My downfall was partial panel on instruments, was okay on full panel instruments. The check pilot told me if I had about six more hours on instruments I'd have made it okay - but time is precious and pilots are plentiful. Lacked the grand total of six hours and I'd have graduated. So near and yet so far, huk Rebel?

How are things with you? This long distance love isn't so good so you'd better win the war in a hurry while I sit on my can back here which I

hope won't be long, probably be going over again before
Xmas — maybe I'll be seeing you — in a fox-hole
built for two, room service and innerspring mattresses.
How about that? I've got a quart of good bourbon in
hoarding. — Bye for now and Mom said to say 'Hello'
and she sends her best. I would like to hear from you.





My Darling Rebel,

Hi sweet! At long last I rec'd a letter from you - yipe what a relief, didn't know what had happened but I had a hunch twas because you were busy and moving around - and I hope that is the only reason your letters are slow in coming.

I rec'd your letter yesterday just before I left Monterey. I'm in Camp Haan as of today in a gun battery. The outfit is alerted to go overseas but believe I'll be transferred to another outfit, yes me darlin' I'm no longer in the Air Corps. Seeing as how I transferred from the ground forces to the Air Corps they shanghaied me back without a chance at bombardier or navigator. It's kind of a rough deal as I was so near and yet so far - with a few more hours I'd have made it okay. However I'm going to apply for O.P.S. soon as I'm transferred, at the present and perhaps future - I'm a p.o.t.

I left Bakersfield Aug. 16 and went home for two weeks to see Mom and my step-dad and then came back to the Presidio of Monterey for two more weeks and then came down here today - seventy miles from L.A. Monterey is a smooth little place and Carmel too - met two lovely naval ensigns, nurses no less! Had quite a time







Sharp places and a scrumptious time, sure wish we could bend elbows together - have lots of good liquor here again as a result of the liquor holiday and there's another one coming up in January. How's the Champagne situation over there and are you getting a chance to have some from Mary? scotched him — Just remember you



About all for this time, will write soon again, and you have my address now.


