FOR THE YEAR 1792, ARE TWO,
AND BOTH OF THE SUN.

THE 1st is on the 20th day of March, beginning at 25 minutes after 9 o'clock in the afternoon, a very great Eclipse to the Southward, its continuance on the earth near the Equator, will be almost 6 hours, invisible to us.

The 2d is on the 16th of September, beginning at 31 minutes after 5 o'clock in the morning, a small Eclipse, not quite 2 digits, invisible; it will be seen in London, and many other parts of Europe.

The Moon from Eclipses clear,
And walks in shun-shine all the year.
