

Changes and Specifications against Private Zachariah Swink, of Company G of the Thirty First Regiment of Virginia Infantry, in the Service of the Confederate States.

Charge 1st Enlisting in another Regiment without a regular discharge from the Regiment in which he last served.

Specification— In this, that he, the Said Private Zachariah Swink, being a regular enlisted Soldier in the Company G of the Thirty First Regiment of Virginia Infantry, in the Service of the Confederate States, died on or about the twentieth day of June, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixty two, in the County of Augusta in the State of Virginia, and list himself in the Sixty Second Regiment of Virginia Infantry, without a regular discharge from the Said Thirty First Regiment of Virginia Infantry, in which he last served.

Charge 2^d Absence without leave.

Specification— In this, that he, the Said Private Zachariah Swink, being a regularly enlisted Soldier, in Company G of the Thirty First Regiment of Virginia Infantry, in the Service of the Confederate States, died on or about the twentieth day of June, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixty two, at or near Port Republic, absent himself from his company and Regiment, without leave from his commanding officer, or any one authorized to grant such leave, and did remain so absent, ^{without leave,} from his company and Regiment until on or about the twenty third day of March in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixty four, when he was returned to his company and Regiment, at or near Sommerville Ford, in the County of Orange, in the State of Virginia.
