 would be an interesting

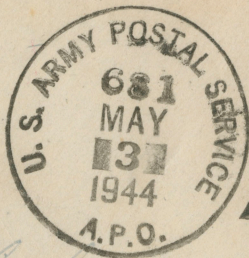
you said if we don't love ourselves who will.

you anything for the picture.

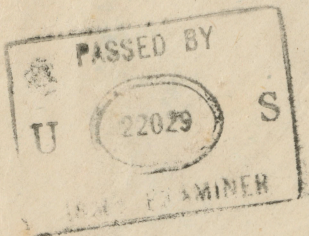
Notice the T in front of the Sgt. now.
