I intended writing a few lines to my very dear Mr. Tucker - having omitted replying to one part of his last favor - I know not whether Judy received a letter from you our servant goes every day to the office while Judy was here she received many letters - she used to send Tudor's man for them - they did not come with ours - I only know the number from the postage for hers and Tudor's I have paid \$6 at our village post office - The enclosed was received to day - it contains nearly all Tuckers charges - in a letter written by his own hand he adds that Judy told him (on his asking her) she believed I had murdered Dick - with this belief she allowed Tudor to remain twelve weeks on my Charity - Tudor said in New York that he had seen my love letters - to Billy Ellis - Can you account my dear
