

Washington Jan 18<sup>th</sup> 1862

There has not been any thing special  
a going on in camp since the 12<sup>th</sup> intit  
to day we had a regimental drill  
which was a change in the programme  
and is more active than the Saber drill  
for this cold weather Jan 19<sup>th</sup> I was  
snowing on guard duty to day and had some  
fun with the officer of the day and  
played a nice game with an thief  
\$20 I did not go on drill this fore  
noon this after noon we drilled in  
the marches and wheelings Jan 21 when  
we was on regimental this morning the  
Lieutenant Colonel got us paraded  
and then he thought he would put on a  
little style so he clapped his spurs  
to his horse (which was a little black  
horse that belonged to one of the Captains)  
and drew his saber and off went the  
horse into the woods with him. The  
morning snowed all day

The last we see of him was his red hair  
flying in among the trees he was gone  
about an hour and he came back all  
mud I thought he had discovered a  
secret what made him leave so quick  
how far the horse run with him I do not  
know 22 We drilled as usual to day  
The colonel's woman arrived in camp to day  
and we had to put on our haversacks and  
canteens and go out on parade to let  
the Colonels wife see us after the  
parade was dismissed Captain Kennedy  
ran and jumped on to the Major  
Sackets horse behind the Major and the  
horse reared up and kicked and threw  
the Captain off into the mud which  
made him fall rather cheap Jan 23 - 24  
we drilled as usual or in the no horse  
cavalry drill it stormed last night  
as most like old Chautauqua than it  
has before since I have been in Dixie and  
one of my commands that was on guard was  
taken sick at seven o'clock and I went

and relieved him and stood his  
guard in the hail rain & snow until nine  
o'clock this morning then I was relieved by  
the new guard & the Captain excused  
me from drill to day except parade

Jan 26<sup>th</sup> I went on review to day and  
went to meeting and went on dress  
parade Jan 27<sup>th</sup> we had a tip top  
regimental drill to day there was  
two or three regiments of infantry practice  
ing at sapling and fire mgs it was  
a grand sight Jan 28<sup>th</sup> we drilled around  
London Jan 29<sup>th</sup> I wrote a letter to Marcus  
Thatcher to day and drilled as usual Jan  
30<sup>th</sup> It rained to day we did not drill to  
day we had a bible class in the evening  
at our tent the first Sergeant & second Lieutenant  
was present we had a tip top time too  
Jan 31<sup>st</sup> I was on guard to day and was  
stationed at the guard house to take care  
of some prisoners it happened that there  
was a peddler in there trading with the  
prisoners when I was stationed there the

sergent told me that I would be responsible for their safe keeping after awhile the peddler wanted to go off I did not know but he was a prisoner trying to play rots on me & when he came out I told him to not go off he swore he would go where he wds a mind to for all of me says you ha and I up set him and threw him back into the shanty unfortunately for him I his coat almost off of him in the affair he had to stay until the sergent came and let him out. commenced snowing about midnight

Feb 1st Today is saturday it rained and snowed we did not drill I got a letter from John Platner dated the ninth of Jan he did put on it the No of the reg it went through every cavalry reg from N Y before I got it he is well Feb 2<sup>d</sup> today is the sabbath it was a very pleasant one for we went out on review this morning after that we passed the day in giving one an other sentences to write from the Bible in the evening we had a bible class Seint B J Coffin took the lead Feb 3<sup>d</sup> I was on police duty the day and I got a pass and went to the city it commenced snowing this morning
