

Washington Jan 10<sup>th</sup> 1862

Dear Brother

I received your kind letter last night I was very glad to hear from home I have wrote to Eunice the 15<sup>th</sup> and Nathan and Albro the 16<sup>th</sup> but have not sent them yet I was some what surprisid to hear that I have an other brother please give him my best respects tell Polly if she will be steady I will be write her a letter by and by. You wanted to know wheather we had got our horses or not well many bit of a horse have I rode except a wooden one I should not be surprisid if we did not get them before spring we might have had them by taking some that had been culled but we would not have them. We got our pay yesterday I received thirty nine Dollars and have

Sent thirty seven and one half  
dollars in a package by express to  
Amos Dow of east Randolph and  
you must go there and get it if  
it not to much trouble for you to  
there is seven dollars and one half in gold  
and the rest is in U.S. notes you may  
let father have a paper to certify that  
you have received it and he will keep  
that the money is in an envelop and  
directed to you you had better go after  
as soon as you receive this I received  
a letter from Frank Williams last night  
I will answer his soon I should liked to  
have been with abio when he catched  
his coon. The weather is warm and  
rainy here now one of the guards shot  
at a man last night about nine o'clock  
I did not see the man when he was  
shot at but I see him run across our  
drill ground as though the old pick-  
was after him so mope soon
