Brought me four letters and a prokage yes, the famous package has arrived I was awfully glad to get it, so had been expecting it for so long. Though I appreciate your kindness, and thank you for all the trouble you must have gone to, I must ask you not to send another you see Cesee dear it is this way; the package contained only such articles so we can buy here, in the canteen, and they are all Butish Mude. I am sorry, to have to tell you this, but as I see it. you are only paying about four times

the price of the article, that way. If only they were yanker goods, Id never say a word but, I guess you understand what I mean. The package contained I small can of salmon, I small can of marmulade, I can of sardines, (very small), I small can of chicken soup, and a half pound of sweet chocolate. Well, the marmalale and chocolate have gone their way, but we are holding the rest, till we are broke, and want something to eat. Whatever you do, don't send me any of that English tobacco. See! When I had used up what little generican tobacco, I brought over with me, couldn't go this local stuff so just stapped smoking. Poor fim! What happened this ship was she torpedoed? you see what lettle newsur get over here, comes from Poston. Harry Met, one of the boys who was at the South Station that night, gets a bundle of Boston Posts, every mee in a while, and when he is through with them, he turns them over to
