they had five children viz.

John who lived on Staten Island. ~~Edmond~~ Edmond married a
Miss Shaw and had one son and three daughters, one of whom
married Mr. De Luzé of New York. Robert a physician
died unmarried Gouverneur married Miss Allaire
the family lived yet at 79 Madison Ave. The Capt. died
May 23. 1810 his widow became the 2^d wife of Judge Brockholst Livingston

II Sarah married March 22 1775 Col. John Heyliger of the Island of
St Croix they had a daughter who married John Durant
and by him had two sons and two daughters, the eldest of whom
married a son of Lorenzo Da Ponte

III Hester married Feb. 25 1790 Nicholas Gouverneur, they had three
sons and three daughters. Isaac was killed in a duel with
Wm. H. Maxwell. Samuel L. married his cousin Miss Monroe
Nicholas died in June 1854 unmarried. of the three daughters
the eldest married Johnson Verplancx, another Robert Tillotson,
and the third Mr. Cadwallader of Phil.

IV Elizabeth married 1786 (see Jeffersons Works I 590) James Monroe
they had two daughters one married Judge George Hay
of Va. he died Sept. 1830 the other married her cousin
Samuel L. Gouverneur who was postmaster at N. Y.
Mrs. Monroe died at the family residence Oak Hill, Loudoun
Co. Va. Sept. 23 1830. President Monroe died at the
house of his son in law Mr. Gouverneur at N. Y. July
4. 1831.

V Mary H. married Thomas Knox a prominent merchant of N. Y.
they had two children ^{a son} Nicholas Gouverneur who died Aug 7.
1812 aged 16 and a daughter who married Alexander
the son of Gen. Hamilton who died Aug 3. 1875 in his
90th year. Thomas Knox died Jan. 18. 1835.
