

Know all men by these presents, that we, Archibald G. McCanlish and
William S. Peachy,
are held and firmly bound unto Mary E. Warbinton, Robert Warbinton, Thomas D.
Harris and William S. Spencer, in the just and full sum of One hundred dollars, to
be paid unto the said Mary E. Warbinton, Robert Warbinton, Thomas D. Harris and
William S. Spencer, their certain attorney, their heirs, executors, administrators or as-
signs, for the payment whereof, wee and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs,
executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents: Sealed
with our seals, and dated this 18th day of June in the year one thousand eight
hundred and fifty one.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas, the Robert McCanlish,
hath obtained from John B. Kelpton esquire, Judge of the Seventh Judicial Cir-
cuit in the Fourth Judicial District of Virginia, and one of the Judges of the Gen-
eral Court of Virginia, an Injunction to injoin and restrain the defendants, their
agents and all others from cutting any more wood or timber on the lands in the
here mentioned on which the defendant Mary E. Warbinton resides, and also from
removing any wood already cut from the said lands until the further order of
the Court, and also from removing or in any wise disposing of any part of the
personal property mentioned in a deed of trust from the said Mary E. Warbinton
to the defendant Spencer bearing date on the 13th day of May 1851. and recorded
in Lancaster County Court, so as to place beyond the control of the Court; But
the plaintiff is not to have the benefit of this order until he or some one for
him shall enter into bond with good security in the penalty of One hundred
dollars with condition to pay and satisfy all costs and damages which may
be sustained by reason of this Injunction in case it shall hereafter be dissolved.
Now, if the said Robert McCanlish shall wee and truly pay and satisfy, all
such costs and damages as shall be sustained by the said Mary E. Warbinton,
Robert Warbinton, Thomas D. Harris and William S. Spencer, in case the said
Injunction shall be dissolved; then the above obligation to be void, otherwise, to re-
main in full force and virtue.
