My dear Mary:

But telling you the truth, I got a marvelous break just now to write. It's Saturday morning 12:40 and my boss left this moment, he is going away over the week-end. And Dr. Miller left already yesterday, so I'm all by myself and have to stay here until 1:30. Naturally, I could do a lot of cleaning a.s.o., but really, I don't feel like doing it at all, and furthermore, I have some infection on my finger, so I have to keep it quiet.

Mary, and now to your letter. Slowly I'm recovering from the shock (but it was a nice kind of a shock) about your engagement! Honestly, I shouldn't talk to you anymore, not telling me this..... wait and see, maybe I won't tell you once, when I'm married, until Walter jr. talks to you!!!!!! But now my heartiest congratulations, Mary, lots of good luck and everything else nice, you can think of. What are you going to do now? I am anxiously waiting to get your next letter, what you are going to do.... New Orleans or Allen? I guess, I would prefer Al..... By the way, you never told me before that you intended to go to New Orleans....I was very



much surprised of hearing it. And what do you intend to do there? Becoming a nurse or ????. Please tell me more about it.

In Jacksonville you seem to have had a swell time, I'd love to make a trip with you. I bet it's "clean fun." But your two other adventures I don't like so much. Neither the burglar, nor your wreck. Did they catch him in the meantime? I hope so. I tell you, I wouldn't feel so good neither having him under my window. But here he had to climb 4 stories to pay me a visit. And how about your car? How about the following idea. You don't go to N. O. but you make a trip to Detroit and on your way come to see us in N. Y. And if we are not worthwhile doing it, the Fair is it!

And now comes my monthly report. Really, I think it is one month since I wrote you last. Our Sundays are still the same, we are going to the beach regularly, but the last two times it was pretty cool, and I fear it will be the same tomorrow. But our Car-friend, in the meantime Elizabeth's (Walter's sister) boy-friend goes on a trip to Europe for 4 weeks in ten days, so we cannot miss the last chance. Then I was once in a show, saw "Good bye, Mr. Chips" and liked it very much. Did you see it? And from the first of July until to the 5th, Ernie, Walt's brother, was here from S.C. and we had lots of fun with him. He has a swell new car, so we took rides; once, at the 4th of July, the 4 of us went out to the Fair. Mary, it was grand. We were out there from 12 to 10 and then I was deadtired all week long. But it was realley wonderful. We saw quite a lot of buildings:

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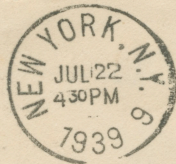

Otherwise there is not much new here. The winter wasn't as cold as I expected it to be, and what I have read in the papers it wasn't any too warm in Orlando either. Last night I was in bed. I really don't know how to start this letter -- my conscience is so bad!!!! If you have to be mad at me, please be very mad right away -- then it's over quicker. I do feel like a ..... I better don't say how I feel. But I hope you'll forgive me just once more!!!! I'll go and see "Rebecca". Have you read that book?

In the first place, I have a hundred thousand questions, Mary, how you are, how you like being a nurse, and how you spend your time off, and so on. Have you been in Orlando in the meantime? Or did you spend New Year's Eve in New Orleans in Detroit company???? How is Detroit by the way? Still o.k.? And did you hear from Evelyn and Hoggsy? I do hope that you'll write me soon and answer all my questions, I am so anxious to hear about you. So please don't be as nasty as I was!

And now I'll tell you a little bit about myself. I am still in my doctor's office, and pretty busy for the last 3 months. But right now my doctor doesn't need me, he doesn't feel so well himself, so we canceled a few appointments, and I take that change immediately to write you. I hope you'll appreciate it! My writing list is about two pages long, and I just simply don't get to it. You know the New York social season keeps even me quite busy, it might sound very funny, but it is true. We are invited very often lately, that means that we have to invite people again, sometimes even for dinner and that is a lot of work after I am through in the office. And last week Walter's brother came back from South Carolina, so all the invitations start all over again, because those aunts a.s.o. want to meet Ernie too. But otherwise it is very nice to have him here, specially as he has a car and that is something we needed very badly. And in a few weeks Walter expects his parents here, they are still in England and expect their Visa any day. That means the sooner they come the sooner we'll get married. But we want to wait until they are here, and are settled a little bit, so then we intend to take a little apartment some place in the suburb of N.Y. C. Walter even thinks about moving to New Jersey, as Ernest is working over there. But we'll see. I am very much looking forward to have an own apartment, specially to have an own icebox and bathroom!

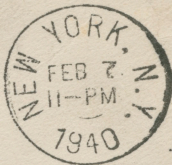
