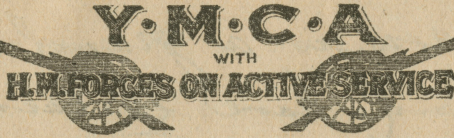

are doing. But remember, dont overdo it.

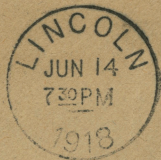

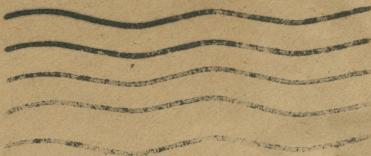
