The deed came safely to hand but too late for the mail - I felt fretted chiefly about the deed as I feared that Mr Bristow would come on before the deed got over & would blame me as not complying with a positive promise & obligation I had represented this to you & you had not sent me the deed as you promised positively to do - there was also also danger that B would not take the land if the title was not complete as he intimated in his last letter I complained nothing about our mining transactions & gave you therein, but only about the Hettick matter - & your carelessness about the deed which might render worthless all that was here to be done - you are in great error ~~and~~ in thinking I have not been candid about stock &c & do me injustice in so thinking - I do not appreciate the efforts made by me to induce parties to offer you the highest price for stock - & my further effort to induce you to accept an offer to your advantage - Yours decidedly this
