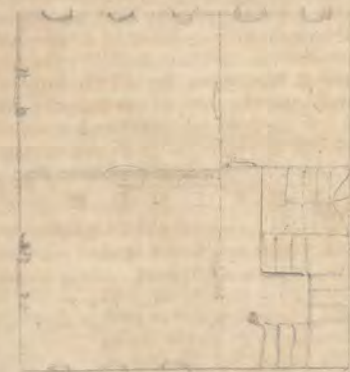
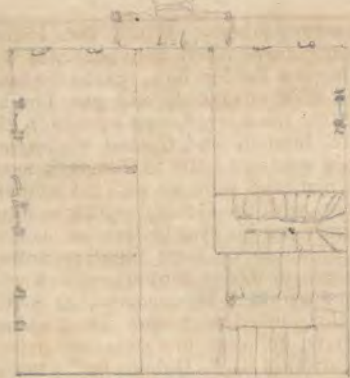

M I S C E L L A N I E S.

missionary among them. When the Indian entered the apartment where his Excellency was sitting, he made a sudden halt, gazed for some time on him, then advanced, and gave him his hand. After the usual ceremonies were over, the Sachem seated himself, and *General Washington*, who had been writing a letter to Congress, again resumed his pen, and went on with his business. As in common with the General whilst writing, he several times cast his eyes to Heaven, as if to invoke the assistance of some superior power. The Indian was unable to support,—filled with an idea of the weight of his concerns, he melted into tears, and quitted the room. Dr. Kirkland saw his distress, followed him out, and desired to know the cause of it. “Did you see” (replied the Indian, turning round to the Dr. as he entered the passage) “how that great man seems oppress’d by his cares?—He lifted his eyes to Heaven, as much as to say, help, Lord, help, what a great continent I have got upon my shoulders.”—The Dr was struck with the dignity and novelty of the idea, and immediately committed it to record.

When Socrates was one time abused by the mother of all scolds Xantippe, he left the house to herself to avoid the clamour of her tongue;—he scarcely had left the door when a *chamber-pot* was cast at him--- but he replied with all the calmness imaginable, *I knew thunder would produce a shower.*
