His Mother, much exhausted, is feeble and feverish; but will I hope do well. Permit me to congratulate you on your late Appointment as District Judge; and pardon me for expressing a Wish that our Government would spare from the extravagant Expenditures of a War which many, here, do not conceive to be prudent as much as would provide for all its civil Officers in a manner suitable to the Places they respectively fill.
