G. S. W. Lt. Shoulder, T&T.

Oct. 15th. Small wound on posterior surface of Lt. shoulder. Larger one on posterior surface of arm, extending towards head of humerus. Small opening on anterior surface of shoulder. Profuse foul smelling, purulent discharge: Strep. Welch and Coli.

Oct. 15th. Swab from wound: Strep. and Welch.

Oct. 17th. Cast applied.

Oct. 25th. Patient began running slight evening temperature.

50c.c. Leclainche and Vallee serum administered.

Nov. 5th. Patient much improved and evacuated shortly afterwards.

Total Serum employed:

50c.c. Leclainche and Vallee.

G. S. W. Lt. Foot, F. C. C. Metatarsals.

Oct. 20th. Small opening on inner planter surface of foot, extending toward heel. Free, foul discharge. No gas but slight edema.

First examination: Strep. Staph and Welch.

Oct. 22nd. Amputation performed just above ankle.

Oct. 23rd. 30c.c. Leclainche and Vallee

Nov. 1st. Stump clean, but still shows Strep.

Nov. 5th. Evacuated in good condition.

Total Serum employed:

Oct. 15th. Hip, P. O. G. Neck of Femur. Humphrey Roberts.

Oct. 15th. Swab from wound: Strep. and Welch. Patient began running slight evening temperature. 500 c.c. Leclainche and Vallee serum administered. Nov. 5th. Patient much improved and evacuated shortly afterwards. Total Serum employed: 500 c.c. Leclainche and Vallee.

Oct. 20th. Small opening on inner plantar surface of foot, extending towards heel. Free, foul discharge. No gas but slight edema. Gas. Binkley. G. S. W. Lt. Foot, P. O. G. Metatarsals. First examination: Strep. Staph and Welch. Oct. 22nd. Amputation performed just above ankle. Oct. 23rd. 300 c.c. Leclainche and Vallee. Nov. 1st. Stump clean, but still shows Strep. Nov. 5th.
