

Madison Va Dec 9 1858

Dear Rufus

I send Robert Coofcuter at
your expense for the deed, but particularly
the one to Brastow - as I must send it over by
to-morrow's mail, when Brastow paid me over the money
it was with the distinct understanding on my part that
this deed should be ready - I explained to you my
engagement & you appeared entirely care less about
enabling me to comply - I bought the Ketchikan land,
spent nearly a month on it at different
times (travelling twice to Washington at my own expense
& mostly on account of the land) sold it, kept
up a constant correspondence about it, & you have
absolutely done nothing - not even examined the
land as you promised to do - I & now I have
a light of trouble getting a deed from you - in order
to keep my word with Brastow - the entire apathy
& indifference you display will not encourage me
to enter into further arrangements of the kind -
I do not say these things in anger but that in case
I take no further trouble in these matters you
may understand the reason for certainly you can

expect me to further neglect my own business for a
joint concern when you take so little trouble
about it.
