Received your two letters. Glad to hear from you, but sorry you are ill. Things are beginning to look funny around here. I'm through at the school. Go on guard duty at 11³⁰ tomorrow morning. Socks will come in mighty handy. One sgdin leaves here tomorrow morning. Don't send anything but mail. Save all packages for further notice. We may move east within 10 days. The outgoing, tomorrow don't know where they are bound for. Possibly we'll get a furlough if we hit Hoboken. Gee! but were busy. Tell the Mangles I received received letters from Mrs. Rath and Ed. today.

Hope all are well.
