must wait.

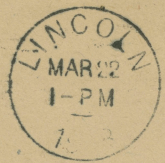
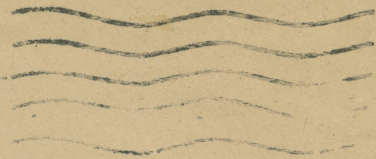
