Friend that I can possibly write - for my  
Boy is as wild as a Deer - and I have not  
a creature to assist in nursing - on the  
receipt of your welcome favor I said  
"Dear Son - Grand papa sends you a kiss"  
he held up his mouth and answered "Goggle  
Goggle" - Randolph Harrison has - I am  
told, done the child justice in Virginia.  
It is a fact - that - no one has been able  
to discover a single defect in the little  
thing's face, or form - I trust he was sent  
to be a wise and virtuous man - I can  
not wish him better than his father - who  
is goodness itself - he is now asleep with  
the babe in his arms - but often speaks  
of you with esteem and friendship -  
Major Lee was here twice last week. he  
is a very pleasing young man - indeed



Yesterday's mail brought me a letter from  
Dear Saint George. Surrounded as I am by  
blessings (all but good female servants) yet
