Dear Sir,

In attempting to make the college books agree with the balance in bank, I find that there appears to be another error in your account but it appears to be to your advantage. You do not seem to have charged for the quarter ending August 10 - 1889 - making \$87.50 due you in this sense. If you let Mr. Smith have the checks from July to the time of your resignation and a copy of your settlement with the Executive Committee, I think this can be ascertained beyond a question. I mean a copy of the paper presented to the Executive Committee and allowed at its meeting in November 1889 which time you were allowed \$61.35.

If you have a Bank statement supplementing the one I gave you, I would like to see that. By allowing this error the books very nearly square with the cash in bank.
