Your advice respecting Mr Harrison was fortunate indeed - I have not a moment to call my own, but hasten to say my last scrawl, calculated to give you the horrors, must be set down to Mr Kent - my dear Husband knew his mind to be very feeble, but did not believe him capable of the part he has acted - indeed, no one else appeared who could on any acct - be named as executor - we knew the relations would leave our boy nothing - All Mr Kent did may be ascribed to folly except his insisting to me that my person was liable for D-O - debts - That seems wanton wickedness as he has been a Lawyer - and is now called a Judge - your advice has saved my child and self - This is a monstrous estate - To be sure nothing can be recovered from D-O - Mr Harrison says all I can do with him would be to put him in prison bounds
