

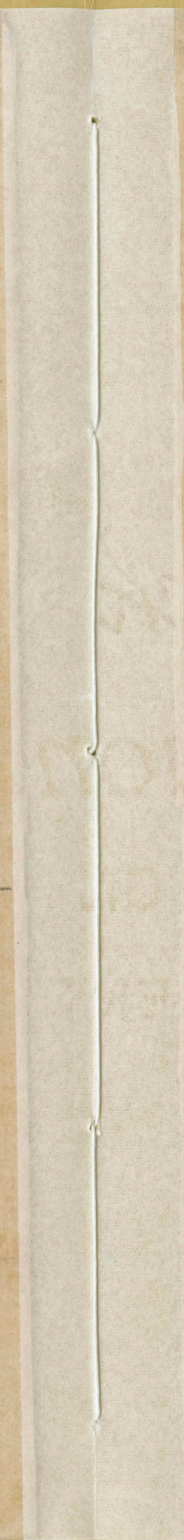
Leubing Oct. 19<sup>th</sup> 1777.

My dear

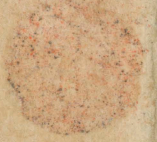
I have got safe to this place & just  
about setting out again. I hope by this time you  
must be a little better compos'd in my mind,  
I am so myself, one thing is sufficient to do it  
let us steadily give up ourselves to the disposal  
of God & patiently submit to his will, & the  
business is done - I am now in a hurry & can  
say but little from Camp I will write you more  
fully. The purpose of this is to inform you that  
I have engag'd two Weavers from among the  
prisoners here, one for Mr. Tho<sup>s</sup>. Chenn the  
other for Mr. Joseph Farrow, they seem very  
~~pleas'd~~ much with the change & I think they  
will be very serviceable to the Neighbourhood  
The letters sent for Mr. Chenn & Mr. Farrow send  
to them this evening, I promised the men they  
should be sent for tomorrow. I am with  
much love to yourself & family yours, sincerely
