

Robert McCandlish Plaintiff vs. Mary E Warburton & als; Defendants  
 In Chancery - - -

I William L Spencer as Commissioner do in the decree rendered in the above Cause on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1851. Beg leave to make the following Report of the sales of the Negroes decreed to be sold under the said decree. The woman Betsy Maria Egan & Jenny (with the infant Child of said Betsy) born since the institution of this suit, was legally advertised to take place before the Courthouse door in the City of Williamsburg by advertisement posted at said Courthouse door setting forth the time terms and place of said Sale more than twenty days previous to the sale as directed by the decree. An account of said sale is herewith presented as a part of this report setting forth the amount that each slave sold for with the name of the purchaser thereof, as follows.
