My most beloved friend's kind attention (for which I cannot sufficiently thank him) relieved me from insupportable anxiety on M<sup>rs</sup> Tucker's account. To hear that she is recovering, affords me infinite satisfaction. Heaven grant a speedy and perfect reestablishment of her health! —

Immediately after the liberty I took in requesting your advice (on a very painful subject) — Judy determined to spend a week or two, with Polly Harrison whither I was obliged to accompany her, as my imagination could not suggest any excuse that would have been admitted — On that visit, the one, concerning which I solicited your opinion, entirely depended — I evaded every invitation from Jane, and her Husband, until Judy appointed a time to accept those which she received. I then promised, if I went as far as M<sup>rs</sup> Harrison's, to go to Dungeness before my return thither — Nothing, but necessity can induce me to do what has even an appearance of inconsistency, therefore, I visited Jane, whose conduct is the most tender and affectionate and M<sup>rs</sup> Randolph follows her example —
