ECLIPSES

For the YEAR 1791, are FOUR; two of each LUMINARY.

THE 1st is of the Sun April 3d, beginning at 16 minutes past 7 o'clock in the morning visible in London, but will hardly be seen here, especially if the Horizon be clouded, as it often is at this season of the year.

The 2d is of the Moon, April 18th, beginning at 10 o'clock in the morning, she will be eclipsed $7\frac{1}{2}$ digits on the south side, visible to those that stand feet to feet with us, often called Antipodes if any such there be, I most think that they are of the Finny Tribe.

The 3d is of the Sun, September 27th, beginning at near 7 o'clock in the evening, invisible with us.

The 4th and last, is of the Moon, the 11th day of October beginning at 54 minutes past 7 o'clock in the evening, eclipsed 7 digits on her north side, visible in Europe and America.
