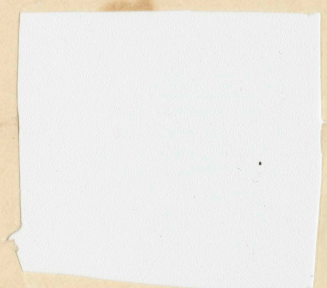
My ever dear Friend
