It is over a week, now, since I have written home. But I know that within a very few minutes after receiving this, you will be over at "our house," with the news. Tell mother and dad and the girls, that I have not forgotten them, or written to anyone else, during this time. You see, we have been so darn busy, that it was impossible to do anything. We work from early morn till late at night, and when we are dismissed, we are glad enough to "turn in." Tomorrow night, I am supposed to get off early. If I am not disappointed, I will send a letter to Essie, I believe it is her turn.

What kind of weather are you having over that way? It is very mean, over here. Am very sorry that I can't give you any news, now, as I must run back to the hangar, and get the bunch ready for chow.

Give my regards to all my relatives and friends, and tell mother not to worry, as I am getting along very well, and am feeling fine.

getting along very well and am feeling fine.

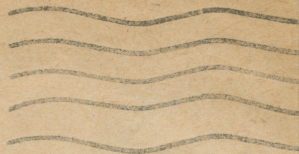
