Acampton March 5th 1766

In my last I think you were inform'd of
the departure of Genl. Clinton, since which nothing
material has happen'd but the Resignation of
Col: Henry, Occasion'd principally by his not
being treated with that Politeness which he had a
right to expect from the Com: of Safety.
This made a great noise & occasion'd some disturb-
-ance in his Regiment, but we understand every
thing was set right again before he left Ac: being
by the great pains he took,

I rec^d a letter by this Post from M. Campbell

I have writt him that he may have it & I
expect if he sends up his goods he will also
want board for his Merchant, I must therefore
req^d if he should acquaint you that he

send up to take charge of the Store,

If you should be in want of money or any thing else, W. Campbell will furnish you, & I beg you'll not want any thing that may be had or that you find yourself inclined to get,

When Collo. Peyton went from Wm. burg last he promised to be down in one month from that time, by him I intended to send you some money but his disappointment not only has prevented that, but really distresses me here, I have for some time past been obliged to borrow money, a matter that will at all times give me pain,

The time approaches fast & hope is now not far distant that will give us another meeting, formerly I expected that about the first of this month our Battalion would be received, there is now near a certainty of that, happening in about two or three weeks, I shall endeavour get John Burke & some others to go home sooner. You'll remember me to the family & believe me to be
