Boston Aug 18th 1796

As my very dear friend will be
surprised to hear of my not speaking to a person
whom Richards's charity has introduced here -
I cannot restrain my inclination to assure
you, how perfectly unavoidable the circumstance
is - M^{rs} Dudley convinced me immediately, that
I alone, would see her entirely, unavailing - such
a groveling disposition, can be kept in subjection
by pecuniary considerations, notwithstanding its
extreme violence - This is her own acknowledg-
ment after a train of horrid insinuations against
her Father, and every one connected with him
she said when it appeared that he never
intended giving them any thing - she deter-
mined to do all in her power to render him
miserable - and boasted of having succeeded in

her endeavors to make his Lady treat him
worse than ever. Her views were the same
on my tranquillity, at first sight. The morning
after her arrival I offended her terribly, by
vindictating Mr. Tacker. There was soon an
astful plan to make a breach between my
Sister and myself - finding, that impracticable
she abruptly informed me her Cousin Randolph
said she had ever loved her sister Jane
more than every other she possessed. indeed
there was never one of the rest mentioned
with affection by her. Unavailing, and
ridiculous as this is, without containing the
smallest semblance of truth. you know her
motives could not have been influenced with
virtue - Poor Tack shaves her abuse
because he has not been as liberal as she
wished. There was always some remark
on his selfishness, until I gave my opinion

on the subject in her presence - A few
weeks ago she was in a rage - at an observation
of mine on the score of obligation - I am
certainly, not condemnable for neglecting,
to resolve in mind each word I wish to
utter merely, because there is one in com-
pany, who cannot be pleased - particularly
when that person has frequently declared
to me. The impossibility, of her requiring any
mortal's assistance, while she has hands
that she never had received a favor in
her life, not even a trifling, present except
a Horse, from Uncle Randolph, nor did not
expect one from any being in existence -
It was absolutely necessary, to decline further
intercourse - for to complete the business, I
had speeches address'd to me which could
not fail to shock a modest Roman -
