

Christiansburg Aug 27 1883

Dear Sir-

I am now a busy writing  
the 100,000 acre tract & have finished my  
observation of the 40,000 acre tract in Carroll. This  
letter would be well worth buying but for  
difficulties of prior claims which I could  
not entirely unravel - I have coal near  
this place & also about 14 miles N.W. in the  
direction of our land. I expect now  
to reach Charlottesville by Friday next at  
four or five o'clock in the evening, and as  
I wish to go back by your house, I will thank  
you to send my horse over to Charlottesville, on  
that day, in time to enable me to ride in the  
evening to Prococks. Should I not be there direct  
the servant to leave the horse at the Monticello  
house -
